WINNICA

Bóg, objawiając się ludziom, zawsze okazuje się różnym od naszych ludzkich wyobrażeń. Prawde tę dobitnie głosił, już w VI w. przed Chrystusem, prorok Izajasz: „Mysli moje nie są myślami waszymi, ani wasze drogi moimi drogami, mówi Pan.” Gdzie ludziom wydaje się, że życie nie ma już żadnego sensu, że na wszystko jest już za późno, tam Bóg nieoczekiwanie daje początek czemuś zupełnie nowemu. A to nowe i nieoczekiwane wypływa z Jego glebi, jest przejawem Jego dobroci. Bóg jest „hojny w przebaczeniu”. To On pierwszy zwraca się do człowieka i tylko dlatego człowiek może wrócić do Niego i odkryć sens swojego życia.

Bóg jest sprawiedliwy. To jedna z głównych prawd wiary, a dawniejszy „Krótki Katechizm” ujmował ją tak: Bóg jest Sędzią sprawiedliwym, który za dobre wynagradza, a za złe karze. I to wydaje się zrozumiałe - przynajmniej jako zasada. Boga nie da się jednak ująć w ramy naszych ludzkich pojęć, bo Jego myśli nie są myślami naszymi, ani nasze drogi Jego drogami. I całe szczęście! Gdyby Bóg był tylko sprawiedliwy, według naszych wyobrażeń o sprawiedliwości, to wszyscy bylibyśmy straceni. Ale Bóg jest większy, jest daleko ponad naszymi kategoriami. Jest sprawiedliwy na swój boski sposób: nie jest - tak jak my - małostkowy, nie „rozmięka” się na drobne”.

Wiemy, że ponad boską sprawiedliwość jest Jego miłosierdzie, ale też dostrzegamy, że większa od sprawiedliwości jest Jego miłość i dobroć. Doskonale obrazuje to dzisiejsze opowiadanie ewangeliczne. Dobry właściciel winnicy (sam Bóg Ojciec) daje całego denara również i temu, który pracował tylko jedną godzinę. I wygląda na to (tego oczekuje człowiek), że musi się jeszcze z tego tłumaczyć przed nami, faryzeuszami. Aby nam uczynić zadość, dla jasności sprawy, na końcu wyjaśnia: „Przyjacielu, nie czynię ci krzywdy; czyż nie o denara umówiłeś się ze mną? Weź co twoje i odejdz! Chce też i temu ostatniemu dać tak samo jak tobie... Czy na to złym okiem patrzysz, że ja jestem dobry?”. Bóg nie pozwala nam do swojej dobroci przykladać miary naszej ludzkiej sprawiedliwości, a nasze domaganie się sprawiedliwości demaskuje jako zwykłą zawziętość. Bóg jest dobry - dla wszystkich, a więc i dla mnie.

Dzisiejsza przypowieść to nie tylko ukazanie dobroci Boga. Jej głębsze dno, to przypomnienie człowiekowi, że dopóki żyje na tej ziemi, może przyjść do Boga, „umówić się na spotkanie” z Nim, nawet na godzinę przed zmierzchem życia.

Czy moje życie ma sens? Czy wiem, po co żyje, pracuje, cierpi? Nikt z nas nie może sam nadać swojemu życiu ostatecznego sensu. Może go jednak odkryć - nawet jeszcze około „godziny jedenastej”. A wówczas zdąży zobaczyć, że nie żył na darmo. Wtedy będzie mógł powtórzyć za nawróconym św. Augustynem: „Późno Cię ukochałem, Piękności dawna i zawsze nowa! We mnie byłeś, ja zaś byłem na zewnątrz i na zewnątrz Ciebie poszukiwałem... Przemówiłeś, zawołałeś i pokonałeś moją głuchotę. Zajasniałeś, Twoje światło usunęło moją ślepotę”.
