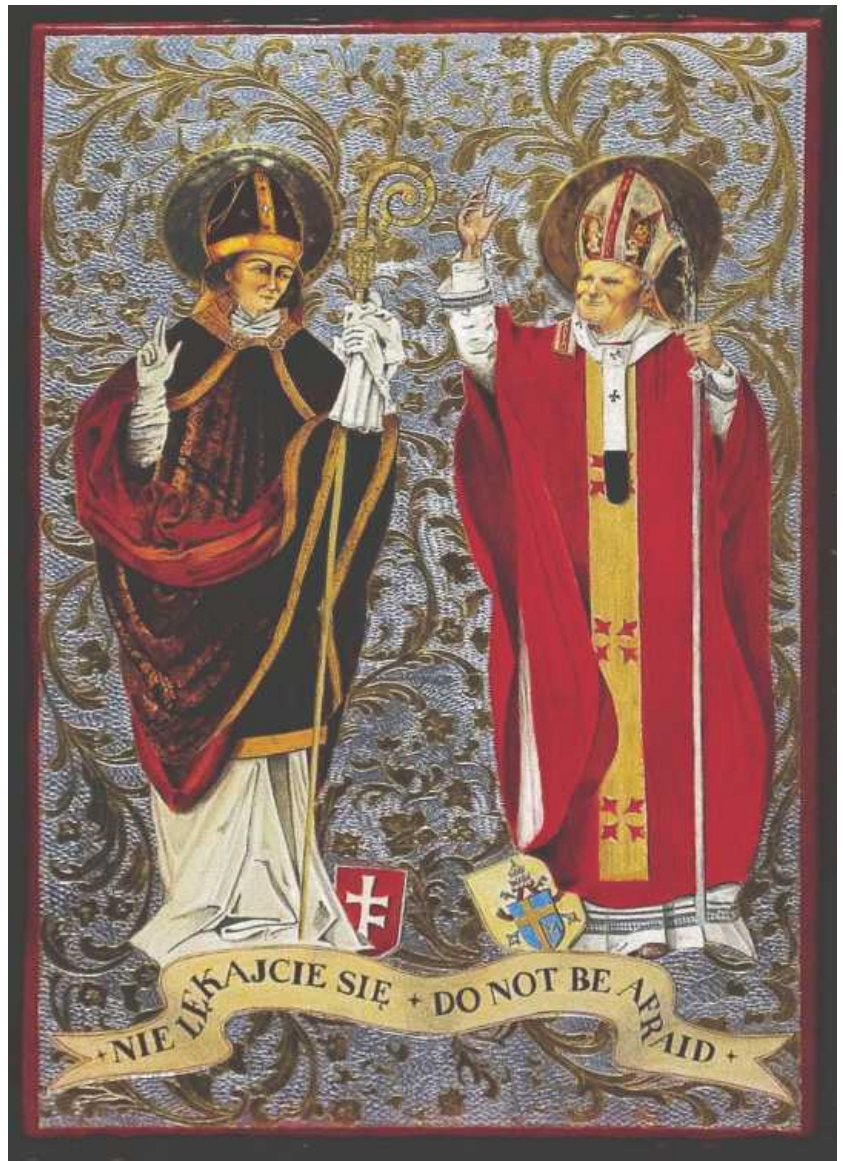

Our Family Picnic

It's hard to believe that Summer (unofficially) has finally arrived and we are now gathering as a parish family to have our annual picnic! After weeks of rain and storms and wind and floods the green lawns have finally had a little chance to dry out for us gather and socialize, eat and relax together as a family.

As with all families, our own parish family is full of many different characters who together create a wonderfully colorful, living mosaic which presents an accurate picture of our family in 2011. The portrait is a kaleidoscope of personalities ranging from the shy to the boisterous, the happy to the angry, the energetic young to the exhausted old, the quiet to the gregarious. For the most part everyone gets along. Likewise, there are some who do not get along with everyone.

Remember the famous quote of Rodney 'what's-his-name' during that famous trial of 'what's-his-name' back in the 90's (?): "Can't we all just get along???" Well, we all know this is easier said than done. Our family is a mosaic of bright colors. As with strong colors, so, too, the personalities are strong, whether the parishioners look like the quiet types or are far from it. (At this point, how many people have you already placed in one category or the other???)

The quiet family members frequently contribute to our family in unique ways. Some pray for everyone. Some bake and share their creations. Some visit the homebound. Some perform a ministry, be it singing, distributing the Eucharist, lecturing, serving, ushering. Some share their gardening skills while others share their cleaning skills. Some sew, some build. Some decorate, some sweep up the mess. Some only have kind words for everyone, others prefer to keep their thoughts to themselves.

