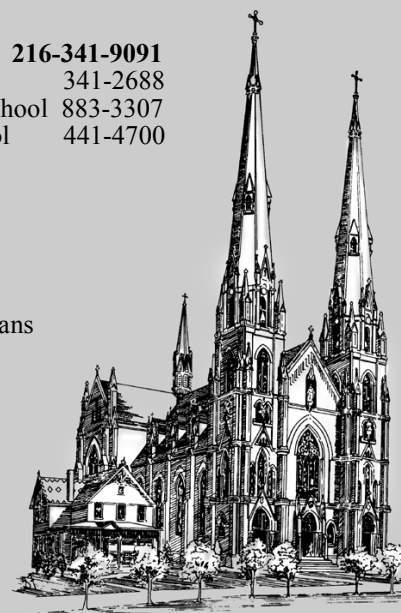

**"I chose YOU!"**

Once baptized in the spirit, now David Kelly must respond now to a voice which has summoned him to do some very serious work. Years of formation by his family, by his Church, by his mentors and by his tutors now remain as spectators as the calling of Christ to serve in his greater vineyard is suddenly realized. The same Spirit which breathed life into his soul at birth in Christ now breathes into him anew. The student, the friar, the man now is transformed into the priest, given his tall work order to follow Christ in a new sacramental way and life, to follow Christ into the suburb and into the city, country club and slums; into the hospital and into the prison; into the board room and into the homeless shelter; into the bank and into the ocean to fish for men, for their hearts and souls.

But the fact that he was chosen does definitely make all those journeys different, but not in quality or quantity alone. All those journeys would qualify him to be called a Christian. But Christ has singled David out to be something other—something other than a Christian—steward of the mysteries of God.

David still has one final exam to endure before he is filled with the Holy Spirit at the hands of the Bishop. The exam will consist of three questions:

- 1) David Kelly, son of Keith and Ardyce, do you love me?

- 3) David Kelly, son of Keith and Ardyce, do you love me?

I believe he will answer them with all the fervor of Peter. He will say: **"Lord, YOU know everything! YOU KNOW THAT I LOVE YOU!"**

David will be filled with the Holy Spirit. His stewardship will be pursued in all earnestness. He will rise from the ground and pick up his cross as he has so many times before...only now it will be different. That cross will be used anew as a tool to lead the sheep entrusted to his care, a gentle too to lead them, to comfort them, to share their suffering. David will do more than carry the cross—as he is prostrate on the ground he will be nailed to it lovingly sharing in the burden of Christ, as with a yoke.

Yes, David was chosen to give his life for Christ's sheep at every sunrise. He was chosen to daily lead His crucifixion at the sunset of the sacrificial feast. AND he was chosen to greet that same sunrise each day with the promise of the same resurrection for all that Christ Himself promised.

This weekend, after his final exams, David Kelly will be a priest...because **Jesus chose him** to be one. Let us all keep him in our prayers that he may be faithful to the treasure entrusted to him with the breath of the Holy Spirit.

### “FATHER DAVID”

By the time you are reading this, I will have been ordained a Franciscan priest in Wisconsin. As I'm writing this reflection for the bulletin, I have just returned from my required five-day-long pre-ordination retreat that I made at St. Andrew's Benedictine Abbey here in Cleveland. I enjoyed this time of personal prayer, reading, and reflection in solitude, along with liturgical prayer with the monks. It

was a big help for me in getting in the right frame-of-mind for ordination.

Now that everything is set, I'm just praying and hoping for good weather for those traveling to and from southeast Wisconsin for Br. Jason Welle's and my priestly ordination. I'm originally from west-central Wisconsin (about 300 miles northwest of where the ordination is taking place) and so I know that it's taking place when it's usually the coldest time of year in Wisconsin. I just hope that there will not be heavy snow or ice for the sake of my family members and others who will be traveling significant distances in order to attend.

I know that I will need to grow into this new role for me as a friar. I still have a lot to learn about priestly ministry and sometimes it can seem a bit overwhelming. However, I have learned from my deacon experience to rely on the help of

the Holy Spirit and the prayers and support of others for whatever it is that I need to do, especially when it seems beyond my natural abilities. I do believe that I will enjoy priestly ministry and find it very

meaningful, especially once I have become more comfortable and confident with the various rites and responsibilities inherent to this new phase of my life.

A well-intentioned person recently mentioned to me that “soon you will no longer be a brother, but will be a father!” However, that is not entirely the case. As a Franciscan friar, I will always be first and foremost a brother/friar. All of us Franciscans are brothers/friars, and some of us brothers/friars are ordained. Even our religious order's Minister General, Friar Jose Carballo (the successor of Saint Francis of Assisi, who himself was never ordained a priest), prefers to use the title “Brother” before his name in signing letters, even though he is also a priest. So, feel free to call me either “Brother David” or “Father David”, whichever you prefer.

I wish to thank all of you for your prayers and support throughout my deacon experience at St. Stanislaus. It means so much to me and I look forward to returning to St. Stanislaus this week where I will be until I move to Wisconsin in mid-February. I'll be presiding at a Mass of Thanksgiving with the parish on Sunday, January 31, at 11:30 a.m. and you are certainly invited! May God richly bless you all!

### Prawo Pańskie rozjaśnia oczy

Dzisiejsze czytania zawierają wiele treści, które są jakby ukryte, bo nie jest łatwo je zauważyć, szczególnie jeśli nie zna się tła czy szerszego kontekstu, w którym zostały one wypowiedziane czy napisane. Chyba najbardziej jest to widoczne kiedy słuchamy pierwszego czytania wziętego z Księgi Nehemiasza.



