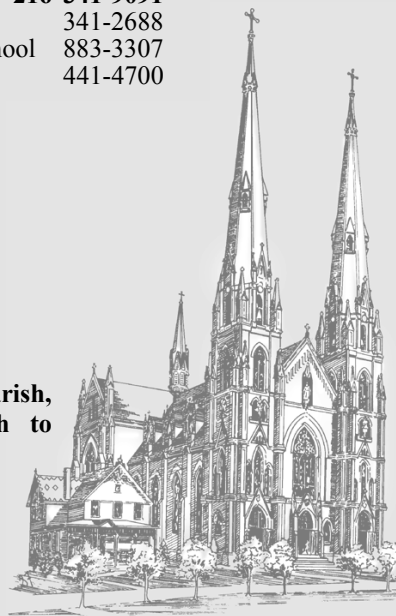

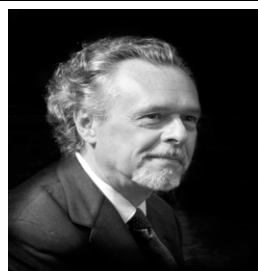

**Their Special Presence**

As you may have noticed after having read our recent bulletins or other local publications the Cleveland Museum of Art is currently showing an exhibit entitled *Treasures of Heaven; Saints, Relics and Devotion in Medieval Europe*. As part of that exhibit the museum has arranged various activities around the city bringing to light some of the treasures which have been right here in our midst all along, but often are either taken for granted or simply unappreciated. One of their ‘programs’ will involve a visit right here to our Shrine to highlight the different relics we already have in our possession ranging from as early as that of the Cross of Christ (primary) to the most recent (secondary) relic, that of a mitre of Venerable John Paul the Great.

You might be surprised as to the actual number of relics of Saints dispersed throughout our Shrine Church. The most obvious is probably that of St. Stanislaus, our patron, whose relic is the centerpiece of the shrine area. When then Cardinal Wojtyla gifted us with that relic Stanislaus simply joined the other saints already in place on the reredos of the altar in the sanctuary (including our own relic of the same St. Stanislaus authenticated in 1952.) Also in the shrine area you can see the combined relics of Ss. Francis, Anthony and Clare positioned centrally within the Franciscan altar. The mitre of John Paul fits right in place now positioned in prayer before our Lady of Czestochowa and St. Stanislaus, interceding on behalf of all those who believe and request his help.

The relic of the Cross of Christ stands next to the *Pieta* near the entrance to the church. It is that relic which is venerated most notably on Good Friday when it is brought down the aisle to the sanctuary as part of our Triduum liturgy.

The six niches in the reredos of the high altar contain numerous relics including those of Ss. Bonaventure, Clare, the Holy Cross, Francis, Gemma, John Baptist Vianney, Pius X and Stanislaus.

Finally, in the little niche beneath the *ecce homo* statue on the altar of the Passion is the reliquary recently brought up from the lower church containing relics of Ss. George, Gerard, James, Ignatius of Loyola, Julian, Ivan, Joseph Leonissa, Lawrence, Louis, Nicafe, Sebastian, Theodosius and Theresa of the Infant Jesus.

The statues of the many saints which are spaced throughout our church are impressive, but the relics are much more special. To those visiting the Museum exhibit the relics and reliquaries will be objects of curiosity whereas to us they are true objects of veneration. They are a much more powerful presence of the saints and a much stronger tie to each of them. During the month of November we especially recall all the saints as we likewise remember those who may have yet to become officially recognized amongst their ranks. Likewise we remember all the faithful departed who have died in Christ and who might not yet fully enjoy His total glory. They all listen for our communications, whether asking for help or asking God to have mercy on them. The communion of saints and sinners lives on in glory and hope, in reliquaries and statues, stained glass windows and photographs and memories. They with us share a great heritage planted on Calvary on the tree (remember the relic by the *Pieta*) nourished by Christ’s blood. During this month as always remember ALL of those who have fallen asleep...many of them need us to do precisely that and others are waiting to help us out as well.

