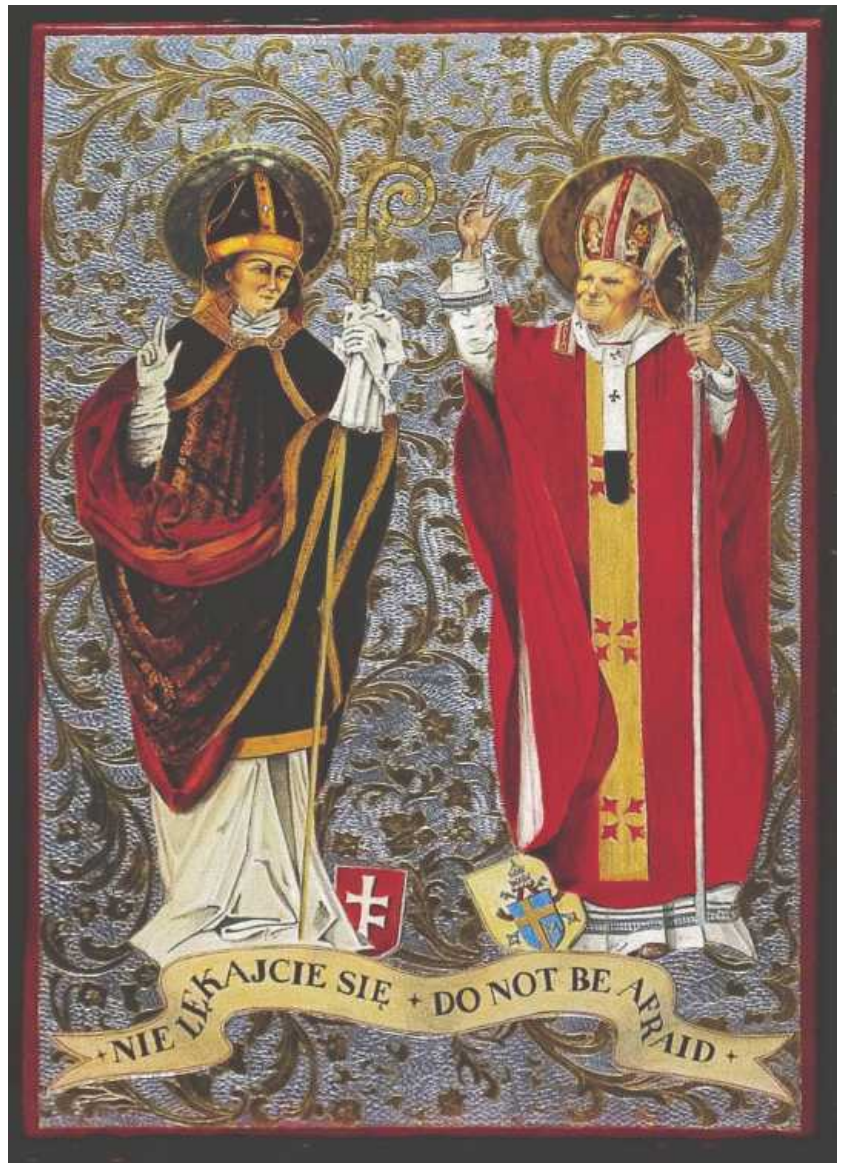

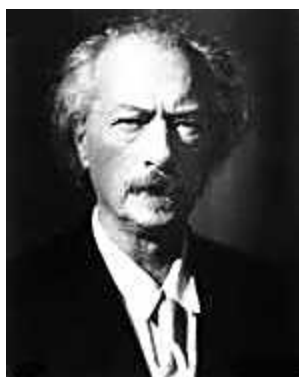

IGNACY JAN PADEREWSKI

When I was a little boy my father used to refer to me as ‘Paderewski’...lol I was too young to know exactly who this ‘Paderewski’ was, but I was told he was a famous Polish pianist. From what I can gather from various biographers his fame and popularity back in the turn of the 19th/20th century was equal to that of famous athletes and pop stars of today! Aside from being a pianist he acquired great wealth from all of his concertizing, much of it used for his own pleasure, much of it used for the benefit of the country, Poland, which captured his heart early on.

