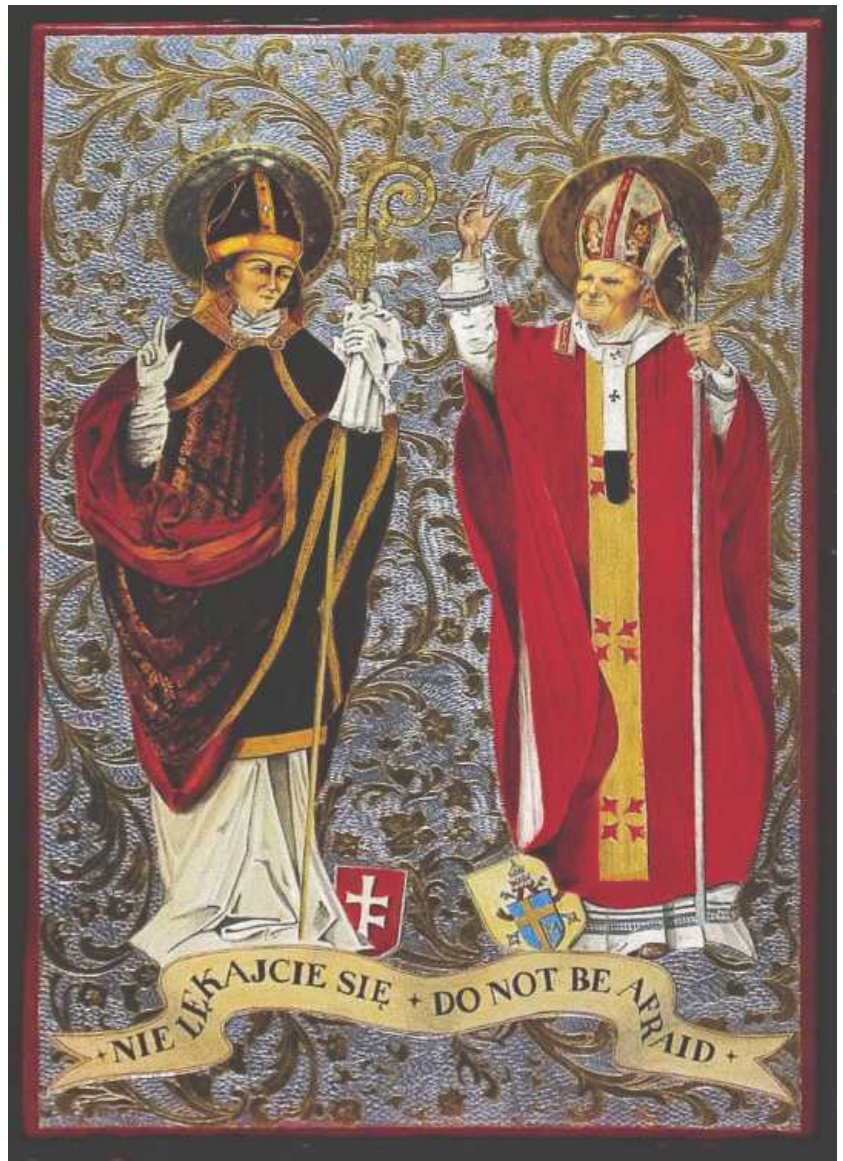

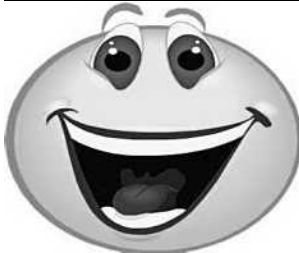

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION....EUCCHARISTIC ACTION



Less than a year before his death Blessed John Paul II issued an Apostolic Letter, '*Mane nobiscum Domine*', in which he invited the world to join in celebrating the year 2005 as the year of the Eucharist. That wish was put into action and, although he was unable to live through the entire year, his words prepared the groundwork for this event as well as an inspiration to his successor, Benedict XVI, to pick up where he had left off, resulting in his consequent encyclical '*Caritas in veritate*'.

The following quote from John Paul's letter might provide some food for thought during next Sunday's adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. There is a hope that his words will open up avenues which might have become cluttered by our diminished states of grace over our lifetimes. John Paul's intention was to point out how impossible it would be for someone to spend time in adoration of the

Eucharist, yet remain totally lacking in interest to 'act' in the world by taking care of the needy or the sick, the hungry or the forgotten. To put it bluntly, just kneeling in front of the Blessed Sacrament without the subsequent actions is more or less akin to worshiping a golden calf. In fact, as a result of John Paul's words on this subject, many churches have requested people who come for an hour of adoration to also donate an hour of time to the needy. The Eucharist is not a treasure which can be hidden and kept to oneself. One must allow it to live within and promote life in a way unlike any other gift. Here are some of Blessed John Paul's words:

