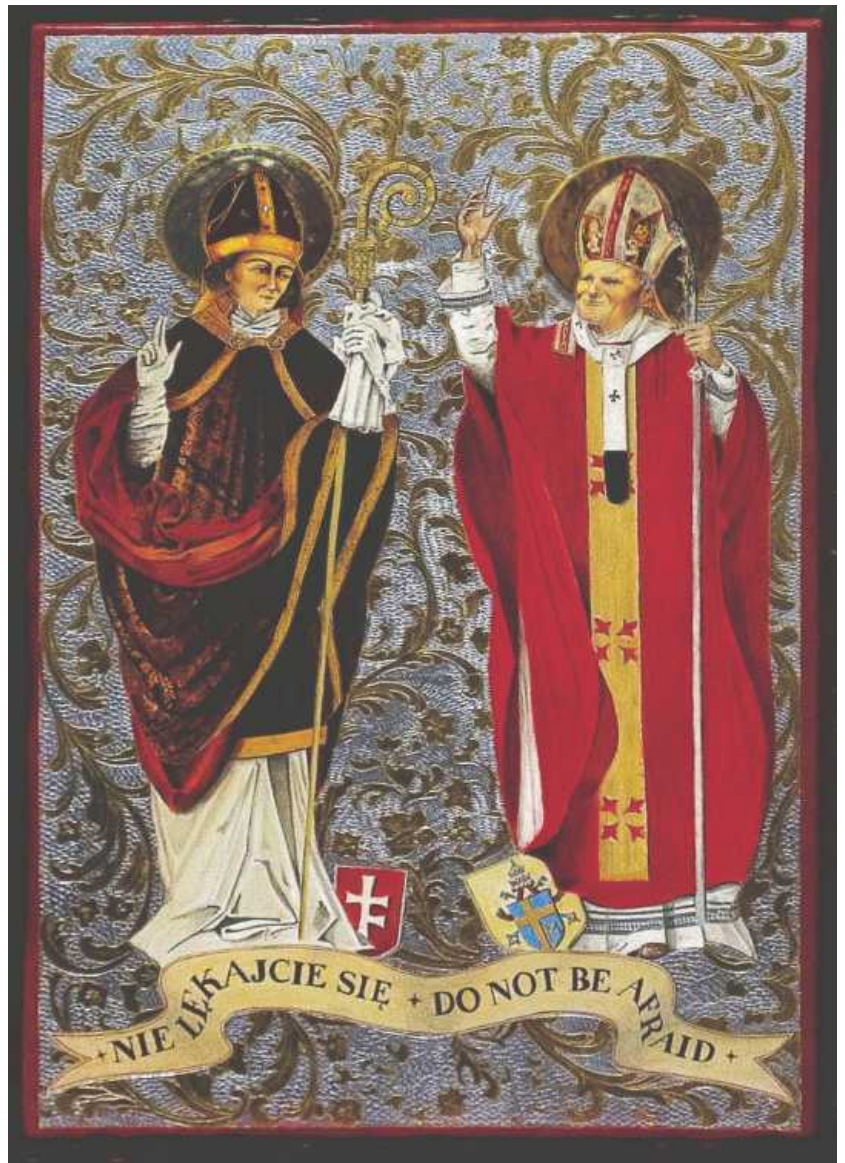

DOMINUS VOBISCUM...ET CUM SPIRITU TUO



The Lord be with you....and with your Spirit. Above you see a photograph of St. Pio uttering those exact words in Latin. At each Mass you hear the identical dialogue between the priest and the congregation. Yes, we currently use a modified translation, but with the upcoming revisions and translations, once again we will return to a wording more accurately reflecting the original Latin text. This 'new' wording is the result of the translation of the *Missale Romanum* (the Latin text of the Roman Missal) issued by Blessed John Paul II in the Jubilee Year 2000. This edition (the third edition) included many new texts requiring translation. It was the wish of the Holy Father that the translations be faithful to the spirit of the liturgy celebrated over centuries based on tradition and scripture. With only a few decades of vernacular translation behind us, those responsible for such matters deemed it prudent to re-visit the original work and create a more sound and spiritually orthodox reflection of the action within the Eucharistic celebration, the heart of the Church's life.