When Paderewski was born in 1860 he was born into a country which technically did not exist. Poland was still divided by the partitioning powers (Russia, Prussia and Austria) of the late 18th century, a misfortune Paderewski was determined to reverse during his lifetime. He did live to see the re-birth of Poland as a sovereign nation in 1919, 123 years after the last partition. Of course, as we all know, this independence was interrupted in 1939 when the country was divided between Hitler and Stalin. Paderewski died during that war in 1941, his body temporarily interred in Arlington until a day when it could be taken back to a free Poland. It was returned there in 1992, his earthly remains interred in the vaults of St. John’s Cathedral in Warsaw next to other Polish kings and national heroes.

Next weekend there will be a special celebration at the Polish Cultural Garden with the re-installation of the bust of Paderewski! The garden, located at the corner of St. Clair and East Boulevard, has been undergoing a restoration over the past few years thanks to the support of many in the community. Each year a figure from Polish history has been placed in the garden creating a sort of mini ‘pantheon’ of historically important Poles. Last year it was Chopin. The previous year it was Marie Sklodowska-Curie. Before that Kopernik along with Sienkiewicz. The important qualification of each of these individuals is that they all contributed their talents peacefully. No Generals or Dictators are permitted to be honored in the garden....it is truly a PEACE GARDEN!

Paderewski would certainly qualify as a man of peace. His love of country did not grow from the hatred of other countries, but, rather, a mutual respect for differing cultures. He saw how the United States was able to include a mosaic of cultures and yet maintain a common identity, so why couldn’t the countries of Europe and the rest of the world? Through his perseverance and hard work, his efforts to be a co-architect for the establishment of the Second Republic of Poland proved successful after the signing of the Versailles Treaty in 1919. Throughout the inter-war period he served his country as an ambassador of culture as well as diplomacy in various capacities inside and outside of the new Republic.

Aside from being a composer, musician and statesman Paderewski was a true philanthropist. His fabulous earnings allowed him to be generous to people all over the world, not only to those in his native land. Among the beneficiaries of his largesse were young American musicians at Stanford University, a fund to aid the Treasury of the Professors of the Parisian Conservatory, a scholarship fund at Ecole Normale, scholarships at the St. Petersburg and Moscow Conservatories, funds for spas in the Alps, for the British Legion, unemployed musicians in both the USA and in Switzerland, an insurance fund for London musicians, aid to Jewish intellectuals in Paris, as well as some orphanages in New York City and a Maternity Center in that same city.

If you are free this coming Saturday, July 16th, at 2:30 pm, why not take a drive down to the Cultural Gardens and share in the festivities. There will be piano music of Paderewski as well as a commentary by noted musicologist Dr. David Dubal. It is good for us to gather to honor great people as Paderewski, to hold them up as an example to the rest of the world to emulate. His love for beauty and for truth were concretely manifested by his passionate service and love to all people of the world.

EYE FOR AN EYE = "I" FOR "I"

What do you do when people do you wrong? Insult or humiliate you? Make you feel ill at ease? Put you down?

Do you resort to "sweet revenge" as is evident in the following little story presented to us by Fr. Bill Bausch in his book *World of Stories*:

Late one night, a cheerful truck driver pulled up to a roadside diner for some refreshment. As he was eating, three mean-looking motorcyclists roared up to the diner's entrance. The atmosphere became tense as they stalked in. Immediately, they selected the truck driver as the target of their meanness. One poured salt and pepper on his head. Another took his apple pie, placed it on the floor, and squished it under a dirty boot. The third upset his coffee, causing it to spill in his lap.

The truck driver said not a word. He merely arose, walked slowly to the cashier, calmly paid his check, and made his exit. "That dude sure ain't much of a fighter," sneered one of the invaders. The waiter behind the counter peered out into the night and then replied, "He doesn't seem to be much of a driver, either. He just ran his truck over three motorcycles."

Do we seek revenge for what others do to us? We look at how the older brothers resented Joseph and cast him into a deep well and left him to die. But, he was rescued by people traveling in a caravan. Later he became a powerful man who was in charge of food distribution. No doubt, Joseph was angry for what his brothers did to him, but he proved himself a courageous and loving person.

In the land at that time, there was a great famine. Lo and behold, who approaches him for food, if not his brothers who abandoned him. But, Joseph filled with the Spirit, did not answer them with revenge, but with kindness.

Jesus had good and justified reason to be angry and seek revenge those who placed him on the Cross. But instead, he showered them with mercy and forgiveness. He wished them no evil—only good.

People nowadays are prone to seek revenge. They will seek to ruin another's property if their own was damaged. Road rage—trying to "get even" with a motorist who operated his vehicle in a reckless and inappropriate manner: he cut us off; weaved in and out in traffic; took our usual parking space.

