

VESPERS



Lenten devotions at our parish always seem to have a slow start. The weather often plays a part in determining the crowds or lack of. Friday's Polish Stations had about 80 people. English Stations had about ten. Sunday's *Gorzkie żale* had about 30 people; Vespers about ten. I'm sure that the thousand plus parishioners who choose to stay home for those different services had really good reasons. Our doors will remain opened even if for the few who want to come and thank God. After all, He wouldn't

destroy Sodom and Gomorrah if Abraham mustered up a small crowd of ten so I take it we might be safe.

For those of you who have never attended a Vesper service, the following excerpt from the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) web site provides the following summary of this prayer.

"Vespers. also called Evening Prayer, is part of the Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office. In the Liturgy of the Hours, the Church fulfills Jesus' command to "pray always" (Luke 18.1, see also 1 Thessalonians 5:17). Through this prayer, the people of God sanctify the day by continual praise of God and prayers of intercession for the needs of the world.

The Liturgy of the Hours includes several specified times of prayer. The most important times, called the "hinge hours," are Morning Prayer (which takes place upon rising) and Evening Prayer (which takes place as dusk begins to fall). The other Hours are the Office of Readings (a service with a Biblical reading and a reading from the Fathers of Church writers or a reading related to a saint which may take place at any time of the day), a Daytime Prayer (which may take place at Midmorning, Midday, or Midafternoon), and Night Prayer (said before going to sleep).

Bishops, priests, deacons, and many men and women in consecrated life pray the Liturgy of the Hours each day. Their work is organized around this prayer, keeping God always at the center of their days. Lay people are encouraged to pray the Liturgy of the Hours as well, especially Morning and evening Prayer.

Evening Prayer gives thanks for the day just past and makes an evening sacrifice of praise to God (see Psalm 141:1)."

The format for this prayer service is quite simple involving psalms, a scriptural reading, petitions, and a seasonal hymn. A short homily follows the scripture reading. All in all it involves less than a half hour of your valuable time given to you by God. Some people like to come before hand for quiet private prayer or even a little friendly visiting. It is a wonderful way of winding down one's day in preparation for another hectic week. Above anything else it is a sacred time to listen to god speak and to give him thanks and praise for all He has done in your life.

Come join our team of ten this Sunday at 6 pm.... and let's show Sodom we can one up Abraham.

EVANGELIZATION NEWS

The Evangelization Committee of St. Stanislaus is inviting members of St. Stan's to attend an Adult Catholic Education (A.C.E.) Faith Formation program "Centering Prayer: Responding to the Call of the Spirit" on Friday March 1 from 7-9 pm at St. Basil the Great Church 8700 Brecksville Rd, Brecksville, OH. There is no cost for this program.

Although no advance reservation is necessary, we would like to be aware of how many parishioners from St. Stan's are interested in attending. So please call Ralph Trepal at 216-441-1479 if you are planning to attend. We may even want to attend as a group to get to know each other.

This program will be lead by Susan Koomis. Centering Prayer is a method of silent prayer in which we experience God's presence within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself. This form of prayer is drawn from the ancient practices of the Christian contemplative heritage, and described in the writings of Christian mystics such as John Cassian, Teresa of Avila, John of the Cross, and Therese of Lisieux. Three Trappist monks at St. Joseph's Abbey looked to these ancient sources to develop a simple method of silent prayer for contemporary people. The prayer came to be known as Centering Prayer, in reference to Thomas Merton's description of contemplative prayer as prayer that is "centered entirely on the presence of God." The organization Contemplative Outreach was formed in 1983 to support the growing interest in the practice of Centering Prayer.

Susan Koomis is Director of Chapter Resource & Communication Services which serve the leadership of Contemplative Outreach by offering formation programs, mentoring, and providing on-site visitations to Contemplative Outreach Chapters throughout the country. She is a Pastoral Minister and spiritual director, and is highly sought after as a speaker throughout the U.S. and Canada.
