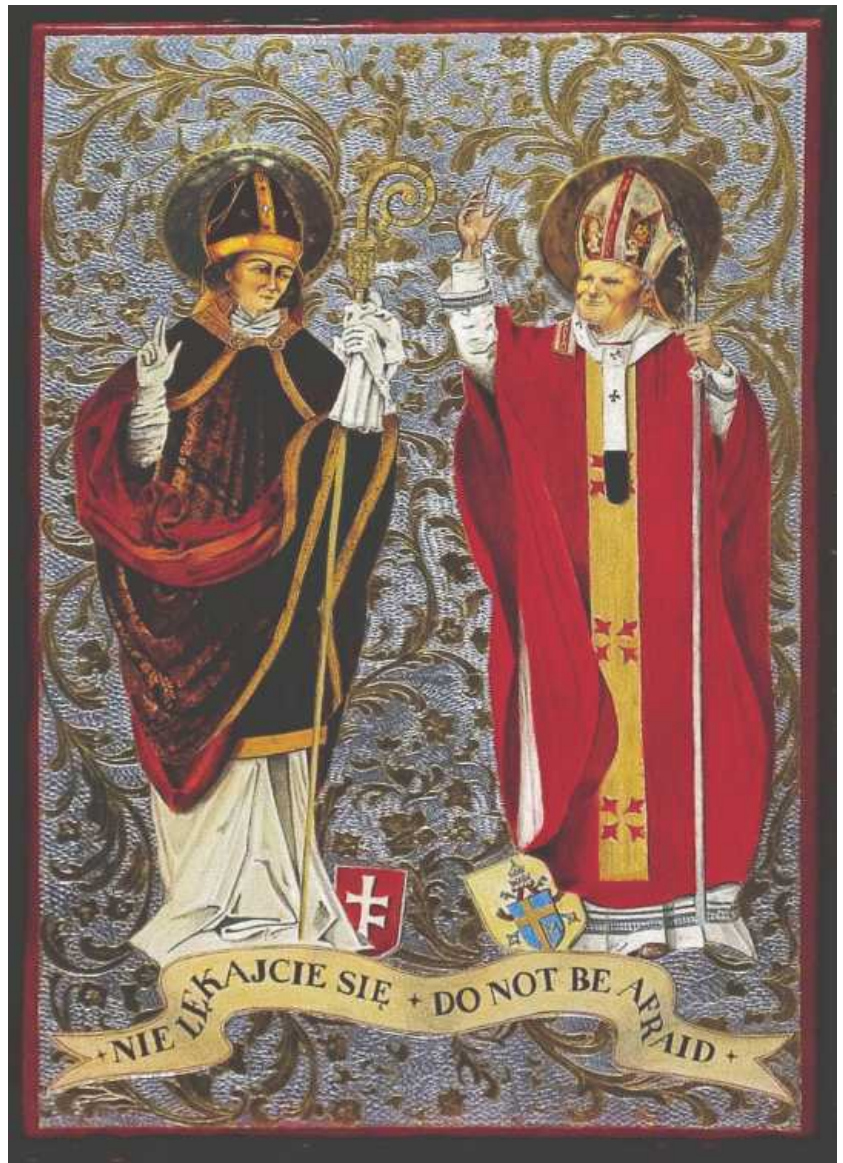

Welcome! Spirit of Love!

Today's solemn feast, Pentecost, (fiftieth) took place fifty days after Passover. Pentecost was a time for thanking God for the year's harvest and for the Sinai covenant with Israel.

People from many countries came to celebrate this feast in Jerusalem. On the first Pentecost after Jesus ascended into heaven, the apostles were gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem.

The huge crowd was attracted by the "noise" and "strong wind". The apostles came out of the room and told people what had happened. They were amazed, for each people present heard the apostles speaking in their own respective language.

Pentecost is important because with the coming of the Holy Spirit, characterized by the "noise" and "strong wind," God's plan for re-creating the world had taken a giant leap forward.

When the Spirit takes possession of us, we can speak the language of compassion. A man drove to work and from work everyday. One morning as he was driving to work, he noticed a young girl in tattered clothing sitting on the corner. After his full day of work, he is returning by the same route and finds the same girl still sitting on the corner. He looked at her, and then continued to drive home. As he lay in bed late at night, he couldn't help but think of this unfortunate girl. He felt guilty. He could have done something. He complains to God, "Why don't you do something about this? The Lord replies, "I did," I sent you." The Spirit fills us with the language of compassion (love in action) as evidenced in the life of Jesus.

Jesus eats with sinners, meets with prostitutes, touches lepers and "unclean" persons, and associates with the poor and rejected elements of society. Recall the compassion of the good Samaritan who rescued a Jewish man; recall the compassion of the four friends of the paralytic who made a hole in the roof and lowered the paralytic into the presence of Christ to be healed.

In Acts of the Apostles 2:17 God says of Pentecost, "I will pour out my Spirit on everyone." And then He added that when this happens, young people will "see visions."

Filled with the Spirit of Love what are our own "visions" of the world, the church, our family and of ourselves. What difference will I experience in my life at this Pentecost? Will I be filled with fortitude (courage) to respond to the invitation of the Spirit to "risk" my time, talent and resources to make sacrifices on behalf of the Kingdom of God.