Together we will incorporate the revisions over the next few months and, before you know it, it will seem as though we always said things the way they will be said from now on. Our pastoral team will try to familiarize everyone with these revisions along with the assistance of catechetical aids which will be provided to everyone in our congregation. We are considering options to our current arrangement of missalettes as well. As you know the Polish missalette already contains both languages. An option is to simply rely on that one book for the entire congregation with a supplemental hymnal for both which would contain songs for the entire liturgical year. Along with those resources we may provide the English speaking congregation with a sort of 'card' to assist in the revised language to be used throughout the liturgy.

So, getting back to the title of this article, let's try to understand why we will be responding to the priest with different words. For the past decades we've said: 'and also with you' hundreds of times. Now we will respond 'and with your spirit.' For those of you who know enough Latin and Polish, this change will be simple. Both languages are quite clear in their terminology and the Polish translates the Latin directly. Along the way the English translation ventured a little from the original intent, thus the clean up.

"The Lord be with you" is a phrase used frequently throughout Sacred Scripture in both the New and the Old Testaments. The people's response simply mirrors the same wish flowing from the priest, both statements implying "the Lord be with your spirit." Within the context of the liturgy that greeting/response has been used for many centuries with Pope Innocent III (+1180) (n.b. this is the same pope who canonized our St. Stanislaus in 1079) making an adjustment for Bishops (who say: "Peace be with you") as vicars of the risen Christ. This same dialogue is heard in various parts of the Mass aside from the option at the Introductory Rite (e.g. before the Gospel, at the beginning of the Preface).

This might seem overwhelming, but let's all just take a deep breath and plunge into this challenge. In the end, we will continue to worship God together and He will enjoy our new way of saying things!

Let Go!!! ... Let God

There was a king who owned a very valuable diamond. One day an accident happened and the diamond got deeply scratched. The king consulted experts to see if anything could be done to save the diamond. But they told him that even if they were to polish it, they would never be

able to repair the wound it had suffered.

So the king locked the diamond in his vault where it lay hidden and useless for years. Then one day a famous diamond cutter arrived. The king invited him to examine the diamond to see if anything could be done with it. The diamond cutter looked at the diamond closely and in a short time he approached the king and said to him: 'Your Majesty, I will make the diamond look even more beautiful than it was before the accident.'

On hearing this the other diamond cutters laughed. But the king was delighted and gave him permission to work on the diamond.

Using all his artistic skills, he began to engrave a beautiful rose on the diamond, using the deep scratch as the stem of the rose. When the king and the other diamond cutters saw what he had done they were filled with great admiration. It wasn't just a clever cover-up. He took the diamond's fault and transformed it into something beautiful.

In much the same way God can help to transform our worst fault into a virtue, our worst misfortune into our greatest blessing. Painful experiences in life help us to learn that God is 'faithful to us and can bring good out of anything.'

The words of Scripture say: 'God makes all things work together for the good of those who love him.' God can make of us— weak human beings — a beautiful treasure worthy of becoming an everlasting gift to the Father. How great is that!!

The readings of today encourage us to seek from God the gift of wisdom. Knowledge is how we do things; wisdom is who we are. Justice Oliver Wendall Holmes summed up the philosophy of living when he wrote: "A person's one and only success is to bring to his work a mighty heart."

The gospel of today speaks specifically of two individuals who found treasures. In olden days people did not have banks and storage vaults in which to store their valuables safely. They all buried their valuables in the ground. So, it was not uncommon that people often times came upon treasures buried in the ground—especially, after the original owner was forced to move due to military conflicts or passed away.

In the first parable the poor farmer is plowing his field, when lo and behold his plow hits a clump— a clump that turns out to be a treasure. He makes a wise decision: he sells everything that he owns and buys the field. Only an owner was rightful possessor of all that his property embraced and contained. By accident he found the treasure.

In the second parable the person is a lifetime merchant seeking to find treasures that will make him happy all the days of his life. The farmer and the merchant were both very wise—they sold all they had and purchased the treasure. We, too, must be wise: rid ourselves of perishable earthly goods and strive to possess the most precious treasure of eternal life.

„Dlaczego w przypowieściach mówisz do nich?”



