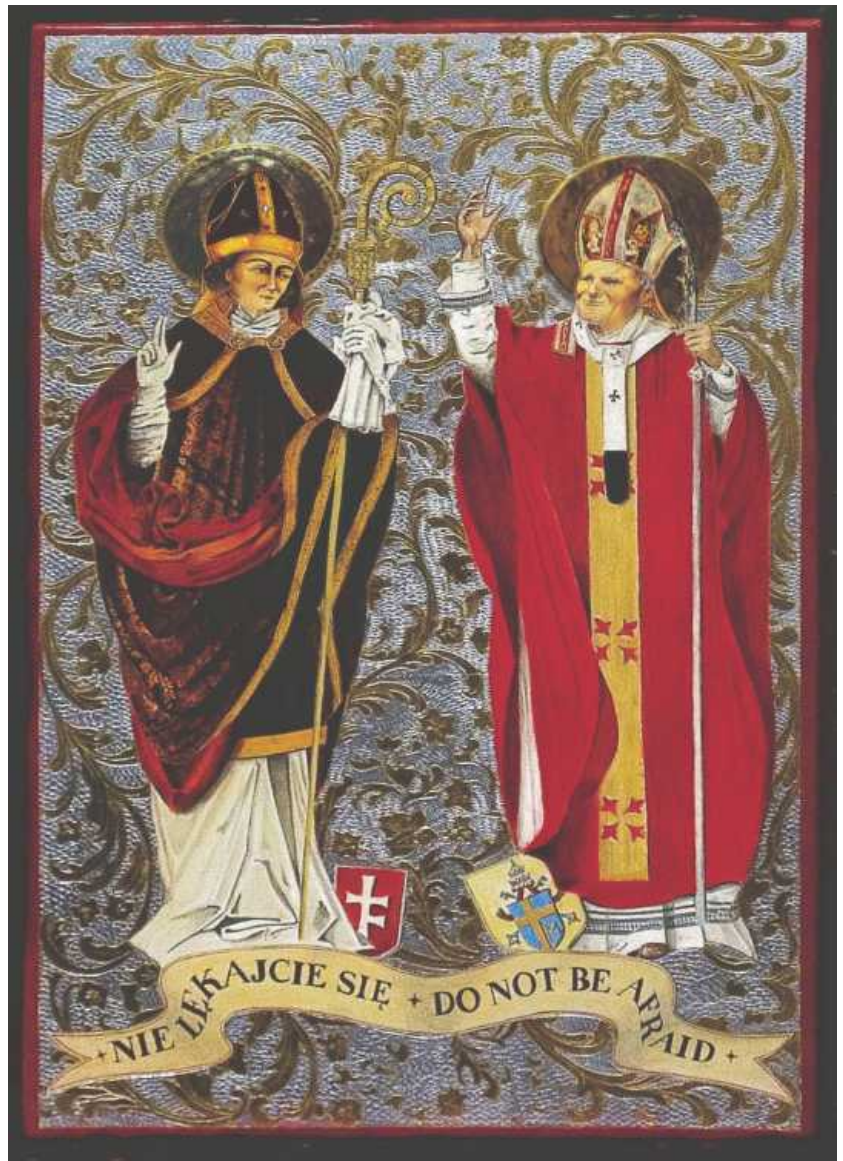

Autumn is in the air and so is the aroma of cabbage and kielbasa! It's festival time again at the Shrine Church of St. Stanislaus. This year, as always, we welcome guests from near and far to visit with old friends, eat good home cooked meals, listen to lively polka music and drop in to spend some time with Jesus and HIS friends in the church.

I have been to many other church festivals over the years and have noticed that the 'church stop' is often not on the list of 'things to do!' When visiting this festival, however, many people visit the church for a variety of reasons. Some want to check out the beautiful interior. Others want to reminisce. Still others need a break from the noise of the Social Center. But the majority of people enter the doors of the church to spend some time with Jesus and the saints. Yes, it is a house of prayer above all else. **Five years are gone...**