E. Stanley Jones, Methodist missionary to India, in his book *Growing Spirituality* tells a story about a fictional person who lived out a fantasy life. All this person had to do was think something and poof! - it happened. He imagines a house and poof! - there it is; 15 bedrooms, three stories and lots of servants. He needs a fine car and poof! He has world's finest cars: Jaguar, Rolls Royce and Mercedes, complete with chauffeurs. Having no other place to travel he comes home and wishes for a sumptuous meal—poof! There before him is mouth-watering, exquisite food and he eats alone. Being bored and realizing he is not really enjoying all of this he whispers to one of his attendants, "I'd rather be in hell than here." To which the attendant replies, "Where do you think you are?" Let us first seek the Spirit, and the Kingdom of God. Peace!

O. Patryk Peyton o modlitwie rodzinnej

W dzisiejszych czasach konflikt jest obecny wszędzie - pomiędzy narodami, między jednym sąsiadem a drugim, pomiędzy pracodawcą, a pracownikiem. Konflikty te wnoszą tak wiele napięć do domów, że rodziny często nie mogą sobie z nimi poradzić, czego skutkiem są brak jedności i podziały w rodzinach. Mąż i żona unikają siebie i nie chcą ze sobą rozmawiać. Mąż nie szanuje żony, dopuszcza się bicia jej i dzieci. Rodzice uciekają w alkoholizm, niewierność, separację i rozwód. Mówią: „Nie możemy żyć ze sobą. Zerwiemy więzi małżeńskie, rozbijemy rodzinę. O dzieci, które otrzymaliśmy od Pana Boga, niech On sam się martwi.”



Czasem rodzice próbują szukać rozwiązania dając swoim dzieciom wszystko, co tylko możliwe, ale wydaje się, że im więcej rzeczy materialnych dają, tym bardziej rosną wymagania dzieci, a ilość problemów wzrasta. Dzieci nie szanują rodziców. Nie znajdując miłości w domu, szukają jej na zewnątrz - w nowym towarzystwie, w niewypróbowanych wartościach, narkotykach, a nawet w przestępstwach. Młodzi ludzie na darmo szukają odpowiedzi na dręczące ich pytania: „Kim jestem?” „Skąd się tu wzięłem?” „Dokąd zmierzam?” „Jaki jest sens mojego życia?”

Rodzice szukają pomocy na zewnątrz: w psychiatrii, socjologii, agencjach rządowych czy grupach wzajemnej pomocy. Zdają się nie myśleć o oczywistej odpowiedzi - Bożej odpowiedzi i nie dają swoim dzieciom ani miłości, ani duchowości.

Rodziny nie mogą żyć bez miłości. Jeśli rodziny rozpadną się, społeczeństwo, w postaci, w jakiej je znamy, przestanie istnieć. Rodzina jest podstawową jednostką społeczną. Społeczeństwo zależy od rodziny. Los rodziny jest losem społeczeństwa. Rodziny muszą zostać uratowane, jeśli chcemy uratować społeczeństwo.

To miłość Boża jest tym, czego brakuje rodzinom. Miłość Boga umacnia wzajemną miłość małżonków i dzieci. Tylko Bóg może ocalić rodziny.

Codzienna modlitwa wnosi na powrót Boga do domu. Jeśli Go prosisz, On przychodzi. Ale musisz Go prosić. Pan Bóg dał ci możliwość wyboru.

Jeśli rodzina modli się jako rodzina, jej członkowie jednoczą swoje wysiłki, aby zwrócić na siebie Bożą uwagę. Razem pukają do Bożych drzwi i wzywają Go.

Dwie pukające do drzwi ręce są silniejsze niż jedna, a cztery są silniejsze niż dwie. Jeśli dwoje lub więcej puka razem do drzwi sąsiada i woła o chleb, człowiek w środku domu niechybnie usłyszy silne łomotanie, niż gdyby to było tylko delikatne stukanie czy słaby głosik. Jeśli cała rodzina puka i wszyscy wołają, człowiek w środku domu niejako nie ma wyjścia i musi otworzyć i użyczyć proszącym chleba. Tak samo jest z modlitwą.

Jeśli rodzina modli się razem, cała rodzina korzysta z owoców modlitwy. Nie oznacza to, że już od tej pory nie będzie żadnych konfliktów, ponieważ one będą. Ale kiedy razem rozmawiacie z Bogiem, nagle wszystkie problemy, różnice, napięcia, zagniewanie znika i pojawia się kochająca się nawzajem rodzina.

W ten sposób o. Patryk starał się zachęcać rodziny do wspólnej modlitwy, podkreślając szczególne znaczenie Różańca. Zwykł mówić: „Rodzina, która razem się modli, trzyma się razem”.

ST. STANS HISTORICAL FACT by Rob Jagelewski. For immigrants to Cleveland in the late 1800's coming to America offered an opportunity to escape political problems at home and to direct the course of their own lives. Economically, two weeks of work in this country could bring in as much as a whole season's labor in German or Hungarian agriculture. A good number of migrants considered their stay here temporary. Before World War I, re-immigration to the homeland and circulation back and forth across the ocean were common. These individuals were almost like migrant workers. The return rate was about thirty per cent of the emigration rate.
