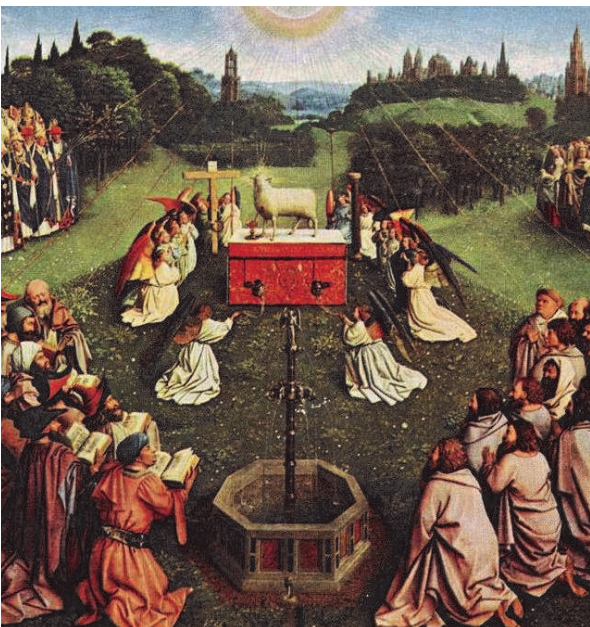

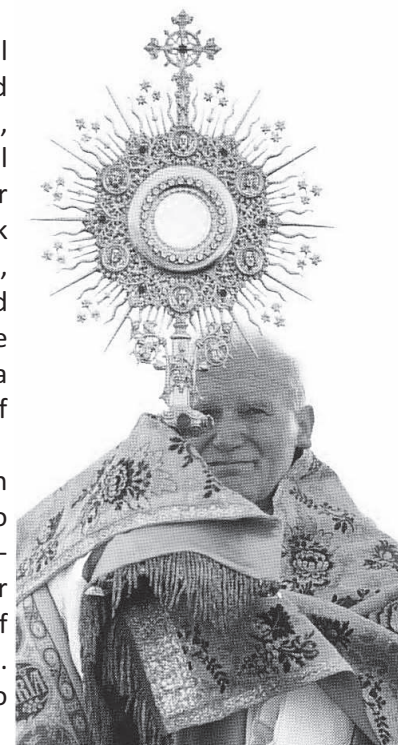
WHO ELSE IS IN THE PROCESSION?????

NEXT SUNDAY, at 4:30 PM, our parish's annual Eucharistic Day procession will commence once again! The procession will include the Lamb of God, angels and saints, (yes, that includes St. John Paul and St. Stanislaus, Mary, the Mother of God, St. Michael and St. Gabriel, St. Faustina and St. Maximillian and all the rest). It will also include many of the other poor souls who have left this planet but await their time to worship the lamb in heaven for eternity. Come to the procession and walk alongside your busia and dziadzia, your deceased uncles and aunts, your parents, your old neighbors and kumoszki! Don't you believe that? If you are a baptized Christian you MUST! We together make up the Church...the Church Militant, the Church Suffering and the Church Triumphant! 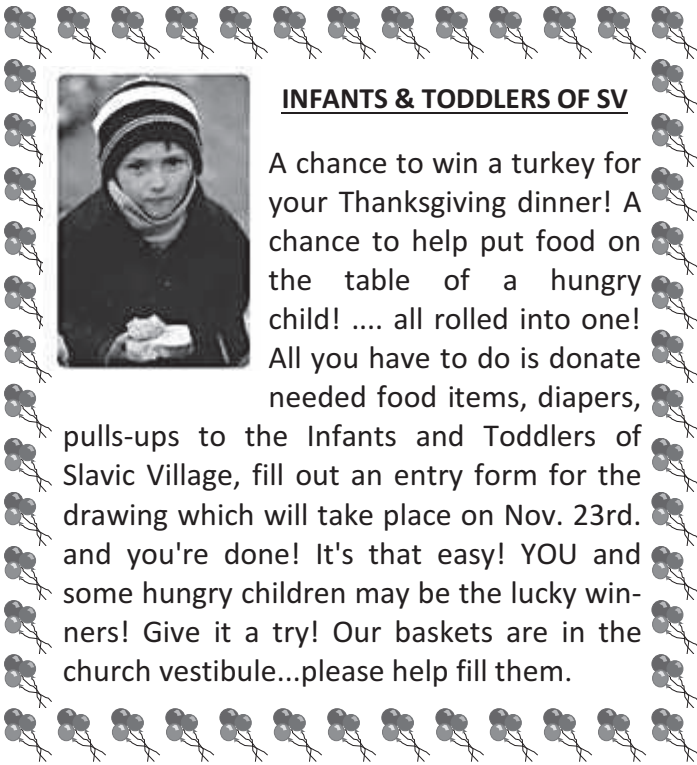

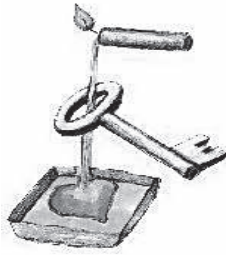

'Pagan Christians' go to church, but don't put God first, pope says

VATICAN CITY (CNS) -- People who go to church on Sundays, but spend the rest of the week cultivating their attachment to money, power and pride are "pagan Christians," Pope Francis said.

When St. Paul wrote his Letter to the Philippians, the Christian community was composed of two groups, real Christians and those who were "enemies of the cross of Christ," the pope said Nov. 7 during his homily at Mass in the Domus Sanctae Marthae where he lives.