### Precious? Really, how precious?

Last month the Church reminded us and encouraged us to respect the gift of human life in all its stages of existence. Did we learn anything so as to change our pattern of living.?

A few days ago I was shopping at the mall. As I was walking toward the store,

I passed by a car parked on the lot. Seated behind the steering wheel was a younger man, and secured in the back seat were two small children. The engine was running and the man was smoking a cigarette. The driver's window was open about an inch from the top. I feel sorry for all people—adults and children— that exposed to secondhand smoke.

In general, parents are solicitous about their children's physical, mental and spiritual well being. The American Lung Association is encouraging everyone to kick the habit and to avoid the negative results of lung cancer and heart disease. Exposure to secondhand smoke can be significant. In reality, most of the smoke from a burning cigarette doesn't get sucked down into the smoker's lungs—it escapes into the air, where it can be inhaled by anyone unfortunate enough to be nearby.

According to reliable scientific research tobacco smoke contains more than 4000 different chemical compounds, more than 50 of which are known to cause cancer. Some of the chemical that float into your lungs when you are exposed to secondhand smoke are: hydrogen cyanide—a highly poisonous gas used in pest control; benzene—a component of gasoline; formaldehyde—a chemical to embalm corpses; and carbon monoxide—a poisonous gas found in car exhaust.

Healthy lungs are vital to sustaining life and securing good health. Smokers—parents and all others—must be aware of who is in the presence while they are smoking. The lungs of children need to be protected at all costs. Oftentimes my high school students were encouraged not to smoke, and especially, the girls who would one day become mothers. The offspring are the recipients of whatever the mother ingests.

The moral issues are important. The health of others is at risk—life and health are precious. The cost of smoking can become significant—in some cases, resulting in denial of basic necessities.

Here are a few statistics that relate to secondhand smoke:

- 126 million nonsmoking Americans are exposed to secondhand smoke at home and work.
- nearly 50,000 adult nonsmokers in the U.S. die from exposure to secondhand smoke.
- The risk of lung cancer and heart disease increase by 20-30 percent.
- An estimated 46,000 nonsmokers who live with smokers die each year from heart disease.
- Between 150,000 and 300,000 children under the age of 18 months get respiratory infections—such as pneumonia and bronchitis from secondhand smoke.
- More than 40% of children who visit the emergency room for severe asthma attacks live with smokers.

I am simply stating the facts—the rest is up to you. Which brings to mind the words of Christ: “Whoever welcomes one these, my children, welcomes Me.”

### Ograniczyć holokaust nienarodzonych? Yes, we can!

Amerykanie pokazali w tych wyborach, że nie podoba im się polityka Baracka Obamy. Wielka „zmiana”, która miała nadejść po „mrocznych” czasach prawnicowego prezydenta GeGorge'a W. Busha, przybrała twarz lewackiej rewolucji, która spychała ukochaną przez Amerykanów wolność w otchłań socjalizmu. Powstanie ruchu Tea Party, który ma być odpowiedzią na odchodzenie Republikanów od swojego jądra czy ogromne marsze i manifestacje organizowane przez obrońców życia, Glenna Becka i siostrzenicę Martina Luthera Kinga, pokazały, że Amerykanie pragną powrotu do swoich korzeni. Teraz przewodniczącym Izby Reprezentantów może zostać katolicki polityk John Boehner, który przez całą swoją karierę stał na czele frontu obrońców życia i przeciwników cywilizacji śmierci. Zamieniłby na tym stanowisku lewicową gwardię Nancy Pelosi, która mimo tego, że jest formalnie katoliczką, odmawia prawa do życia dzieciom nienarodzonym.

