What's a Saint? Pope Francis the other day at World Youth Day in Rio de Janeiro gives an answer:

"We need saints without cassocks, without veils - we need saints with jeans and tennis shoes. We need saints that go to the movies that listen to music, that hang out with their friends. We need saints that place God in first place ahead of succeeding in any career. We need saints that look for time to pray every day and who know how to be in love with purity, chastity and all good things. We need saints - saints for the 21st century with a spirituality appropriate to our new time. We need saints that have a commitment to helping the poor and to make the needed social change. We need saints to live

in the world, to sanctify the world and to not be afraid of living in the world by their presence in it. We need saints that drink Coca-Cola, that eat hot dogs, that surf the internet and that listen to their iPods. We need saints that love the Eucharist, that are not afraid or embarrassed to eat a pizza or drink a beer with their friends. We need saints who love the movies, dance, sports, theater. We need saints that are open sociable normal happy companions. We need saints who are in this world and who know how to enjoy the best in this world without being callous or mundane. We need saints."

Does any of this strike a chord with you? Can you think of anyone who might qualify for this honor? When you sing the Communion processional hymn do those words hit home? Do you really want Jesus to come to you? You are not afraid of what might happen if He did? You are ready to live differently? Really? Do you think you could become a saint?

Do you honestly want Jesus to live in you? How long can you keep him alive with your heart? Will your body reject Him as a foreign substance? Would He prefer to jump out of your mouth and land in a pile of dirt instead?

Will the first words you speak after receiving the Eucharist be His words? Will those words be kind or will they be mean? Will those words be filled with hate or envy? Will they be mocking words or words of compliments and care?

What will your eyes see? Will they see Jesus in the very next person you see in church, the first person you see in the parking lot, the first person you see at the Red Chimney, the first person you see near your home? Or will they see something else?

Are your hands ready to touch like Jesus would touch, ready to comfort, to soothe, to care? Will they slap Jesus right in the face like the soldiers did when they mocked Him?

Will the 'bread of life' bring you to life and give you the breath of the Spirit of God?

If you partake in the Eucharist, will you consciously love others as representatives of Christ? Will you act as His vessel, his ambassador? Will your mouth be His, your eyes, His, your hands, His?

This church would be full of saints if we all actually let Jesus loose into our lives. Yes, it would mess things up drastically (a phrase Pope Francis used in Rio last week), it would confront the status quo with which has enslaved us. It would unleash a power beyond that of any nuclear bomb. Don't you believe that? Don't you think Jesus wants this of you? Trying to be a saint means trying to be a friend of God, an enemy of evil, hatred, indifference and greed. The choice is really black and white....either you want to be a saint or you don't. Either you believe this stuff or you don't.

ŚWIĘTO WNIĘBOWZIĘCIA NMP

W następnym tygodniu Kościół katolicki obchodzi uroczystość Wniebowzięcia NMP. Przykazanie kościelne zobowiązuje nas do udziału we Mszy św. w tym dniu. Liturgicznie jest to uroczysta celebrowanie jedynej w swoim rodzaju przywileju Maryi, Bożej Matki, polegającego na tym, że z duszą i ciałem została wzięta do nieba. Mamy wiele możliwości, aby uczestniczyć we Mszy św., włączając w to Mszę św. w wigilię uroczystości, we środę 14 sierpnia: po południu o godz. 5:30 po polsku i o 7:00 po angielsku z błogosławieństwem ziół ok. 6:30, czyli bezpośrednio po Mszy św. po polsku. W czasie tego nabożeństwa, które zostanie odprawione w 'wieczerniku zaślęnięcia NMP' będzie miało miejsce sypanie płatków różanych na statuetkę Matki Bożej. 15 sierpnia Msze św. zostaną odprawione w następującym porządku: rano: 7:00 i 8:30 oraz wieczorem o 7:00. Wieczorna Msza będzie jednocześnie Mszą św. o kanonizację bł. Jana Pawła II.

