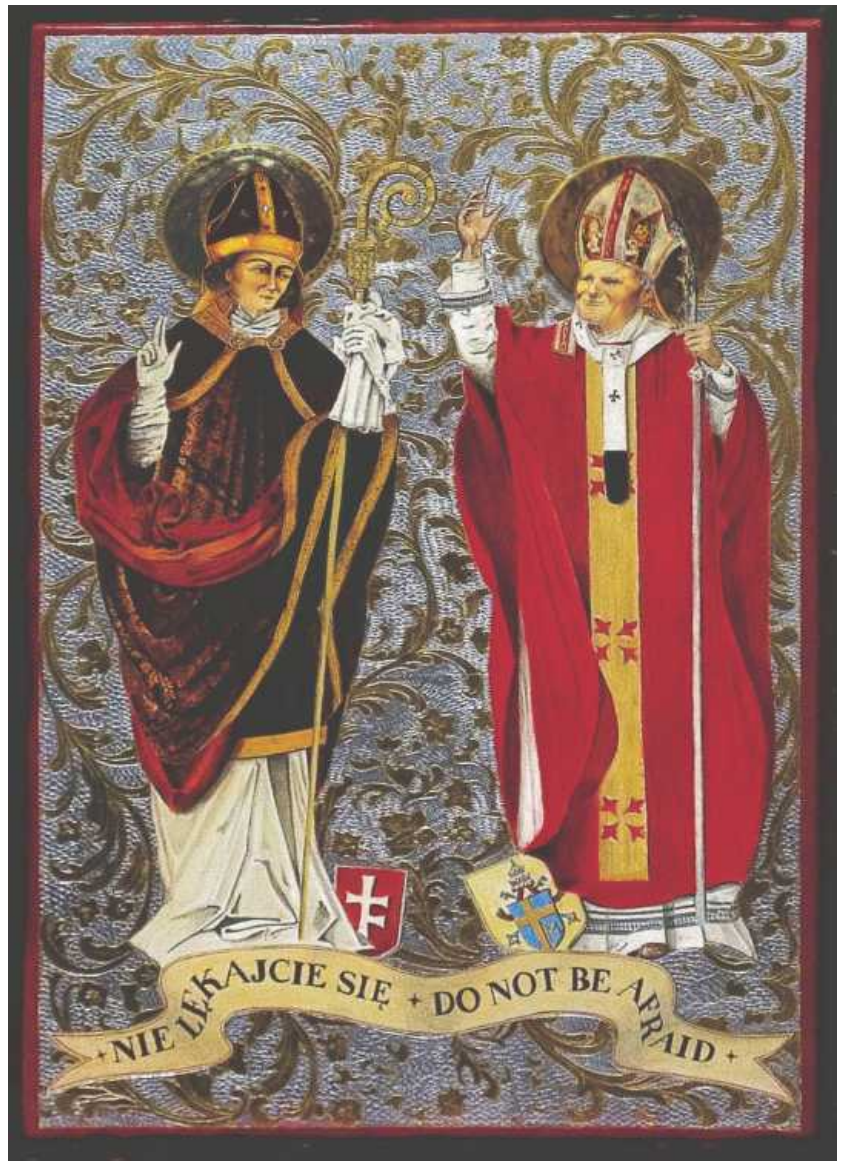

45 years ago...

I remember Labor Day weekend back in 1966. It was a weekend my parents became empty-nesters. That weekend my sister Judy got married at Sacred Heart of Jesus Church (my sister Barbara was already married and out of the nest) and two days later I went off to Prep School in Orchard Lake, Michigan. It must have seemed strange when our parents got home that Labor Day evening to an empty house.

I imagine others have experienced similar things after having married off children or sent them off to school, whether kindergarten or college—it's a new beginning and a new basket of worries for those who spend years of time and energy and love into molding the children and preparing them as best as possible for the world in which they will be on their own.

I know 45 years ago it seemed a little frightening to me leaving home and being with hundreds of new people in a totally foreign environment. But, as things go, we manage to find new friends as time goes on and before you know it the new circumstances become less daunting. I don't think I planned on being away for 30 years, but things have a way of happening.

Now I am a part of a world which revolves around St. Stanislaus. I've only been here since the end of 1998, but, in that time, I've come to know so many fine people. I always look back to my education while in Michigan and believe that this place allows me to make use of the disciplines which I studied, especially while in the colleges I attended. Where else could I put to use studies in theology, philosophy, humanities, Eastern Europe, and Music as I can right here at this place at this point of time?!

Forty-five years ago I never dreamed I would be where I am today. Forty-five years ago I probably hoped for something totally different. As complicated as life has been I would not change a thing. I am still learning, still making mistakes, still worrying and even still dreaming. Quixotic and crazy balances with the serious and the sane in most cases, and life goes on.

Forty-five years ago my parents saw me leave their nest. Now I have many nests of my own, including a big one here at the Shrine Church of St. Stanislaus which I share with Four Eagles and a few thousand people. I hope God protects this nest for years to come. I hope, but, in the end, God will leave that up to us to decide.

Which Is It? Stand Up or Stand Back ?

If you saw your young child about to put his hand in a hot stove, wouldn't you move quickly to prevent him from being burned? If that same child got hold of your prescription medicine, you would act just as quickly

to prevent a terrible mishap. If a distracted friend was about to step into oncoming traffic, you would grab her arm and save her, wouldn't you? If, perhaps, a companion drank too much at a party, you would see to it that he did not drive. If your teenager was hanging out with friends who were known to be trouble-makers, wouldn't you do something to remedy the situation? What if a friend or coworker was in an abusive relationship—wouldn't you try to help her in some way?