"At the service of the least

28. *There is one other point which I would like to emphasize, since it significantly affects the authenticity of our communal sharing in the Eucharist. It is the impulse which the Eucharist gives to the community for a **practical commitment to building a more just and fraternal society**. In the Eucharist our God has shown love in the extreme, overturning all those criteria of power which too often govern human relations and radically affirming the criterion of service: " **If anyone would be first, he must be last of all and servant of all**" (Mc 9:35). It is not by chance that the gospel of John contains no account of the institution of the Eucharist but instead relates the 'washing of the feet' (cf. Jn 13:1-20): by bending down to wash the feet of his disciples, Jesus explains the meaning of the Eucharist unequivocally. St. Paul vigorously reaffirms the impropriety of a Eucharistic celebration lacking charity expressed by practical sharing with the poor (cf. 1 Cor 11:17-22, 27-34).*

*Can we not make this Year of the Eucharist (2005) an occasion for diocesan and parish communities to commit themselves in a particular way to responding with fraternal solicitude to one of the various forms of poverty present in the world? I think, for example, of the tragedy of hunger which plagues hundreds of millions of human beings, the diseases which afflict developing countries, the loneliness of the elderly, the hardships faced by the unemployed, the struggles of immigrants. These are evils which are present—albeit to a different degree—even in areas of immense wealth. We can not delude ourselves: by our mutual love and, in particular, by our concern for those in need we will be recognized as true followers of Christ (cf. Jn 13:35; Mt 25:31-46). **This will be the criterion by which the authenticity of our Eucharistic celebrations is judged.***

Some parishioners will come and spend time in silence with the Blessed Sacrament next weekend. Others will only attend the Sunday liturgy. Will the world outside these doors be any different after our meetings with Christ the King? Will anyone make a difference to even one person in need afterwards? We can only hope Jesus has not turned into a golden calf.

A LETTER FROM ONE OF OUR PARISHIONERS...

Fr. Michael and David, I always set a routine at the beginning of each year. This year my "ritual" is to read through Butler's Lives of the Saints and a book of meditations. Before going to bed, I read a selection from each. This year my meditation book is Lift Up Your Hearts Daily Meditations by Pope John Paul II Servant Publications Ann Arbor, Michigan, 1995 This was the reading for Saturday, November 5 Brokenness: Path to Life Modern man is often disoriented and lost, in search of genuine fellowship. Many times his social and family life is either too superficial or shattered by brokenness. His work life is many times dehumanizing. He longs for an experience of genuine encounter with another human being, for the warmth of true fellowship. Well! Is this not precisely the vocation of a parish? Are we not called to be a warm, brotherly family together? (CT,67). Are we not brethren united together in the household of God through our common life (LG, 28)? Your parish is not mainly a structure, a geographical area, or a building. The parish is first and foremost a community of the faithful. That is the definition given by the new Code of Canon Law (can.515, 1). This is the task of a parish today: to be a community, to rediscover its identity as a Christian means to believe and to live one's faith together with others. For we are all members of the body of Christ. But how does the birth of a community take place? A community is not a reality that can be easily realized. Community essentially means communion or fellowship. For fellowship to grow the priest's role is not enough, even though he plays an essential role as a representative of the bishop. The commitment of all parishioners is needed. Each of their contributions is vital. The Second Vatican Council has underscored the importance of community and the vital role of the laity (LG, 32-33; AA, 2-3). Considering the Parish councils are working through the stewardship initiative, I thought this reading particularly appropriate. With our connection with our Beloved John Paul, is he not speaking directly to us?? Maybe this could be of some use to the Stewardship Committee or bulletin worthy.

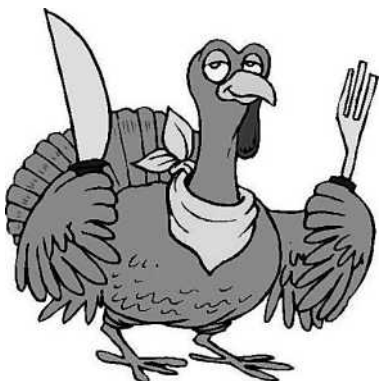

after the holidays. Please come and bid him farewell and share in a great meal together for one last time!

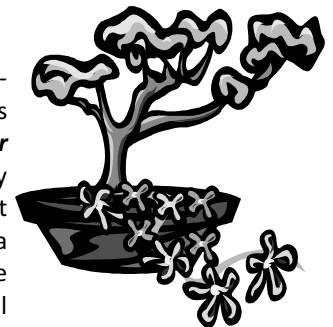

ST. STANS HISTORICAL FACT by Rob Jagelewski.

In the early 1900's our neighborhood, "Warszawa" remained Cleveland's largest Polish community. Irish and Welsh communities (Holy Name Parish) blocked the expansion of "Warszawa" to the southeast. Polish settlement continued beyond and surrounded them by the mid- 1910's. This development was made easier by the introduction of new streetcar lines, which allowed workers to live farther away from their jobs. In 1904 the population of "Warszawa" was 15,000 individuals. Between 1920 and 1940 Poles were Cleveland's most numerous ethnic group. Suburban Polish communities also developed southeast of the city limits in Newburgh Heights and Garfield Heights.