Whatever we do—good or bad—is recorded on our consciences and in the Book of Life that we will present to the Lord on judgment day.

Every deed, thought and word—is recorded on our conscience. It will leave us better or bitter. Good deeds will be rewarded and evil deeds will be punished and subject to purgation until "the last penny is paid".

Everything on earth belongs to God... persons, places and things. We will be held accountable for whatever damage we do to persons, places and things.

Jesus asks us to turn the other cheek; to give over our other cloak to the thief; to go the extra mile if we are pressed into service. "Bless those who persecute you and insult you. Your reward in heaven will be great."

CIERPIENIE TERAŹNIEJSZE I PRZYSZŁA

CHWAŁA

W Liturgii słowa dzisiejszej niedzieli słyszymy słowa św. Pawła Apostoła: „*Sądzę bowiem, że cierpienie terażniejszych nie można stawiać na równi z chwałą, który ma się w nas objawić*” (Rz 8:18)

Człowiek jest istotą, która w cierpieniu i smutku łatwo zapomina o radości i szczęściu. Kiedy cierpienie mija i na nowo wraca dobry nastrój, miniony ból już więcej nie boli. To o tym mówi Pan Jezus do uczniów zgromadzonych w Wieczerniku. On wie, że za chwilę zostanie pojmany, osądzony i skazany na okrutną śmierć na krzyżu, ale pomimo tego nie myśli o sobie, ale dodaje uczniom otuchy, wiedząc, że Jego los, niedługo stanie się ich losem. Dlatego mówi do nich: „*Kobieta, gdy rodzi, doznaje smutku, bo przyszła jej godzina. Gdy jednak urodzi dziecię, już nie pamięta o bólu z powodu radości, że się człowiek narodził na świat*” (J 16:21).

Jest oczywistością, której nie trzeba udowadniać, że życiu ziemskiemu każdego człowieka towarzyszy cierpienie. Czasem może myślimy, że są ludzie, którzy nie cierpią. Może zazdrościmy bogatym, sławnym, zdrowym, młodym, pięknym. A jednak każdy ma swój krzyż. Mniejszy lub większy. Nawet jeśli nie wierzy w Chrystusa, który mówił do swoich uczniów o codziennym braniu na plecy i dźwiganiu krzyża. Nikt nie jest wolny od cierpienia. Chrześcijanin nie jest tu wyjątkiem. Nawet ten, który żyje zbożnie w Chrystusie, czyli stara się zachować przykazania i prowadzić godne życie. „*I wszystkich, którzy chcą żyć zbożnie w Chrystusie Jezusie, spotkają prześladowania*” (2 Tm 3:12).

Z drugiej strony ten sam Apostoł pisze na innym miejscu: „*Ani oko nie widziało, ani ucho nie słyszało, ani serce człowieka nie zdołało pojąć, jak wielkie rzeczy przygotował Bóg tym, którzy Go miłują*” (1 Kor 2:9).

Pan Jezus nie obiecał swoim uczniom, że droga prowadząca do nieba jest łatwa i przyjemna. Raczej odwrotnie. On mówił o wąskiej i stromej drodze, o niezrozumieniu, obmowach, prześladowaniach, aż do wylania krwi i utraty życia włącznie. Ze względu na Niego.

W cierpieniach musimy patrzeć się naszego Pana, który idzie przed nami na królewskiej drodze prowadzącej tam, gdzie On już zasiada, do nieba. Ale jest to droga krzyżowa. Jego droga musi stać się naszą drogą, ponieważ innej nie ma. „*Per aspera ad astra*” - mówili starożytni Rzymianie, czyli „Przez trudy do gwiazd”. A Pan Jezus mówi do nas: „Przez cierpienie do radości nieba”. Tam oczekuje na nas szczęście bez granic i obawy utraty. Dlatego ta myśl niech nam przyświeca, kiedy przydarzy się choroba, utrata pracy, śmierć bliskiej osoby, obmowy, niezrozumienie, odrzucenie, słowem jakiegokolwiek cierpienie, szczególnie to ze względu na naszą wiarę w Chrystusa. Bo cierpienia terażniejsze są niczym w porównaniu z chwałą przygotowaną dla nas w niebie.

Panie Jezu, pomóż nam, abyśmy wytrwali do końca naszej ziemskiej wędrówki.
