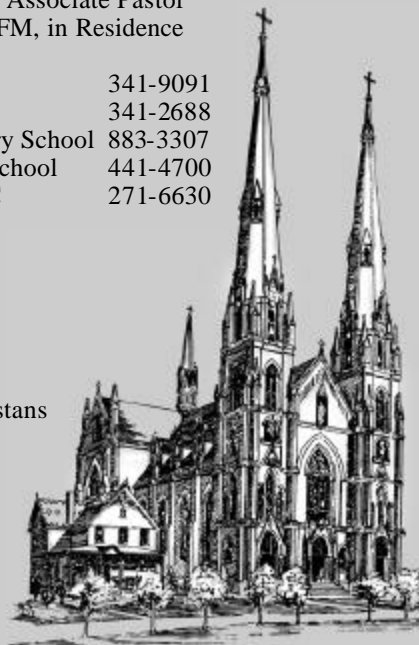

Epiphany Proclamation

*(There is a traditional practice of announcing on the Feast of the Epiphany the dates of movable feasts for the coming year. The proclamation focuses on the coming celebrations where the meaning of **Epiphany**—the manifestation of the Savior—is made explicit.)*

Since we have recently been filled with joyful celebration of the First Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, now, through God's mercy, we must tell you the happiness that will be rooted in the resurrection of that same Lord and Savior:

In this year of the Lord, **Two Thousand Seven, Ash Wednesday**, the beginning of the holy Season of Lent, will be on the **twenty-first day of February**.

Easter, the feast of feasts, the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, will fall on the **eighth day of April**. It will be preceded by the Service of Light and the Blessing of Water at the **Easter Vigil**.

The **Feast of St. Stanislaus, Bishop & Martyr**, the patron of our parish and school, will be celebrated on **Tuesday, the eighth day of May**.

Our young children will be invited to their first experience of the **Sacrament of Penance** the evening of **Thursday, the nineteenth day of April**. They will partake of **Communion** at the Table of the Lord for the first time on **Sunday, the twentieth day of May**.

Bishop Lennon will complete the Initiation Sacraments for several of our teenagers by conferring the **Sacrament of Confirmation** on them on **Friday, the twenty-seventh day of April**.

The Solemnity of the **Ascension of the Lord** will be celebrated on **Sunday, the twentieth day of May**.

The Solemnity of **Pentecost**, the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the birthday of the Church, will be celebrated on **Sunday, the twenty-seventh day of May**.

The Solemnity of the **Body & Blood of Christ**, Corpus Christi, falls on **Sunday, the tenth of June**. It will be celebrated at St. Stanislaus Church with a public testimonial of our belief in the Eucharist by a procession through our neighborhood.

And lastly, the **second day of December**, will be the **First Sunday of the Season of Advent**, the beginning of a new Church year, wherein we look once again for the Coming of our Lord and Savior: *to Him be honor and glory, now and for ever. AMEN.*

Ja ciebie chrzczę ...

Obecna niedziela to święto Chrztu Paskiego. Ta niedziela to liturgiczne zakończenie obchodów okresu Bożego Narodzenia. Ponieważ my, Polacy lubimy Boże Narodzenie, dlatego zachowujemy choinki i dekoracje świąteczne w domach i w kościołach aż do 2 lutego, czyli do święta Ofiarowania Paskiego. Do tego czasu śpiewamy koledy. Śpiewając koledy, myślimy o narodzeniu Pana, o Jego dzieciństwie, a jednak począwszy od tej niedzieli mamy do czynienia z „dorosłym Jezusem”. W tą niedzielę słyszymy Ewangelię o Jezusie, który przychodzi do Jana przyjac chrzest „na odpuszczenie grzechów”. On nie znalazł grzechu, tzn. nie popełnił żadnego. Przyjmując chrzest, raczej przejmuje nasze grzechy na siebie.

