Voters in all of Cuyahoga County's municipalities will be included in the November 5th General Election. Municipal, Judicial, and School Board candidates are on the ballot as well as County and local issues.

To avoid lines on Election Day, and to allow extra time to study the ballot, all registered voters may Vote by Mail. Vote by Mail ballot applications are available at the Board of Elections website: www.443VOTE.com, by calling the Board of Elections at 216-443-VOTE, and at all public libraries.

It is important for all voters to be prepared to cast their ballots. The voter registration deadline is October 7th. Voters who have moved or changed their name since they last voted need to complete and return a new Voter Registration Card.

ROOTED IN FAITH-FORWARD IN HOPE

Thanks to the overwhelming generosity of Catholics across the diocese, the ROOTED IN FAITH campaign has already distributed over \$46 million of the \$170 million raised. All parishes that participated have already received a portion of their parish share and are putting those funds to work in capital improvements, social outreach, education and debt reduction.

The funds distributed are making a difference. In the Spring 68 schools received funds, parishes had some facilities renovated and this year 72 men are discerning their vocation at St. Mary's Seminary.

As you know, 30 percent of the funds collected up to our goal return to our parish for use in local projects. To date we have received \$16,828.00. The first quarter of the school year is finished. Student-led conferences are being conducted this week. And how did our children do?

Seventy-one of our students received honors for the first quarter. Thirty-five of them were awarded Academic Excellence (GPA of 3.75 and above). Thirty-six of them received Academic Achievement (GPA of 3.50 - 3.74). This is the highest total in the past seven years. We are very proud of their accomplishments.

Yet just as we say about standardized tests scores, it is not the numbers that mean as much to us as the student progress. How exciting it is to celebrate the SNAP words being learned! How wonderful it is to walk into a classroom and be greeted with *Dominus Tecum!* And let's not forget the progression from pre-writes to final draft essays. Or the counting and sorting of colors and objects. All of these things are reasons for us to celebrate the great learning that occurs every day within our halls.

We are proud of our 71 students who received honors. We are just as proud of the whole student population as they strive every day to be students of *Goodness, Discipline, and Knowledge*.

To wiedzą tylko ci, którzy mają poważny problem ze zdrowiem. W takim momencie człowiek uczyni się wszystko, aby zwrócić na siebie uwagę.

Pobłogosław!

W czasie procesji Bożego Ciała, tuż przed podejściem do IV ołtarza, wszyscy wierni zauważyli duży napis pod otwartym oknem: „Pobłogosław, Jezus drogi!”, a z otwartego okna wyglądała młoda kobieta i dzieckiem na ręku. Dziecko, jak to dziecko, pomachało rączką przechodzącym. I wtedy ksiądz zatrzymał się, skierował monstrancję w kierunku mamy i córki i... pobłogosławił im. Część wiernych patrzyła na osoby w oknie, część na monstrancję. Zrobiła się taka chwila ciszy, czasami tak jest w liturgii, że kończy się pieśń, albo rozważanie i wtem organista zaintonował: – „Pobłogosław, Jezu drogi, tym co serca Twe kochają, niechaj skarb Twój cenny drogi, na wiek wieków posiadają”. Nie śpiewy Ewangelii, nie cztery krótkie rozważania o Eucharystii, nie sypanie kwiatków przez dziewczynki, nawet nie dzwonki i kadzidło ministrantów, ale właśnie chwila, moment, zatrzymanie się przed tym oknem i błogosławieństwo – to było najpiękniejsze w całej procesji.

Ulituj się!

Bartymeusz używa więc swego głosu i głośno woła: – „Jezusie, Synu Dawida, ulituj się nade mną”. Ten silny głos uratował go. Jezus przywrócił mu wzrok. Uzdrawiony Bartymeusz poszedł za Mistrzem.

Podziel się!

Opis Ewangelii jest tak prosty, tak zrozumiały i tak przekonujący, że mamy ochotę podzielić się tym wszystkim, co jest w naszym sercu. Nie tylko tym, co jest bolesne, trudne, niezrozumiałe, ale także tym, co sprawia, że radość rozpięra nasze wnętrze. Szukamy różnych sposobów na wyrażenie tego wszystkiego, co jest w naszej głębi, co dotyczy relacji z Bogiem, z bliźnim, z przyrodą, z prawdą, dobrem, pięknem. Jedni piszą wiersze, ale to jest akurat bardzo trudna forma wyrażania swoich uczuć. Ponadto trzeba mieć coś, co się nazywa natchnieniem. Są tacy, którzy piszą swoje wspomnienia, listy, dzwonią do przyjaciół, posyłają maile, SMS-y. Ale najczęściej zapraszamy do siebie na kawkę, herbatkę, na ciastko bliskich naszemu wnętrzu. I wówczas, w atmosferze pokoju i ciszy rozmawiamy o wszystkim, czym pragniemy się podzielić.

Radujcie się!

Jeremiasz zachęca nas do tego, abyśmy zawołali radośnie na cześć Jakuba. Chodzi o to, aby podzielić się optymizmem wiary. Jak to uczynić, skoro msza św. ma swoją określoną formę, swoje kanony, wśród których nie ma miejsca na spontaniczne okazywanie radości. Czasami zdarza się, że wierni wyrażają swoje uczucia poprzez aplauz, ale... generalnie nie jest to mile widziane. No bo jeżeli będziemy klaskać po kazaniu dla dzieci, to dlaczego nie zaklaskać po kazaniu dla dorosłych?

W roku 1979 w czasie procesji pod Wawelem przemawiał ksiądz kardynał Stefan Wyszyński. Gdy wypowiedział słowa, które dotykały istoty wolności, wtedy wierni zaczęli klaskać na znak, że zgadzają się z kardynałem, że w pełni podzielają jego myślenie. A on głosem spokojnym, zdecydowanym i wyważonym powiedział: – Dzieci, nie klaszczcie!

Radujemy się przeto razem z Jeremiaszem, psalmistą, Bartymeuszem, z krewnymi, przyjaciółmi – radujemy się, że Pan jest wśród nas.