W roku 587 przed Chrystusem Babilonia zdobywa Jeruzolimę; świątynia Jeruzolimiska zostaje zniszczona, a mieszkańcy Judy uprowadzeni do Babilonii. Jest to początek niewoli babilońskiej. Kilkadziesiąt lat później Cyrus tworzy potężną monarchię perską, zdobywa Babilonię i w roku 538 przed Chrystusem pozwala Izraelitom wrócić do ich ojczyzny. Po powrocie do Jeruzolimy, dawni wygnańcy zaczynają odbudowę świątyni. W roku 458 nowa fala Żydów wraca z wygnania do Palestyny i odbudowuje mury Jeruzolimy.

W tym miejscu pojawia się Nehemiasz - żydowski namiestnik, pod przewodnictwem którego dokończono odbudowę murów. O nim słyszymy w dzisiejszym pierwszym czytaniu mszalnym. Kapłan-pisarz Ezdrasz czytał Księgę Prawa Pańskiego i wraz z lewitami objaśniał ją ludowi. Cały lud odpowiadał „Amen”. Na końcu kapłani pobłogosławili lud i odesłali do domów, ale obchodzili święto ku czci Pana: *Ten dzień jest poświęcony Panu, Bogu waszemu. Nie bądźcie smutni i nie płaczcie! Cały lud bowiem płakał, gdy usłyszał te słowa Prawa. I rzekł im Nehemiasz: Idźcie, spożywajcie potrawy świąteczne i pijcie napoje słodkie - pošlijcie też porcje temu, który nic gotowego nie ma: albowiem poświęcony jest ten dzień Panu naszemu. A nie bądźcie przygnębieni, gdyż radość w Panu jest waszą ostoją.*

Warto dodać, że przez czas niewoli nikt nie czytał Pisma św. i nikt nie wypełniał jej nakazów. To, o czym mówi pierwsze czytanie, było zatem odnowieniem Przymierza Izraela z Panem Bogiem, a to jest powodem radości. Podobny w wymowie jest Psalm responsoryjny po pierwszym czytaniu, gdzie czytamy: *Prawo Pańskie jest doskonałe i pokrzepia duszę, świadectwo Pana niezawodne, uczy prostaczka mądrości. Jego słuszne nakazy radują serce, Jaśnieje przykazanie Pana i ośniewa oczy.*

Odnowienie Przymierza jest powodem radości. To odnowienie, o którym czytamy w pierwszym czytaniu, jest zaledwie zapowiedzią tego, co zostało dokonane w Jezusie Chrystusie. On nie tylko odnowił Przymierze, ale zawarł Nowe i Wieczne Przymierze w swojej Krwi. Stało się to w Wieczerniku i na Kalwarii, czyli pod koniec Jego życia. Ale już zaczynając działalność publiczną Jezus głosił Radosną Nowinę i, jak daje o tym świadectwo św. Łukasz Ewangelista, był wysławiany przez wszystkich. Jest to jakby echo słów usłyszanych w pierwszym czytaniu i Psalmie responsoryjnym, gdzie mowa o radości, jaką przynosi słuchanie i zachowywanie Prawa Pańskiego.

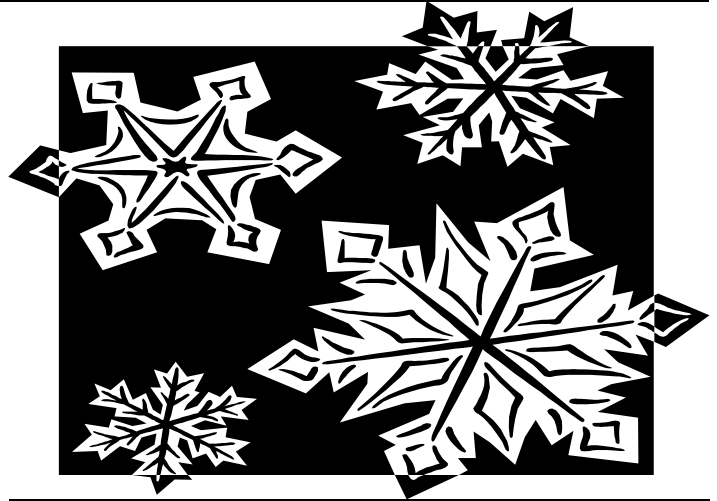

**ST. STAN STANS HISTORICAL FACT by Rob Jagelewski.**

Important dates in the history of the Cleveland Catholic Diocese, 1945- 1966. Bishop Edward F. Hoban is named Bishop of Cleveland in 1945. In the years 1942-66 the population of the Diocese increases from 546,000 to 870,000. Sixty-one new Parishes are established, forty- seven new elementary schools and twelve new high schools are built. Bishop Hoban is named an Archbishop in 1951. Borromeo Seminary opens in 1953. The Second Vatican Council takes place in Rome from 1962- 65. In 1964 the use of English for the liturgy is officially introduced into the Diocese. The Diocese begins its Mission in El Salvador in 1964. Bishop Clarence G. Issenman is named the seventh Bishop of Cleveland in 1966.

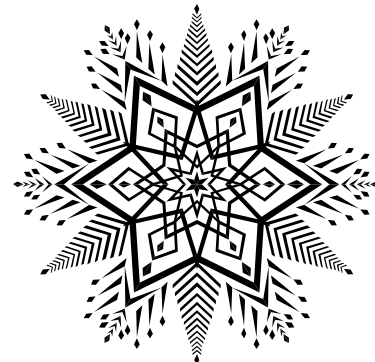
