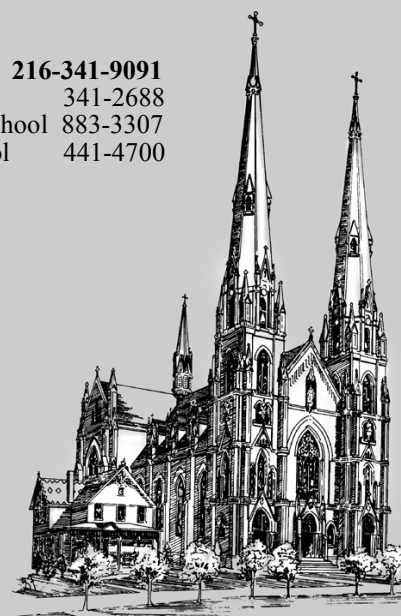

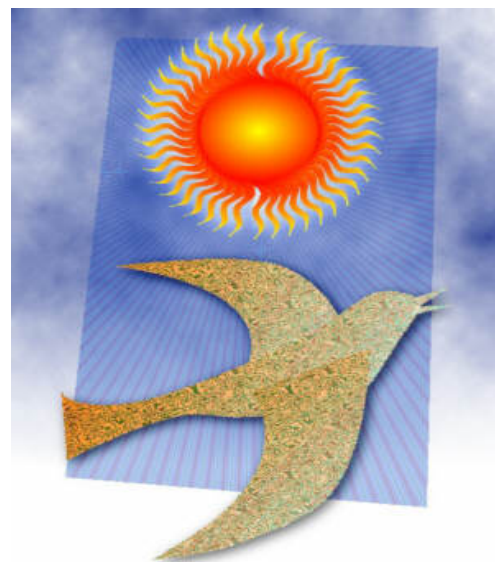

The Trinity now is united and glorified as God's covenant with all human-kind cements His essence of Love eternal in each action of holiness. Our celebration today and each moment of life shouts this belief as we await our final union with our Creator at the end of time. Three in One

The most basic truth of our Christian/Catholic Faith is the existence of Three loving Persons in one God... the most perfect relationship of love ever possible ... the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The Jews, the Chosen People of God in the Old Testament, always believed in one God. They had a most difficult time accepting the message of Jesus—the Son of God—that there were three persons in God. But today we, the followers of Jesus, accept his teaching about the Trinity of Persons. God in the Old Testament was portrayed as a mighty warrior, powerful and conquering. This caused people to have undue fear of God. Perhaps, that carried over into our lives as youngsters learning about God.

A little girl aged three years went on her first cross-country train ride with her parents. At nightfall she and her parents took their respective berth places in the sleeping car. Of course, the lights were out. Shortly afterwards, the little girl asks, “Mommy, are you there?” “Yes, Honey, I’m here.” A few minutes later, she calls out, “Daddy, are you there?” “Yes, sweetheart, I’m here.” This went on a couple times more, when suddenly the voice of a fellow passenger barked aloud, “We are all here ... your mother and father, brother and sister, grandmother and grandfather! Now go to sleep!” After a moment of silence, the girl asked in a subdued voice, “Was that God?”

Many of us formed an image of God based on our relationship with our father and/or mother, or some authority figure in our lives. Jesus has informed us that God is ever-loving, full of mercy. God loves us more than we love our selves. Even as we continue to sin, God loves us nonetheless. Jesus shows us this clearly when He loves us as a Good Shepherd loves his sheep.

We will not find the word or term TRINITY in the Bible, but Jesus spells it out when he speaks of going to his Father, and of sending to us the Spirit of Truth after He himself will ascend back to the Father in Heaven.

Christopher Columbus had a tremendous love and respect for the Trinity. He prayed to the Trinity before every venture he undertook. On his third voyage he made a vow that he would name the first land discovered in honor of the Trinity—hence, today you will find the island known as Trinidad.

All our liturgies, all our sacraments begin with the sign of the Cross—honoring the Three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Faith in God has diminished. As Father James Smith writes: “Society has virtually outlawed God from civic activities and the public square. Politicians may use God as a running mate, but as a silent partner. The typical family prays together even less than it eats together. Belief in God has become a private option. The only public institution that promotes God is the Church.” I hope that this means you and me.

Let us never be afraid or embarrassed to address God as Abba as Jesus did. He called His Father: Daddy, Papa or Dad. God thought of you and me way before the beginning of time. Now we must thank God not only for our life here on earth, but most especially of our life together with God in the Kingdom of Heaven!! Aren’t we fortunate or what??

Boża Rodzina

Pierwsza niedziela po Uroczystości Zesłania Ducha Świętego jest poświęcona nie wspomniani jakiegos wydarzenia zbawczego, lecz tajemnicy. A jest to największa z tajemnic naszej wiary, tak wzniosła, że nikt jej nie potrafi wyczerpująco zrozumieć.