...as one day. Yes, almost five years ago, on October 16, I came over to St. Stanislaus in Cleveland, Ohio. Above all I was asked to be for the Polish-speaking part of St. Stanislaus Parish, but of course not exclusively, because I was for the other as well. My visa "R-1" is expiring on October 15. There is no possibility to extend this kind of visa while I am still in USA. I have to leave the country and to apply for it again from Poland. On October 12, I will fly back to Poland. I will go to Cracow where I will stay for some time. There I will start the process of getting a visa or the green card. I suppose that will take about one year. Afterwards I will be able to come back to USA, but I will go to Chicago. There I will be working with Fr. Blais Karas in a shelter for homeless men. The house is at the Holy Trinity Parish. It is a function I've never had before. This is why I am thinking of returning to USA with mixed feeling. I guess, it will be a challenge to me. The homeless shelter will be the place where I will spend the day, but for the night I will go to the newly bought house that will be adapted for a friary for 4-6 friars. Fr. Michael will be one of them. As everyone in the parish already knows, he also is leaving Cleveland. It will be in December of this year or January 2012. His job is the vocational director. His task will be to find young men interested in the Franciscan life.

David Krakowski was totally correct in writing that leaving Cleveland I will take with me the parish and its members. But it is also true that a part of my soul will stay in Cleveland even if I have left it because with the friars working and living here, and with the parish members I am connected with special bonds. I realize that with the distance and time they will slowly get loose, but I don't think that I ever will be able to forget you. I believe that the bonds between us will remain firm. It is possible that with some of you I will never again meet in Cleveland nor elsewhere, but I am strongly convinced that if we are recognized by God to be worthy to participate in His eternal heavenly kingdom, we will meet there where there will be no more separation.

By this occasion, I would like once more to say thank you to God and my superiors for sending me to the Shrine of St. Stanislaus in Cleveland. I am very grateful for the many occasions of prayer together; for the opportunities of meeting many interesting people whom I am privileged now to call friends; I thank you for your acceptance of my person, for many hours of conversation by different occasions, happy and sad as well. I thank you for all the time spent together. I apologize for all my shortcomings.

As I mentioned, after the festival, on October 12, I will go back to Poland. I ask you to keep me in your prayers. On my part I promise to remember of you in my prayers. May God bless you always!

**Fr. Placyd****„Pięć lat minęło...**

...jak jeden dzień... Tak, prawie pięć lat temu, 16 października 2006 przyjechałem do Cleveland do pracy jako duszpasterz przede wszystkim dla polsko-języcznej części parafii św. Stanisława, ale nie tylko, bo też sprawowałem opiekę duszpasterską nad pozostałymi członkami parafii. Moja wiza „R-1” wygasa 15 tego miesiąca. Ponieważ obecnie nie można jej przedłużyć pozostając w USA, muszę wyjechać z powrotem do Polski. Stanie się to 12 października. Zatrzymam się w Krakowie. Tam rozpocznę starania o uzyskanie zielonej karty. Z chwilą uzyskania tego dokumentu przyjadę z powrotem do USA, ale nie do Cleveland, lecz do Chicago. Tam będę pracował przy parafii Świętej Trójcy, w przytułku dla bezdomnych. Jest to pewne wyzwanie dla mnie. Nigdy nie miałem takiej funkcji. Dlatego o możliwym powrocie do USA myślę z mieszanymi uczuciami. Dom przy kościele Świętej Trójcy będzie miejscem pracy, natomiast moje mieszkanie będzie w nowym domu, który dopiero kupiony będzie przerobiony na klasztor dla 4-6 braci. Jednym z nich będzie obecny proboszcz św. Stanisława, o. Michał Surufka. On także odchodzi z Cleveland. Stanie się to w grudniu tego roku lub w styczniu roku przyszłego. O. Michał ma nową funkcję – referenta do spraw powołań w jego prowincji. Jego zadaniem będzie budzenie powołań i wyszukiwanie młodych mężczyzn zainteresowanych życiem zakonnym.

Ma rację David Krakowski pisząc, że odchodząc z Cleveland „zabiorę” ze sobą tę parafię i jej parafian. Jednak prawdziwe jest także stwierdzenie, że częśćka mojej duszy pozostanie tutaj, ponieważ z braćmi pracującymi tutaj, z parafią św. Stanisława i jej członkami łączą mnie szczególne więzi. Czas i odległość spowoduje ich rozluźnienie, co jest czymś normalnym, ale nigdy nie przestaną istnieć. Wierzę, że przetrwają one nie tylko czas ziemskiego życia, ale także zostaną zachowane na wieczność. Jest możliwe, że z niektórymi nie spotkam się już ani w Cleveland, ani gdziekolwiek indziej, ale jestem przekonany, że jeśli zostaniemy uznani przez Pana Boga za godnych udziału w Jego wiecznym królestwie, spotkamy się tam, gdzie już nie będzie pożegnań ani rozstań.