Some are slightly overbearing, some like to bare a little too much to others' comfort level. Some like to leave NO doubt as to where they stand, others like to keep you guessing, preferring a different route. Some speak with the clarity of professors while other prefer the ambiguity of politicians. Some are thick skinned, others are thick headed.

In the end, all these colorful people make up our family mosaic....and that is wonderful! We worship together, receive Christ together. We cry together and mourn together. And, what keeps us vibrant, we dream together. We always think of what we can do next. We try to be Catholic and catholic. Each member is as important as the other. If we ever single out one or another, they are always seen and appreciated in the context of the whole group.

Our little family of the Shrine Church of St. Stanislaus is part of the more important, larger family of Jesus Christ. That beautiful mosaic is held together by a cement of tradition spanning many, many centuries, hardened by generations of faith in the same Jesus who died, rose, ascended and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit. Our little family breathes in the Spirit and creates. Our little family moves ahead boldly toward the future. Our little family lives because of the living bread by which it is nourished. Our little family sees with the eyes of Jesus, walks with His feet, hears with His ears, touches with His hands. Our little family can only exist as long as we love others through our own actions. Our little family has a heart which was pierced many times, but a heart which still nourishes and directs us. Today, as we picnic together, let the sun shine on our wondrous mosaic, the mystical body of Christ.

BETWEEN WHAT WAS, AND WHAT WILL BE

Recently there was a lot of talk about the world ending on May 21. Obviously, this did not happen! False prophets have been predicting the end of the world for two thousand years, so we shouldn't be so surprised when that fear arises from time to time. Many fundamentalist preachers focus the attention of their congregations on the "end times." The upcoming week — between the Ascension of the Lord and Pentecost — gives us a unique window for reflection on living in the "between times."

The liturgical tradition of the Church holds that there was some period of time for the apostles of Jesus between when he left them in the flesh and when the fullness of the Holy Spirit would come. They were left without the physical presence of Jesus as they had known him, but they had not yet become empowered to carry on the mission of Jesus in their own way. Huddled and frightened in that Upper Room, they were in the "between times."

Your Franciscan Friars at Saint Stanislaus just returned from Provincial Chapter, which we conduct every three years with friars from the whole province. It was perhaps the most moving and challenging Chapter anyone can remember! We entered the week without a clear sense of direction. Many of our previous hopes had been dashed, and there was little preparation time for making the huge decisions that awaited us. The Chapter Hall was a bit like that Upper Room. We were finally able to say aloud, "The Province as we had known it is dead." But the future is not yet determined! We friars were faced with a choice — continue to die, or choose new life.

The season between the Ascension and Pentecost is still called the "Easter Season." As Christians, we are not alone at all. Fr. Leslie Hoppe, OFM, our outgoing Provincial Minister, reminded us of the Gospel story when Jesus had only two fish and five loaves of bread to feed the thousands. And he did it. We friars may also have little in the basket, but we also have Jesus. So, we too can feed the multitude.

We left the Chapter renewed and excited about our future possibilities. What was required of us was an honest appreciation of our current reality; a willingness to put everything at risk for the sake of the Kingdom; and a radical openness to wherever God might lead us. The path is unclear, but the guide is sure.

In many ways, the situation of our parish life is similar. Saint Stanislaus is no longer the parish it had been 20 or 30 years ago. Slavic Village is also not the same, and it will never again be what it was. But that does not mean that either of them is dead — unless we choose death. We may not have much when it comes to material wealth (just a few loaves and fishes), but we have Jesus. That will suffice.

But the question still in front of every parishioner is this: Are you willing to be open to whatever God is calling our parish to become? Are you willing to risk leaving your "comfort zone" for the sake of something new? Are you willing to place your time, talent, and treasure to the service of that new vision?

**Pomiędzy tym, co było, a tym, co będzie**

Ostatnio wiele mówiło się na temat końca świata, który miał przyjść 21 maja. Jak widać, „proroctwo” nie wypełniło się! Falszywi prorocy przepowiadali koniec świata już wiele razy w dwutysięcznej historii chrześcijaństwa i nie powinno nas dziwić, że i w naszych czasach pojawiają się takie przepowiednie. Wielu fundamentalistycznych kaznodziejów koncentruje uwagę swoich wspólnot na „końcu czasów”. Dzisiejsze święto - Wniebowstąpienie Pańskie - jest swego rodzaju okazją do refleksji na temat życia „pomiędzy czasami” - pomiędzy tym, co było, a tym, co otwiera się przed nami.

Według tradycji liturgicznej Kościoła pomiędzy odejściem Chrystusa w ciele, a zesłaniem Ducha Świętego upłynęło trochę czasu. Apostołowie pozostali bez fizycznej obecności Chrystusa, ale nie od razu zostali napełnieni mocą do wypełnienia Jego misji. Zamknięci i przestraszeni w Wieczerniku byli niejako „pomiędzy czasami”.

