Sr. Marie Simon Pierre (Part I)

Two weeks ago I addressed the concept of national freedom and the responsibilities which flow from that reality. Last week I focused on the freedom which comes from Christ and the new life which is its consequence and gift. This week I thought I'd address another type of freedom—freedom from a disease, freedom from Parkinson's, the disease from which John Paul II suffered and the same disease which afflicted Sr. Marie Simon Pierre of the Order of the Little Sisters of Catholic Maternities. I'd like to share with you some things about this wonderful woman of God, much of the material which I found in the publication *Totus Tuus*, a monthly magazine dealing with the postulation of the cause for the beatification and canonization of Servant of God John Paul II.

Her miraculous cure having been attributed to the intercession of John Paul II *post mortem (after his death)*, the case of Sister Marie Simon Pierre was picked for the Process of Beatification of the servant of God John Paul II. The process began on March 17th, 2006 and finished on March 30, 2007 in the diocese of Aix-en-Provence in France. After all the material had been gathered regarding this miraculous cure the documents were handed over to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. That official transfer of documents occurred at a solemn ceremony in the Basilica of St. John Lateran on April 2, 2007, the second anniversary of the death of John Paul II. (As an aside, I'd like to point out that the beautiful new shrine holding the icon of St. Stanislaus and Servant of God John Paul II derived its main source of inspiration from the high altar in that same basilica in Rome).

When Sr. Marie Simon Pierre landed in Rome for the ceremony of the closing of the diocesan stage of the Process she was swarmed by photographers and all types of reporters. They all wanted a glimpse of the woman who was the recipient of this freedom from Parkinson's disease! They asked her what she thought the true message of her healing was. She responded "The message of life....I was reborn to a new life!" (continued next week)

PASTORAL MESSAGE

JULY 22, LIPCA 2007



"Busy about Many Things"

In the well known gospel selection about Martha and Mary, Jesus seems to reprimand Martha and does not order her to help her sister when she complains that Mary is not helping her. He points out to her that she is "*busy about many things*," and at the same time he commends Mary, who sat listening at Jesus' feet, as one who chose the better part. Both sisters were showing hospi-

tality toward the guest: one, by preparing food for the guest; the other, by listening to the guest. Weren't and aren't both important in showing hospitality? Martha, however, seems to have implied that her showing of hospitality was the most important part. Jesus clarified that way of thinking.

Undoubtedly, sometimes one person can balance both quite well. However, in this gospel selection, there seems to be more than everyday domestic hospitality involved. Rather, it seems the incident has to do with where Jesus fits into one's life and how to be hospitable to the person of Jesus,

Some people say that they are busy when asked how they are. "I'm busy" or "I'm keeping myself busy." they answer. Generally, they are not busy with praying or going to church or visiting the sick or comforting the lonely. Others, when asked why they don't pray or go to church, give a busy life as an excuse, implying that there are more important things to do than praying or going to Mass. Still others, when asked why they don't spend more time with their families or neglect being with them, say that they are busy working and providing financially for them. They have no time for sitting around and talking and visiting. In these and similar situations "busy" refers to those things that have a priority in one's life, e.g.,, some are "busybodies" who spend prime time gossiping about others and interfering in other people's lives.

The Martha and Mary story — whatever other messages or lessons the story may have — is about the priority of sitting at the feet of Jesus and listening to him, the beloved Son of the Father, the one who is the way to truth and life. Each and every follower of Jesus needs to make that choice as Mary did, even though "the busy ones" are calling one to help them because they are "busy."

Concretely, one needs to set aside time during each busy day for prayer — not just saying some prayers, but listening to Jesus and talking with him. Prayer is a means to keeping a rektionship going between the disciple and Jesus as well as the Church and the world. For growth every relationship needs a coming together to talk and to listen.

One way of listening to Jesus is by reading the Word of God, the Bible, especially the New Testament. In this way Jesus speaks, reminding and inspiring us with his teaching and his will. Most probably that is what Jesus did in the home of Martha and Mary when he visited them and Mary sat at his feet.

We cannot pray as we ought without the guidance of the Holy Spirit, with whom each of us has been gifted at baptism. It's a matter of recognizing and acknowledging His presence and asking for his help: "Come, Holy Spirit, come!"