Jak mówi o tym legenda, a może prawdziwe wydarzenie z życia św. Augustyna, kiedy ten Święty rozmyślał nad tajemnicą Trójcy Przenajświętszej spotkał chłopca na brzegu morza, który muszłą w ręku nabierał wodę z oceanu i przelewał ją do dołka wykopanego na plaży.

- „Co robisz?” - pyta Święty.
- „Jak widzisz przelewał wodę z oceanu do morza”.
- „Ależ to niemożliwe, chłopcze”.
- „Prędeż ja przeleję wodę z oceanu do tego dołka, niż ty zrozumiesz tajemnicę Trójcy Świętej”.

Po tych słowach, chłopiec znikł. Augustyn zrozumiał, że to był Jezus, albo anioł, posłany przez Boga, aby przekazać mu to przesłanie.

Tajemnicy Trójcy Świętej nie potrafimy zrozumieć naszym ludzkim umysłem, który w porównaniu do Boga jest jak dołek w piasku na plaży wobec wielkości oceanu. A jeśli rozmyślamy i świętujemy tą Tajemnicę, to nie dlatego, że uważamy, że jesteśmy w stanie ją wyczerpać czy w pełni pojąć, tylko dlatego, że to jest **dla nas** ważne. To źródło naszego życia, to początek naszego istnienia i cel, do którego zmierzamy.

Benedykt XVI niedługo po swoim wstąpieniu na Stolicę Apostolską, powiedział, że Bóg jest wciąż młody i odnawia wszystko. Kościół zwraca się w modlitwie liturgicznej do Ducha Świętego, aby „zstał i odnowił oblicze ziemi”. Duch Święty, którego zesłanie obchodziliśmy w ostatnią niedzielę, prowadzi do pełni prawdy, prawdy o Bogu, o Jego miłości i sprawiedliwości, i w ten sposób odnawia oblicze ziemi.

Podczas pierwszej wizyty zagranicznej do Republiki Dominikańskiej, Meksyku i na wyspy Bahama, w meksykańskim mieście Puebla de Los Angeles w homilii do rodzin, Jan Paweł II powiedział: *Zostało powiedziane w piękny i zarazem głęboki sposób, że Trójca Święta jest w najgłębszym sercu swej tajemnicy, nie samotnością, ale rodziną, bo zawiera w sobie ojcostwo, synostwo, i to, co jest esencją rodziny, czyli miłość.* Ojciec święty nazwał Ducha Świętego Miłością. Piękne imię.

Widzimy więc, że każda rodzina nosi w sobie obraz Trójcy Świętej. O ile, zgodnie z Księgą Rodzaju, każdy człowiek został stworzony na obraz i podobieństwo Boże, to podobieństwo i obraz jest w jakiś sposób bardziej obecne jest w małżeństwie i rodzinie, niż w pojedynczym człowieku.

Bóg stworzył nas na swój obraz i zaplanował, abyśmy rodzili się, wzrastali, a później żyli w rodzinach, które mają odzwierciedlać życie Trójcy Świętej. Każda chrześcijańska rodzina jest najmniejszą komórką Kościoła, wielkiej Rodziny Bożej. Uczestnicząc w życiu rodziny własnej i Kościoła, wielkiej Rodziny Dzieci Bożych, mamy przygotować się do tego, aby kiedyś uczestniczyć w pełni życia Trójcy Świętej, którego tu na ziemi mamy przedsmak i zadatek.

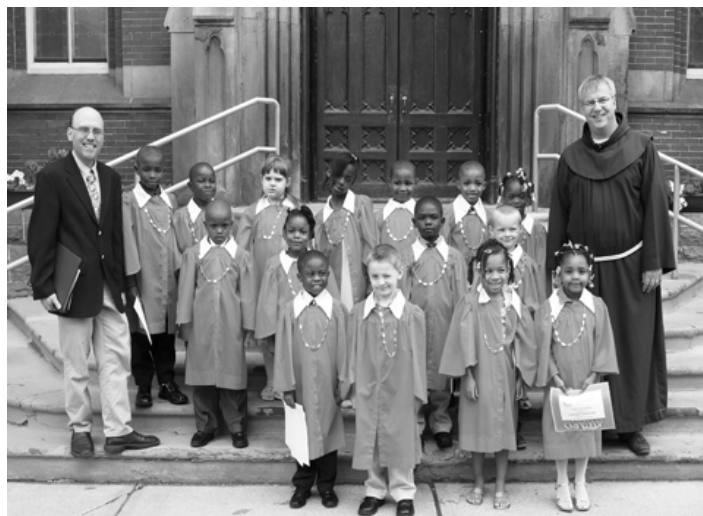
Piknik parafialny