Korzystając z tej okazji dziękuję Panu Bogu i moim przełożonym za możliwość pracy w sanktuarium św. Stanisława w Cleveland. Jestem wdzięczny za wiele okazji do wspólnej modlitwy, za okazję do poznania wielu ciekawych ludzi, których teraz mam przywilej nazywania przyjaciółmi; dziękuję Wam za akceptację i wiele godzin rozmów przy różnych, zarówno radosnych, jak i smutnych okazjach. Za wszystkie te chwile spędzone razem serdecznie dziękuję! Przy okazji proszę też o wybaczenie wszelkich moich braków i niedociągnięć.

12 października wylatuję do Polski. Zatrzymam się w Krakowie i tam dowiem się, co będę robił w najbliższym czasie. Polecam się pamięci modlitewnej i nawzajem obiecuję modlitwę za parafian św. Stanisława w Cleveland.

**ST. STANS HISTORICAL FACT by Rob Jagelewski.** There were a number of Polish neighborhoods in the City of Cleveland, some of which spun off from our neighborhood, "Warszawa." Just to our south was "Krakow" which was centered on East 71 Street across the ravine from "Warszawa" at Harvard and Ottawa Roads on the southeastern edge of Cleveland and around the Parish of Sacred Heart of Jesus. Another neighborhood with roots to St. Stanislaus was "Jackowo" which was northeast of "Warszawa" near Todd Street (East 65) and Francis Avenue. St. Hyacinth Parish was formed at this location in 1906. "Poznan" was a neighborhood near East 79 Street and Superior Avenue. This neighborhood was centered around St. Casimir Parish. Another Polish settlement was "Kantowo" which was located on the west bank of the Cuyahoga River in what is now Tremont. This settlement was centered around St. John Cantius Parish. There were also Polish settlements near Cleveland in Berea around St. Adalbert Parish and in Lakewood around St. Hedwig Parish.

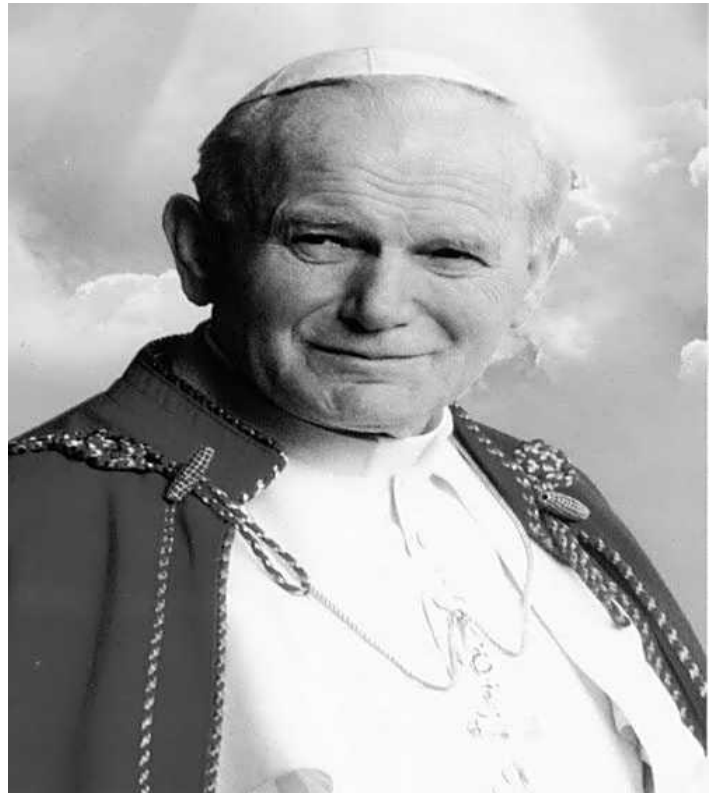


**YARN**
