SILVER THREADS AMONG THE GOLD

A few months ago, Don Pieniak brought me a copy of an older photo of myself, taken for the school yearbook the first year I became pastor seven years ago. The first impression was, "What happened to that light brown hair? It's all silver now!" I can only hope that, with all that silver hair, wisdom that came along as well.

there was also a bit of wisdom that came along as well. Certainly I am a much different man now than I was then.

Wisdom can only be accumulated with time, and with living deeply all along the way. Both of those ingredients have to be there. One can live a long time, but never become wise, if that time is not well-lived. Likewise, one can live deeply and truly, but without some length of time, wisdom is still elusive. And when it does come, wisdom never arrives as one big rush. Instead, it is layered slowly over the events of our lives, binding together our hopes and disappointments, our joys and sorrows, creating a mosaic to be presented to our loving God at the end of our journeys.

Next weekend, we will celebrate a wonderful and rare milestone — the Golden Jubilee of Priesthood for Fr. Leonard Stunek, O.F.M., our own "Fr. Len." Fifty years ago on February 2, he was ordained and set aside for the sanctification of God's people, that they might be taught and led to greater holiness as members of the Body of Christ. And what a journey those years have been!

Fr. Len was raised in Sts. Peter and Paul Parish in Garfield Heights (Fr. Howard, his older brother, was born in a house on 67th and Fleet, and baptized at St. Stanislaus) and brought up in a loving, faith-filled, and hard-working household. Recently he took me on a little detour off Turney Road, where he showed me the house he lived in — and a bit of the newspaper route he served! His First Mass was celebrated here at St. Stanislaus, even though an early February snowstorm kept many guests away.

Fr. Len served the People of God faithfully, showing his gentle spirit, his strong and honest work ethic, and his authentic Franciscan heart. Some of his most significant assignments were on the faculty of Archbishop Ryan High School in Philadelphia, one of the largest Catholic high schools in the country; as Principal at Ryan during some important times of transition; as Guardian (superior) of the Friar community teaching at the high school; and as Pastor of St. Thomas Aquinas Parish in Saginaw, Michigan, the second-largest parish in the diocese.

Now he is happily serving the People of God at Saint Stanislaus, able finally to spend time near his extended family that lives in nearby suburbs. What a delight to see him and his family together — young and older, they all adore him with obvious affection! And as Guardian of our local Franciscan Friary, he cares deeply for the well-being of all the friars in his care. I am humbled and honored to be a silver-haired guy allowed to live and work with this man of gold.

Please join in the celebrations next week when we can all say, Happy Anniversary, Fr. Len!

Chrystus objawia Ojca, który jest Miłujący i Sprawiedliwy. Przyjdzie powtórnie, kiedy dni się wypełnią. A gdy zastanie swoje dzieci czuwające, zabierze je do Ojca swego, a ci, którzy czuwać nie będą, a pogrążeni będą w grzechu i zajęci ziemskimi sprawami, lepiej dla nich, gdyby się nie narodzili. As you face the altar on the left hand side the first apostle in a red vestment is St. James the Less. He is holding a fuller's club which was an instrument of his martyrdom. Going around to the right, the next apostles are St. Matthew holding a money bag, St. John the Evangelist, St. Phillip, St. Peter holding a key, St. Matthias holding a lance, St. Andrew with the x-shaped cross, St. James the Great holding a pilgrim's staff, St. Bartholomew holding a knife, St. Thomas holding a carpenter's square and a lance, St. Simon the Zealot holding a saw, and St. Jude. Right behind the main altar is a window showing twelve articles of faith relating to the individual Apostles.