Chrztem z rąk Jana Chrzciciela rozpoczyna Jezus działalność publiczną. Konczy 30 lat szczęśliwego życia w nazaretanym domu Józefa i Maryi, i rozpoczyna nauczania publiczne, które obejmuje ostatnie trzy lata Jego życia. Zaczyna głosić Ewangelię o kochającym nas Ojcu, któremu możemy powierzyć nasze troski, zmartwienia, grzechy. Jest to Ewangelia o Bogu, który jest zawsze gotowy do przyjęcia nas, bo Jego miłosierdzie nie ma granic. Ojciec potwierdza swego Syna i poleca słuchać Jego przepowiadania: „Oto Syn mój umiłowany, Jego słuchajcie”.

Nad Jordanem Bóg daje nam na nowo swojego Syna. Raz dał Go w Betlejem; objawił Go wtedy pasterzom, Medrcóm przybyłym z daleka, Annie, Symeonowi. „Objawił”, tzn. dał poznać za specjalną łaskę: Pasterzom ukazał się Aniołowie, Medrcóm prowadziła gwiazda, Annie i Symeonowi dał szczególne pouczenie Ducha Świętego, podobnie jak wcześniej Elzbiecie i jej synowi – Janowi Chrzcicielowi. Teraz, od Chrztu Paskiego zaczyna się „czas zwyczajny”, tzn. to słowa i czyny Jezusa są tym świadectwem. Dla ludzi dobrej woli, otwartych na łaskę Bożą, jest to świadectwo wystarczające, aby przyjąć Jezusa jako Mesjasza i Pana.

O. Krzysztof Madel, jezuita, pisze: „Nad Jordanem Bóg daje nam swojego Syna – swoją największą miłość i wszystko, co najbardziej ukochane. W Chrystusie i my stajemy się Jego synami i córkami. Wraz z Nim daje nam samego siebie za Ojca. Każdy Boży dar jest właśnie taki: jest „wszystkim”, jest wyrazem miłości Boga oraz jest samą Miłością”.

Bóg daje nam wszystko w swoim Synu. Syn Boży stał się człowiekiem, aby nas uczyć synami Bożymi. Przez Syna i w Nim stajemy się dziećmi Bożymi. Ten akt usynowienia dokonuje się właśnie w czasie chrztu św.

Św. ojciec Pio z San Giovanni Rotondo, kapucyn, jest pewnie dobrze znany nam wszystkim. Którego dnia, było to już w jego starości, płakał i oskarżał się wobec braci, że popełnił bardzo wielki grzech. Bracia chcieli go pocieszyć i jednocześnie pomóc, pytali go: „Co to za grzech, ojcze?” - „Nigdy nie dziękowałem za swój chrzest” - odpowiedział stygmatyk. Tak, ojciec Pio miał bardzo delikatne sumienie i odczuwał najmniejszą niewdzięczność wobec Boga jako wielki grzech. Nie był to oczywiście grzech w prawdziwym tego słowa znaczeniu. Ale to zdarzenie uswiadamia nam, że powinniśmy być wdzięczni na nasz chrzest.

Luke 19:1-8 or Psalm 72 or Psalm 127:1-8

Leader: The Son of God made his home among us. With thanks and praise let us call upon him.

ALL: Stay with us Lord!

Leader: Lord, Jesus Christ, the Magi presented their gifts to You in praise and adoration. Grant that those living in this house may use their talents and abilities to your greater glory. We pray in Jesus name, now and forever. AMEN.

Leader: May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever. AMEN

The numerals consecrate the new year, the initials remind us of the legendary names of the Magi—Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar.

ST. STANS HISTORICAL FACT *by Rob Jagelewski.* There used to be wood carved canopies over every statue in the church. There also was a great wood canopy over the pulpit. In those days the pulpit was situated more towards the middle of the church on the second pillar from the front. The canopy was as high as the molding underneath the murals in the west transept. On its top was the Good Shepard statue.