Po wygranej Republikanów we wtorkowych wyborach działacze pro-life będą mieli teraz większą szansę na powstrzymanie aborcyjnych pomysłów Baracka Obamy. W Wisconsin wieloletni senator i walczący aborcjonista, Russ Feingold, został pokonany przez zwolennika pro-life Rona Johnsona. W Pensylwanii kandydat do Senatu Pat Tomey pokonał zwolennika aborcji Joe Sestaka. W Arkansas przeciwnik zabijania dzieci John Boozman pokonał zwolenniczkę zabijania dzieci przed ich narodzeniem senator Blanche Lincoln. W Indianie kandydat walczący z cywilizacją śmierci, senator Dan Coats, pokonał Brada Ellswortha, który popierał finansowanie holokaustu nienarodzonych z pieniędzy podatników. Przeciwnicy aborcji wygrali również w Północnej Dakocie, na Florydzie, Missouri, Ohio czy Luizjanie. Porażkę zanotowała niestety wschodząca gwiazda przeciwników aborcji Christine O'Donnell. Nie udało się więc wielkiemu i zamożnemu lobby z „Planned Parenthood” przekonać większości Amerykanów, że zabijanie dzieci powinno być prawem kobiety. Nie pomogły im w tym telefoniczne agitacje, akcje na Facebooku czy sponsorowanie kampanii wyborczej polityków „pro-choice”.

Pelosi niedawno skompromitowała się nie umiejac odpowiedzieć, kiedy prawo do życia otrzymał Jezus Chrystus. Na jednej z konferencji prasowych Pelosi cytowała Prolog do Ewangelii wg św. Jana: – *Słowo stało się Ciałem i zamieszkało między nami.* Reporterka Jane McGrath spytała ją: – *W takim razie, kiedy Słowo stało się ciałem? Czy stało się to przy Zwiastowaniu, gdy Jezus został poczęty mocą Ducha Świętego, jak powtarzamy w wyznaniu wiary, czy przy Bożym Narodzeniu, kiedy powiła go Dziewica Maryja? I kiedy Słowo otrzymało prawo do życia?* Pelosi nie potrafiła odpowiedzieć na to pytanie.

Po lewicowej krucjacie Nancy Pelosi, nowym przewodniczącym Izby Reprezentantów może zostać znany obrońca życia dzieci nienarodzonych John Boehner. Polityk odbierając nagrodę od organizacji „National Right to Life Committee” powiedział, że obrona życia jest jego głównym celem politycznym a Ameryka została zbudowana na idei wolności, która zanika, jeżeli nie szanuje się życia. – *Mamy moralny obowiązek bronić bezbronnego życia. A nie ma nic bardziej bezbronnego jak dziecko nienarodzone.*

### TREASURES OF HEAVEN: SAINTS, RELICS AND DEVOTION IN MEDIEVAL EUROPE

OCTOBER 17, 2010—January 17, 2011

The Cleveland Museum of Art will be presenting a new exhibition, 'Treasures of Heaven,' offering visitors a glimpse of the Middle Ages, a time when art mediated between heaven and earth and wondrous objects filled churches and monastic treasuries. The exhibition explores how medieval artists expressed the sacred power of the fragmented remains and considers the role that relics played in the development of the visual arts. It will provide audiences with an unparalleled opportunity to see nearly 100 extraordinary works of late antique, Byzantine, and Western medieval art, including precious metalwork objects, paintings, sculptures and illuminated manuscripts, drawn from public and private collections as well as church treasuries across the United States and Europe, several of which have never been seen outside their home countries.


**PICTURES OF LOVED ONES

**EUCCHARISTIC DAY NOVEMBER 21**

An important part of celebrating the month of November is our annual Eucharistic Devotion Day on the Solemnity of Christ the King. This year it will be Sunday, November 21. Almost every parish celebrates this at some point in the year, but faithful and clergy come from all around to Saint Stanislaus to participate in our service, which is especially festive and prayerful. **ST. STANS HISTORICAL FACT by Rob Jagelewski.** The whole state of Ohio was under the jurisdiction of the Diocese of Cincinnati prior to 1847. The second Bishop of the Diocese of Cincinnati was Bishop John Purcell. He made many visitations to northeast Ohio on horseback. He visited older mission churches as well as those parishes that were springing up in the new towns and in the clearings made in the forests. Bishop Purcell administered Confirmation and encouraged the building of churches and schools. He accepted many invitations given by Protestants to speak in their churches. The Cleveland area was entering a period of great growth with the influx of European immigration.
