

IMPORTANT DATES AND THINGS....



And you thought now that the festival was over you could just sit back and enjoy the heat? Well, forget that idea—We are gearing up for a lot of exciting things over the next month. Yes, it is never too early to let everyone know of events which are important to the life of a parishioner here at the Shrine Church of St. Stanislaus.

The month of October will wind down soon leading us into the month during which we commemorate the faithful departed. Have you turned in your list of names yet for our 'Book of the Dead?' we certainly have had more than our fair share of funerals this past year—the names of who you will hear read at the beginning of the

month. For those of you who are new to our parish, the custom is to read the names of the faithful departed before each Mass throughout the month of November.

Then, on a lighter note, we have the Father William Gulas Reverse Raffle, proceeds of which fund the scholarship fund in his name at our school. If you have never been to one of these, you are missing out! Everyone has fun and practically everyone leaves a winner of something or another. It's a great time to just get together and spend a relaxing evening with the parishioners and friends of our church and school, eat some great food, moderately drink some good beverages and just enjoy the evening!

Remember to read the ongoing information from the Stewardship Committee! Put on your thinking caps and your prayer shawls and give some serious thought to that to which you are being called. The opportunities for service at our parish are ENDLESS! You cannot think for a moment that you have nothing to contribute to the community and for the glory of God. God gave us much and now much is expected of each of us in return.

On Sunday, November 20th, we will have our annual Eucharistic Day. It's the day we set aside at the end of the liturgical year to reserve a little (or a lot) of time to sit down and speak with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. The gift He left us as nourishment as we fight our own battle against evil in our daily lives. During the clustering process a few years back we reported having approximately 1200 families registered at our parish. I'm not sure if all 1200 families know that, as members of this parish, they are welcome to come into the building now and then (if not regularly) to share their faith with the other 1119 or to even spend some time alone praying with the Blessed Sacrament. If you are reading this, have you already decided that you are coming to church the afternoon of Nov. 20th to spend time praying? Do you have other plans already in place? Bingo? Internet Café? Football game? Television? Shopping? Or will you choose to feed your soul? We don't plan this event for priests, altar servers, choir members and extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist! This is a PARISH event! Believe me—without your participation we are less than if you would be here with us. Why can't the church be as packed for religious activities as it is for concerts? Why can't we have a standing room only problem at the Eucharistic devotion? Is it not a quality event for our parishioners? If it is not important, then why don't we just close this place and sell it to a congregation who might need it to worship God. Oh well, if you haven't been convinced by now to see the point the evangelization and values of the church may have missed you long ago. In that case why not give Jesus another chance? He's here today and He'll be here to listen to you all afternoon on SUNDAY, NOVEMER 20th!!! SAVE THE DATE!

I wish there were a kinder way of addressing the 'lack of enthusiasm' and poor attendance at our parish events, liturgical or social. But, if you think you for one moment you are going to get a kinder reception from God you are fooling yourself. When you say the 'Lamb of God' for once and for all get the idea of a little fuzzy wuzzy cuddly lamb out of your mind!! The lamb you need to think of was one which was SLAUGHTERED, not cuddled. That lamb was SACRIFICED, not put on display at a petting zoo! That lamb had its blood poured out onto the altar. There's nothing pretty about it. Jesus, the lamb of God, was sacrificed to conquer evil, not to look pretty. To conquer evil, the only possible lamb that could be sacrificed to God was Jesus....now the lamb of God waits for you to honor Him.

Finally, the last Sunday of November ushers in Advent, the new English translation of the Mass, our commissioning of various liturgical ministers and the Advent devotional schedule (Godzinki and Advent Vespers). Wow...I hope you mark all these things and dates in your calendar...AND COME!

AS WE PREPARE FOR STEWARDSHIP/COMMITMENT SUNDAY...

Today's Gospel calls us: "Love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind." This command is not overwhelmingly impossible to achieve because we can know with certainty God never asks us for anything he has not already first given to us. Our gratitude for all God's gifts causes a need to share with others, those we love and cherish and those who need our help. Only in sharing of ourselves/our abundance do we truly love the Lord, our God.

We all love our parish, but need reminders to help shore up unmet needs by sharing personal gifts, not waiting for the same parishioners to do it all. We hate to see projects fail for lack of participants; don't like waiting to see if enough will volunteer for the festival, donate baskets, sell tickets; are disappointed when the weekly collection fails to meet budget; hope each Mass will have enough ushers, greeters or other ministers needed. The reality is until our dislike of unmet needs and gratitude for our gifts become one in us, needs will continue to be unmet.

Commitment Sunday is about examining gifts we've been sharing and gifts we are willing to increase. This week, take time to reflect and create a list: what are all the things you do for our parish? List the smallest and the largest: prayers said, Masses attended, responses to calls for help, times you volunteered, helped an elderly parishioner, baked for an event, said yes to Fr. Mike's request to be on a committee, stretched your dollar for the weekly collection, etc.