There are countless other occasions when we see someone hurt or in danger and, good friends and family members that we are, we step up to help. If we can extend our care to others in all these instances of physical, emotional or psychological need, why are we reluctant to do the same when we see another person falling into sin? Today the sacred texts address this issue clearly and frankly, affirming that we are to muster whatever gumption is necessary to meet this mutual responsibility.

In just five years, *Facebook* has gone from a startup to a social network phenomenon with 500 million users. People have found a new voice, a new way to connect. They have discovered that in their numbers they have the power to change their governments. In today's Gospel, we learn that 2,000 years ago, Jesus also told us that there is power in numbers. First he says, "If two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven." And then he says, "Where two or three of you are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

Paul, in his Letter to the Romans, underscored the motivation for reaching out to one another with care: We owe it to one another to love each other. Because authentic love does no evil, love is willing to confront others with their failures—not solely for the sake of correction but with an eye to their conversion and ours as well.

While sin isolates one from the other, the admission of sin empowers fellowship that mutually strengthens believers to resist sin together.

There is no part of the church that is perfect, no element that is not constantly in need of correction and improvement. This church knows that there are no sins and omissions to which it cannot be tempted and to which it has not, in one way or another, yielded. However much it continues to keep sin at a distance, it has no reason to keep the sinner at a distance.

Most confrontations occur over insignificant things. Adults who refuse to speak the truth in love share in the sin of the other person. Teenagers generally do not like an adult to correct them; they will sooner accept correction from an outsider. For a teen to fail to confront a friend who is driving drunk, is a failure of love. Teens need to be recognized as voices of truth in the community. Parents may need to be confronted by their teens.

Small children, especially, must be corrected with love. It is time to Stand Up and act—not Stand Back.

Spotkanie (3/4)

Po powrocie z Florydy postanowiłam pojechać z powrotem do Niemiec. Myślałam sobie, że tylko tam, gdzie zrodziła się moja nienawiść, mogę ją także pokonać. Pojechałam do Monachium i kontynuowałam studia i moją pracę w klinice. Jednocześnie udało mi się – zostało mi to dane – spotkać katolickiego kapłana, który z wielką cierpliwością i dobrocią towarzyszył mi na drodze poszukiwania Bożej miłości. Powoli przewycięzałam moją nienawiść i otrzymałam dar, że mogłam przebaczyć. Moje pragnienie spotkania Jezusa było tak wielkie, że w 1965 r. poprosiłam o sakrament Chrztu i dwa lata później, 12. września 1967 r. zostałam ochrzczona.

Podczas studiów spotkałam człowieka, lekarza, jak ja, który troszczył się o mnie w delikatny, a jednocześnie pełen uczucia sposób. Był to muzułmanin z Pakistanu. Po raz pierwszy w moim życiu zaznałam ciepła i akceptacji ze strony drugiego człowieka. Ze względów politycznych konieczna była szybka decyzja. Po krótkim zastanowieniu, 18. września 1967 r. wyjechałam do Pakistanu – tylko jeden dzień przed planowaną pierwszą Komunią św. Cztery tygodnie później zawarliśmy zgodnie z muzułmańskim prawem związek małżeński. Realizując nasze zamierzenia, aby pomagać ubogim, rozbiliśmy namioty na skraju pustyni i zaczęliśmy naszą lekarską praktykę. Ja, Sara, jako pediatra, mój mąż, chirurg i internista. Przez kolejne lata zostaliśmy obdarowani dziewięciorgiem dzieci. Ponieważ kobieta w Pakistanie nie ma żadnych praw, nie mogłam wychowywać ich w wierze chrześcijańskiej. Tylko po porodzie, używając wody moich łez radości znaczyłam znakiem krzyża czoła moich dzieci, i oddawałam je Bogu w darze.

Podczas mojego około 35-letniego pobytu w Pakistanie, ilekroć musiałam iść do meczetu, tyle razy towarzyszyło mi uczucie, że wyrzekłam się mojej chrześcijańskiej wiary, a może nawet, że dopuściłam się zdrady Jezusa. Ale w rzeczywistości, zawsze czyniłam wszystko z miłości dla Chrystusa. Bolesnym doświadczeniem było dla mnie, kiedy widziałam umierającą dzieci, i nie byłam w stanie im pomóc. Zdarzyło się czasem, że nadzieja opuszczała mnie całkowicie. Wtedy, szłam na pustynię i modliłam się, ale wybac mi Boże, bywało, że krzyczałam na Ciebie i sprzeczałam się z Tobą. Ale mimo wszystko, modlitwa była skuteczną pomocą i źródłem pociechy. Szczególnie niektóre Psalmi:

- „Jak tania pragnie wody ze strumieni, tak dusza moja pragnie Ciebie, Boże” (42: 2);
- „Boże mój, Boże mój, czemuś mnie opuścił?” (22:2);
- „Pan światłem i zbawieniem moim: kogóż mam się lękać? Pan obroną mojego życia: przed kim mam się trwożyć?” (27:1);
- „Boże, Ty Boże mój, Ciebie szukam; Ciebie pragnie moja dusza, za Tobą tęskni moje ciało, jak ziemia zeschła, spragniona, bez wody” (63:2);
- „Ku Tobie, Panie, wznoszę moją duszę, mój Boże, Tobie ufam: niech nie doznam zawodu!” (25:1-2). (zakończenie za tydzień)