Wasi franciszkanie dopiero co wrócili po zakończonej Kapitułe Prowincjalnej. Kapituła Prowincjalna to spotkanie braterskie braci całej prowincji, które ma miejsce co trzy lata. Jest to zarazem najważniejszy organ władzy na poziomie prowincji. Obecna kapituła była najbardziej emocjonująca i zarazem stanowiąca największe wezwanie z wszystkich, w których brałem udział. Rozpoczęliśmy ją bez wyraźnego preczucia kierunku, który powinniśmy wybrać. Rozwiały się niektóre z wcześniej żywionych nadziei. Pozostało niewiele czasu do podjęcia ważnych decyzji. Budynek, w którym zgromadzili się bracia na kapitułę, był czymś w rodzaju Wieczernika. Byliśmy w końcu zdolni powiedzieć: „Prowincja, jaką znaliśmy dotychczas, już nie istnieje”. A przyszłość pozostaje wciąż nieokreślona! Mamy do wyboru: wybrać śmierć lub nowe życie.

Czas pomiędzy Wniebowstąpieniem, a Zesłaniem Ducha Świętego jest wciąż częścią Okresu Wielkanocnego. Jako chrześcijanie nigdy nie jesteśmy sami. O. Leslie Hoppe OFM, nasz „stary” prowincjał, przypomniał nam Ewangelię, gdzie Pan Jezus nakarmił tłumy mając tylko pięć chlebów i dwie ryby. My, franciszkanie, mamy także niewiele w naszych koszach, ale za to mamy Jezusa. I dlatego możemy karmić rzesze.

Po kapitułe wyjechaliśmy odnowieni i patrzący z ufnością w przyszłość. Kapituła wymagała od nas trzeźwej akceptacji naszej obecnej sytuacji, zaryzykowania wszystkiego dla Królestwa oraz radykalnego otwarcia się na Boże prowadzenie. Droga nie jest jasna, ale Przewodnik zasługuje na zaufanie.

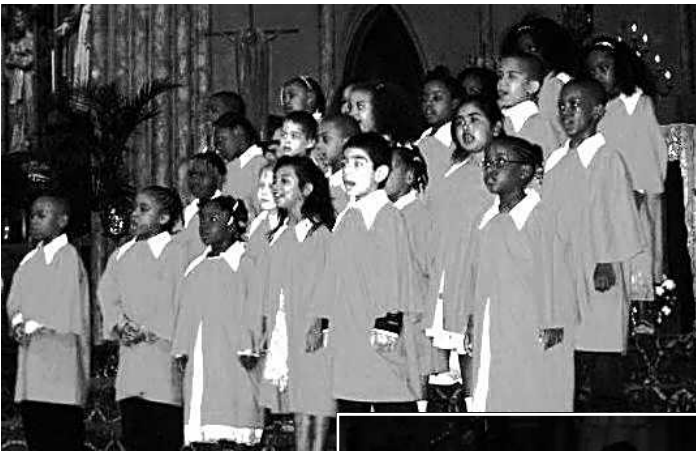
Sytuacja naszej parafii jest podobna. Parafia św. Stanisława nie jest tą parafią, jaką była 20 czy 30 lat temu. Slavic Village tak samo nie jest tym, czym był w przeszłości i nigdy nie będzie. Ale to nie znaczy, że parafia czy dzielnica są martwe - chyba że wybierzemy śmierć. Być może nie mamy więcej niż kilka chlebów i parę rybek. Ale to wystarczy. Bowiem pośród nas jest Pan Jezus. I On sam wystarczy.

Przed każdy parafianinem pojawia się pytanie: Czy jesteś gotowy/a otworzyć się na to, do czego Pan Bóg nas wzywa jako parafię? Czy jesteś gotowy/a opuścić znane, aby przyjąć nowe? Czy jesteś gotowy do zaangażowania Twoich talentów, czasu i środków materialnych w służbie tej nowej wizji?

ST. STANS HISTORICAL FACT by Rob Jagelewski. Civic improvements were lacking in the early years of the Warszawa neighborhood. Most of the streets were not paved and there were rarely any sidewalks. East 65th was paved between Lansing Avenue and Fleet Avenue. Sidewalks were not installed on that stretch until 1918. The first street lamp was installed at the corner of Lansing Avenue and East 64th in 1921. The eastern side of Broadway Avenue received electric lights in 1922. The darkness of the streets after nightfall caused numerous street accidents involving carts, trams, and automobiles knocking down pedestrians. Early stages of Polish neighborhoods looked more like villages in their own right. One-story wooden dwellings were the most common residence.