Would that the Lord say to us daily, "N. ... you have chosen the better part" and not reprimand us saying: "N. ... you are busy about many things. One thing is necessary." fr. Cam

Maria i Marta

Opowiadanie o goscinnosci, jaka doswiadczal Jezus w domu Lazarza, Marii i Marty to wspanialy przyklad przyjazni ludzkiej Bozego Syna. Ewangelia dwa razy daje nam relacje o placzu Jezusa. Raz nad grobem Lazarza. Zydzi widzac Go placzacego, rzekli: "Zobaczcie jak go milowal". Jezus kochal Lazarza i jego dwie siostry. W ich domu odpoczywal po



trudach podrózy i nauczania. Cieszyl sie ich przyjaznia i miloscia, zwlaszcza wtedy kiedy gdzie indziej spotykal sie z odrzuceniem i nienawiscia.

Goscina, jakiej doznaje Syn Bozy w domu swoich przyjaciól, o której relacjonuje dzisiejsza Ewangelia wg sw. Lukasza, znajduje sie "na tle" gosciny, o której czytamy w pierwszym czytaniu. Jest to tajemniczy tekst. Abraham zaprasza w goscine Pana, tzn. samego Boga. Czytamy tam: " Pan ukazal sie Abrahamowi". Abraham wychodzi naprzeciw i zaprasza: "O Panie, jesli darzysz mnie zyczliwoscia, racz nie omijac Twego slugi!"

Ale zarazem czytamy tam: "Abraham spojrzawszy dostrzegl trzech ludzi naprzeciw siebie." W jednym miejs cu zwraca sie on do Goscia w liczbie pojedynczej, a dalej w tym samym zdaniu w liczbie mnogiej. Jak to wytlumaczyc? Wydaje sie, ze jest to jeszcze niewyrazne, ledwie zarysowane to, co zostanie objawione dopiero w Nowym Testamencie przez samego Jezusa: Trójca Swieta. Bóg jest jeden, ale w trzech Osobach Boskich.

Wrócmy jednak do sióstr, o których czytamy w dzisiejszej Ewangelii. Historia z Maria i Marta to kolejny fragment Ewangelii, którego nie rozumiemy i przeciw któremu sie buntujemy. Czy Jezus tym razem nie przesadzil? Czy nie okazal sie niesprawiedliwy? Czy nie skrzywdzil uczynnej i pracowitej Marty? I czy nie dzialal niejako przeciwko sobie, bo przeciez to Marta byla ta, która byla czynnie zatroskana o dobro Goscia? Na pierwszy rzut oka wyglada to tak, jakby Jezus chcial zniechecic Marte do dawania goscinnosci. Ale to tylko pozór. Chodzi o cos innego.

Jezus nie byl egoistycznie zatroskany o wlasne dobro. Nie zamienil kamieni w chleb, aby zaspokoic swój glód. Przychodzil do goscinnych sióstr, aby sie posilic i odpoczac. Nie to jednak bylo Jego pierwszym celem. A wiec co?

Jezus nigdy nie pogardzil niczyja praca, nikomu nie okazal lekcewazenia, nie przeoczyl zadnego gestu milosci i szacunku dla swojej osoby. Nie chcial tez pomniejszac znaczenia goscinnosci. Wrecz przeciwnie: docenil trud Marty i jej poswiecenie, zauwazyl troske i potrafil wyrazic uznanie. I w dowód tego uznania chcial ja wprowadzic wyzej, blizej Boga. A tym, co zbliza do Boga, jest wiara, która rodzi sie ze sluchania Słowa. Własnie to czynila Maria.

Jezus chcial pokazac hierarchie wartosci. W pierwszym rzedzie powinnismy bowiem "starac sie o Królestwo niebieskie, a wszystko inne bedzie nam dodane".

Father Benedict Rosinski succeeded Father Anton Kolaszewski (who built our church) as pastor in 1892. Father W.J. Horak was his assistant. In the 14 years of the Rosinski Pastorate at St. Stanislaus there were 5,894 baptisms, 918 marriages, and 2,072 burials of which 1,660 were children. Father Rosinski was the last diocesan pastor to serve the people of St. Stanislaus. The Franciscans arrived in 1906.