WOLNE INTENCJE MSZALNE W DNI POWSZEDNIE

Wspaniałą tradycją w Kościele katolickim jest pamięć o tych, których kochamy - zarówno żyjących jak i zmarłych - w szczególny sposób podczas Mszy św. Intencja mszalna wymieniona w niniejszym biuletynie jest szczególną intencją, w której modli się celebrans w czasie danej Mszy św. Pragniemy poinformować, że jest wiele nie zarezerwowanych Mszy św. w dni powszednie w najbliższych miesiącach .

Bogactwo przed Bogiem

Każdy człowiek chciałby wieść spokojne życie; chciałby, żeby niczego mu nie brakowało, a poprzez swoją pracę mógł zapewnić sobie dostatek. Rodzice starają się zapewnić dobrobyt swoim dzieciom, dać dobry start w dorosłe, samodzielne życie.

Rodzice starają się zapewnić dobrobyt swoim dzieciom, dać dobry start w dorosłe, samodzielne życie. Czasami możemy być świadkami sytuacji podobnej do tej z przypowieści z dzisiejszej ewangelii. Ktoś szybko się wzbogacił, pieniądze dobrze zainwestowane przyniosły natychmiastowy i duży zysk. Ktoś osiągnął pewien poziom życiowy, odłożył środki materialne na dalsze, spokojne życie. Gdy wszystko wydaje się jak w bajce, Bóg żąda duszy, człowiek umiera. Komu przypadnie to, co zgromadził? Chrystus pragnie pokazać nam, że dobra materialne nie zabezpieczą nas przed śmiercią. Mogą one służyć do zabezpieczenia potrzeb egzystencjalnych, ale w przypadku nieuleczalnej choroby, nieszczęścia lub śmierci – są marnościami. I nie ma z nich pożytku. Człowiek może korzystać z owoców swojej pracy. Za dobrze wykonaną pracę otrzymuje zapłatę, wynagrodzenie, może je przeznaczyć na bezpieczne życie, na podniesienie komfortu życia. Chrystus nie zabrania bogacenia się, posiadania. Przestrzega jednak, aby człowiek umiał zachować bezpieczny dystans wobec dóbr materialnych. Świat, który nas otacza, nigdy nie może przesłonić Boga ani Jego Królestwa. Chrystus przestrzega, że los bogacza z przypowieści spotka każdego, kto skarby gromadzi dla siebie, a nie jest bogaty przed Bogiem. Popatrzmy na lustro. Wcześniej była to zwykła szyba, przez którą można było oglądać wszystko, co jest wokół nas. Można było dostrzec każdego człowieka, który przechodził obok nas. Wystarczyła cienka warstwa srebra, abyśmy dostrzegali tylko siebie. Pieniądze są potrzebne do życia, do funkcjonowania w społeczeństwie. Ale każdy z nas musi uważać, aby ta mała warstwa srebra nie przesłoniła nam całego świata, aby warstwa srebra nie przesłoniła drugiego człowieka.

Na czym polega to bogactwo względem Boga? Chrystus uczy: „Sprawcie sobie trzosi, które nie niszczej, skarb niewyczerpany w niebie, gdzie złodziej się nie dostaje ani mól nie niszczy”. Nasze życie na ziemi winno być związane z niebem. Żyjąc tutaj, mamy gromadzić bogactwa przed Bogiem. Każdy nasz czyn wyływający z wiary, każde wypełnienie przykazania miłości Boga i bliźniego – to nasze bogactwo przed Bogiem. Bogactwo, pieniądze, które posiadamy, które udało nam się zgromadzić, z jednej strony mogą być powodem naszego odrzucenia Boga. A z drugiej strony, gdy umiejętnie nimi zarządzamy, gdy dostrzegamy, jak wiele dobra możemy dzięki nim uczynić, mogą być skarbem, przez który będziemy bogaci przed Bogiem. To gromadzenie skarbu, który nie zostanie zniszczony, który będzie trwał wiecznie. A temu, kto go gromadzi, zapewni wieczność w królestwie Boga w niebie.