"Both groups were in the church together, they went to Sunday Mass, praised the Lord and called themselves Christians," he said, according to Vatican Radio. But some of them were "worldly Christians, Christians in name only, with two or three Christian characteristics, but nothing more. Pagan Christians!"

Today, the pope said, "there are many of these. And we, too, must be careful not to slip" into being Christians in name only. Being half-hearted Christians, "accustomed to mediocrity" is a danger for all, he said.

In the day's first reading, Philippians 3:17-4:1, St. Paul speaks of true Christians having their "citizenship" in heaven, the pope said, while "pagan Christians" are full citizens of the world.

The way for someone to check their spiritual nationality, he said, is to ask some questions: "Do I like to brag? Do I like money? Do I like pride?"

Or, he said, "Do you try to love God and serve others? If you are meek, if you are humble, if you are a servant of others, then you are on the right path. Your citizenship papers are in order and they are from heaven!"

Na wejście: Kiedy ranne wstają zorze....

Maria Simma o kontaktach z duszami czyścicowymi - cz. I

5 lutego 1915 r. w małym austriackim miasteczku Sonntag, w katolickiej rodzinie, urodziła się Maria Simma. Gdy miała 25 lat otrzymała od Pana Boga specjalny charyzmat spotkań z duszami czyścicowymi. Pierwsze spotkanie z duszą czyścicową miało miejsce w 1940 r. Około czwartej nad ranem w sypialni przebudziły ją kroki kogoś obcego. Na pytanie jak tu wszedł i czego szuka, nie otrzymała żadnej odpowiedzi. Maria wstała więc z łóżka i próbowała go złapać, ale chwyciła tylko powietrze. Była bardzo zdziwiona, ponieważ widziała postać, ale nie mogła jej dotknąć. Rano opowiedziała wszystko swojemu spowiednikowi, który jej poradził, żeby w takich sytuacjach zawsze stawiała pytanie, po co przychodzi i czego sobie życzy. Następnego nocy przyszedł ten sam zmarły. Zapytany przez Marię odpowiedział, że bardzo prosi, aby odprawiono za niego trzy Msze św. Od tego czasu dusze czyścicowe zaczęły regularnie ją odwiedzać prosząc szczególnie o Msze św., a także modlitwę różańcową, drogę krzyżową. Do 1953 r. odwiedzały ją tylko 2 lub 3 dusze w ciągu roku i to najczęściej w listopadzie. Od 1954 r. te wizyty odbywały się już każdej nocy. Co noc przychodziła jedna dusza, ale zawsze inna. Od 2 listopada 1953 r. Maria Simma zaczyna pomagać duszom czyścicowym nie tylko przez modlitwę, ale również przez cierpienia ofiarowane w ich intencji. Cierpienia te odpowiadały grzechom, za które dusze czyścicowe miały odpokutować.

Maria mówiła, że **czyścic jest zarówno miejscem jak i stanem, w jakim znajdują się dusze, które muszą odpokutować za popełnione grzechy, aby oczyszczać się i dojrzewać do miłości w niebie. Największym ich cierpieniem jest oczekiwanie na zjednoczenie się z Bogiem.** Maria stwierdziła, że są trzy najważniejsze poziomy czyścica, które tak bardzo różnią się między sobą, jak nasze choroby w czasie ziemskiego życia. Od zwykłego przeziębienia do ogarniających całe ciało wielkich cierpień. Pomiędzy tymi trzema najważniejszymi poziomami w czyścicu, każda dusza ma swój własny poziom, i przechodzi niepowtarzalny, indywidualny proces oczyszczania i dojrzewania do miłości.

Maria dowiedziała się, od odwiedzających ją dusz czyścicowych, że chociaż ich **ból oczyszczenia jest przerażający, to jednak pewność pójścia do nieba przewyższa ogrom ich cierpienia.** Cierpienie dusz czyścicowych jest więc przemieszane z **radością pewności zbawienia**, dlatego żadna dusza czyścicowa nie chce już wrócić do życia ziemskiego. Maria podkreślała, że **Pan Bóg nie skazuje dusz na pobyt w czyścicu.** Kiedy w chwili śmierci człowiek zobaczy całą prawdę o sobie, wtedy spontanicznie rodzi się w nim pragnienie konieczności oczyszczenia i odpokutowania za popełnione grzechy. Wtedy ze wszystkich sił pragnie cierpieć w czyścicu, aby dojrzewać do miłości w niebie. I dlatego **sami zmarli, podczas sądu po śmierci, akceptują taki „rodzaj” czyścica.**

W czyścicu nikt się nie niecierpliwi, nie buntuje, lecz każdy z wielką pokorą znosi cierpienia, które są konsekwencją jego grzechów. Maria mówi, że **cierpienia w czyścicu są nieporównywalnie większe aniżeli na ziemi.** Maria Simma twierdzi, że **dusze czyścicowe najczęściej gromadzą się wokół ołtarzy i w miejscach gdzie zmarli.** Przychodzą do niej nie z czyścica lecz z czyścicem. **Czas pobytu w czyścicu zależy od ilości i ciężaru popełnionych grzechów.** Niektóre dusze przebywają bardzo krótko, inne kilkanaście lub kilkadziesiąt lat, ale są takie, które muszą pokutować aż do dnia Sądu Ostatecznego. Bardzo żałują wszystkich zmarnowanych okazji do czynienia dobra dla innych ludzi i Boga. Po śmierci nie są w stanie już nic dobrego uczynić, dlatego tak bardzo oczekują naszej pomocy.