When you finish, create another list of what you could do more this year, things your health or job or family needs kept you from doing. Things like helping to clean in church, decorate for a holiday, do outside spring cleanup, donate extra plants, join in preparing for the festival, or sell more raffle tickets. Maybe you could invite someone still searching for a permanent parish to come with you and consider us! What other gifts of yourself, time and talents might you share?

Coming next week: more about the Stewardship stance of gratitude and how it leads to deeper love and sharing of time, talents and treasure that draw us all closer to God and each other...

Przygotowując się do Niedzieli Posługi i Zaangażowania

Dzisiejsza Ewangelia nawołuje: "Miłuja Pana Boga swego z całego swego serca, całej swej duszy i całym umysłem swoim." To przykazanie nie jest niemozliwe do osiągniecia ponieważ wiemy, że z pewnością Bóg nigdy nie chce od nas czegoś, czego wcześniej nam nie dał. Nasza wdzięczność za wszystkie Boże dary powoduje potrzebę dzielenia się nimi z innymi, których miłujemy, kochamy i którzy potrzebują naszej pomocy. Tylko poprzez dzielenie się sobą i swymi zasobami, kochamy prawdziwie Pana, naszego Boga.

Wszyscy jesteśmy przywiązani do naszej parafii, ale potrzebujemy przypomnienia aby pomagać w dotarciu do niespełnionych potrzeb poprzez dzielenie się naszymi osobistymi darami, a nie przez czekanie, aż ciągle ci sami parafianie zrobią to za nas. Nie znosimy projektów, które się nie udają z powodu braku uczestników; nie lubimy niepewności czy wystarczająco dużo wolontariuszy pomoże w festiwalu, podaruje kosze obfitości, sprzeda losy; jesteśmy rozczarowani, gdy cotygodniowa colekta nie dorównuje planowanemu budżetowi; mamy nadzieję, że na każdej Mszy będzie wystarczająco dużo osób do posługi. W rzeczywistości, dopóki będziemy nie lubić niespełnionych potrzeb i pałać wdzięcznością za nasze talenty równocześnie, dopóty te potrzeby pozostaną niespełnione.

Niedziela Zaangażowania to sprawdzian jakimi uzdolnieniami dzielimy się i jakie talenty chcemy rozwijać. W tym tygodniu powinniśmy znaleźć czas na refleksję i zrobienie listy rzeczy, które możemy zrobić dla naszej parafii. Wyszczególnij te najmniejsze i największe rzeczy: zmówienie modlitwy, udział we Mszy, odpowiedź na prośbę o pomoc, czas pracy wolontariackiej, pomoc starszym parafianom, wypieki na uroczystości, pozytywna odpowiedź Ojcu Michałowi na prośbę o pracę w określonym komitecie, większa ofiara na niedzielną tacę, itp.

Po skończeniu tej listy, przygotuj następną z propozycją co więcej możesz zrobić w tym roku, z rzeczami, które trudno Ci wykonać z powodu stanu zdrowia, lub twojej pracy lub potrzeb rodziny. Chodzi o takie rzeczy, jak pomoc w sprzątaniu kościoła, udekorowaniu go na święta, wiosenne porządki wokół kościoła, podarowanie zbędnych sadzonek, praca w przygotowaniu do festiwalu lub sprzedaż większej ilości losów. Może mógłbyś zaprosić do nas kogoś, kto ciągle szuka swojej stałej parafii, aby przyszedł z Tobą i być może pozostał z nami? Jakimi innymi uzdolnieniami, talentami i czasem mógłbyś się podzielić?

W następnym tygodniu: więcej o duszpasterskim znaczeniu wdzięczności i w jaki sposób prowadzi ona do głębszego umiłowania oraz dzielenia się czasem, zdolnościami i skarbami, które przyciągają nas wszystkich do Boga i do swych bliźnich.

ST. STANS HISTORICAL FACT by Rob Jagelewski. When our Parish was formed in 1873, our parishioners worshiped at St. Mary's On The Flats or Our Lady of the Lakes which was located in the Flats at the corner of Columbus and Girard Streets. The wood frame structure was used by many of Cleveland's various ethnic groups for worship services until they built their own church. Our parishioners used St. Mary's from 1873–1879 while they were ministered to by Father Victor Zareczny from St. Adalbert in Berea. In 1879 the care of our Parishioners was transferred to Father Wolfgang Janietz OFM. He lived at St. Joseph's Friary on Woodland Avenue and our parishioners attended worship services at that location until they built their own two story wood church in 1881. St. Joseph's Church was located near where Cuyahoga Community College's Metro Campus currently sits.