No, właśnie: dlaczego w przypowieściach Pan Jezus mówił do słuchaczy? W trzecią już z kolei niedzielę Kościół daje nam do słuchania i rozważania fragment z 13-go rozdziału Ewangelii według św. Mateusza zawierającego przypowieści. Dlaczego zatem Pan nagle zmienił sposób przepowiadania? Aż dotąd nauczał dając pouczenia w formie prostych pouczeń, a teraz, to znaczy w trzynastym rozdziale, nagle zmienia formę nauczania opowiadając przypowieści, czyli alegoryczne porównania. Ta radykalna zmiana powoduje uzasadnione pytanie uczniów: „Dlaczego (teraz) w przypowieściach mówisz do nich?”

Wielu chrześcijan mówi o przypowieściach, że są wspaniałym sposobem nauczania, że łatwiej je zapamiętać, dłużej pozostają w pamięci, i o to chodziło Panu Jezusowi. Tak, jest w tym dużo prawdy, ale jak się wydaje, nie jest to pełnym wyjaśnieniem. Bowiem, aż do 13-go rozdziału Ewangelii według św. Mateusza mamy prawie wyłącznie nauczanie Pana podane w prostej formie, tzn. bez użycia przypowieści. Co więc stało się, że Pan zmienił sposób nauczania, podając je wyłącznie w formie przypowieści?

Odpowiedź na to pytanie znajdziemy w poprzedzających rozdziałach 11. i 12. Znajdujemy tam sąd Pana o Jego współczesnych (11:16-19); są tam Jego słowa skierowane przeciw nie pokutującym miastom (11:20-24); jest tam napisane o faryzeuszach, którzy zarzucają Panu, że wyrzuca złe duchy mocą ich przywódcy (12:22-30); w końcu jest nauka o grzechu przeciwko Duchowi Świętemu (12:31-37). Wszystkie te fakty, świadczące o zatwardziałości serc ludu, a przede wszystkim samych przywódców duchowych, wpłynęły na to, że i Pan zmienił sposób nauczania.

Potwierdza to tło Starego Testamentu. Dwa razy znajdujemy tam przypowieści i w każdym z tym przypadków mamy do czynienia z zepsuciem przywódców. Chronologicznie pierwszym przypadkiem jest ten opisany w rozdziale 9. Księgi Sędziów. Po śmierci Gedona-Jerubbala panującego w Izraelu jako sędzieja, jeden z jego siedemdziesięciu synów - Abimelek - zabija wszystkich swoich braci z wyjątkiem Jotama, a starsi Sychem namaszczają go na króla. Kiedy doniesiono o tym Jotamowi, on wygłasza do nich ...przypowieść o drzewach, którą możemy przeczytać w Sdz 9:7-15.

Innym miejscem w Starym Testamencie, gdzie możemy znaleźć przypowieść, jest Druga Księga Samuela. W rozdziale 11. tej Księgi jest napisane o grzechu Dawida. Najpierw dopuścił się grzechu cudzołóstwa z Batszebą, a następnie dodał do tego zamordowanie jej męża. I wtedy prorok Natan upomina go dając mu pouczenie w formie ...przypowieści. Dawid przyjął upomnienie proroka i odpokutował swój grzech.

Przypowieść zatem to nie tyle ulubiony przez Pana sposób nauczania, ile raczej bardziej naglące wezwanie do nawrócenia.

ST. STANS HISTORICAL FACT by Rob Jagelewski. In our archives we have copies of a number of documents that were originally in the archives of the Diocese of Cleveland. One such document is dated April 14, 1890. The present church building is under construction and is nearing completion of the building project. The church will be opened in 1891. This document is an order for twenty-five statues for a total of \$1,675. Some of the statues that were ordered in this document still grace our church with their presence. The statues that were ordered included St. Joachim, St. Augustine, St. Francis Xavier, St. Cecilia, St. Anne, St. Barbara, St. Catherine, St. Hedwig, St. Margaret Mary, St. Agnes, St. Clare, St. Stanislaus Kostka, St. Elizabeth, four Evangelists, and three Guardian Angels of differing sizes. The order was made by Fr. Anton Kolaszewski, Pastor of St. Stanislaus Parish during the construction of our Church building.
