AND I won't be able to promise you a free ticket through the pearly gates because you helped feed the hungry. NOR can I guarantee you will become a saint, something you alone can accomplish. While all those things are truly noble, truly worthy of your time and energy, I can only offer something very different...

I can offer you a song...perhaps a Hallelujah....a song that will give you just a little taste of heaven while we are still here on earth. I can offer you some inspiration...a psalm prayer rising like burning incense....or a TE DEUM to help lead the Lamb of God around in procession through our church or neighborhood. I can offer you some comfort in music as you say 'until we meet again' to a loved one. I can do these things because of the gift God has graciously given to me as I work, create and pray with you here via the music ministry.

My appeal to help keep our organ 'alive and kicking' is not meant for selfish reasons. When I accepted the position here back in 1998 Fr. William asked that part of my job be as steward of our musical instruments. I am no expert, but, I do try my best at holding things together. I do know that thanks to my efforts with the Kulas Foundation we were granted a fabulous Steinway grand piano. I also know it was really kind of that same Foundation to give us some start up money for the restoration of the pipe organ console. Now....the 'piece de resistance' awaits our united efforts at generosity and sacrifice, somehow or another, to finish the restoration of the great pipe organ so that it will assist in the worship of God who has been so generous to us over all the days of our lives. The Geis family has offered us a challenge....now it's up to us to match that amount. We are still short \$95,000.....alone, a difficult task.... Together, one that is not impossible.

Generous? Yep. Remember the poem that was often read during funerals during the time Fr. Alcuin was here with us? God was generous then...He is generous always....

 you and me, and Himself as well.*

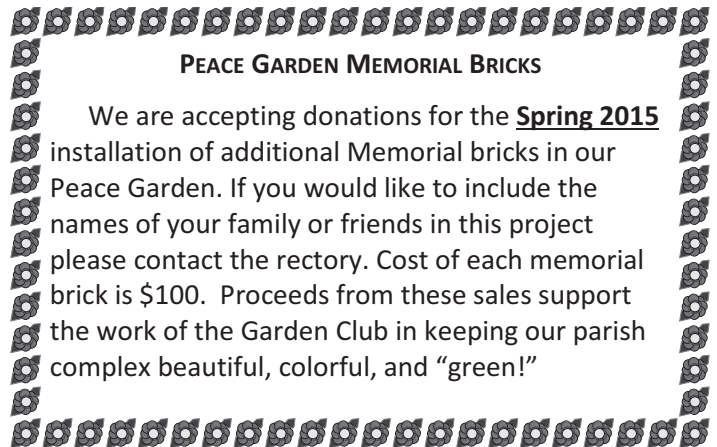
**BISHOP ROGER (aka St. Nick)**

## Sens symboli Bożonarodzeniowych

Boże Narodzenie jest najbardziej rodzinnym świętem dla Polaków. Przeważnie spędzane w gronie najbliższych sięga tradycjami dawnych czasów. Zachowały się nawet ślady obrzędów z czasów słowiańskich.

**Pierwsza Gwiazdka** - Jest symbolem Gwiazdy Betlejemskiej, której pojawienie się towarzyszyło narodzinom Jezusa. Dzięki niej pasterze, Trzej Królowie mogli dotrzeć do miejsca narodzin Zbawiciela. Dopiero, gdy ona zabłyśnie możemy, według tradycji, sięść do stołu i podzielić się opłatkiem.

**Opłatek** - Jego nazwa wzięła się z łacińskiego słowa oblatum i znaczy tyle co dar ofiarny. Jest to cienki kawałek wypieczonej mąki pszennej i wody. Życzenia, jakie składamy podczas dzielenia się opłatkiem powinny być szczere, wybaczymy sobie wszystkie winy, aby zasiąść do kolacji pogodzeni i z czystymi sercami.

**Sianko wigilijne** - Kładziemy je pod białym obrusem na stole, przy którym będziemy spożywać wigilijną kolację. Symbolizuje miejsce, w jakim przyszedł na świat Jezus – szałkę i siano, na którym leżał po urodzeniu.

**Choinka** - Z czasem zwyczaj przynoszenia do domu i ubierania w różne ozdoby sosnowego drzewka, przeniósł się z Niemiec do innych chrześcijańskich krajów. Ubierana w Polsce zazwyczaj w dzień wigilijny lub 23 grudnia. Kościół był początkowo niechętny temu pogańskiemu zwyczajowi, lecz szybko nadal choince chrześcijańską symbolikę "biblijnego drzewa wiadomości dobra i zła" pod którym rozpoczęła się historia ludzkości. Choinkę wnosi się do domu w dniu, w którym wspominamy pierwszych ludzi - Adama i Ewę. Na choince nie może zabraknąć jabłek, bo właśnie uważa się, że te owoce były na owym biblijnym drzewie. Wśród iglastych gałązek wija się łańcuchy, słomkowe i bibułkowe, są pamiątka po wężu-kusicielu. Gwiazda na szczycie drzewka symbolizuje gwiazdę betlejemską, która wiodła Trzech Króli do Dzieciątka Jezus. Świeczki na gałązkach to jak okrucy ognia, który dawniej płonął w izbie przez całą noc wigilijną, aby przychodzące na ten czas dusze przodków mogły się ogrzać. Choinki ubierano także w piernikowe figurki ludzi i zwierząt, lukrowane kolorowo, posypane makiem. Tak ustrojona choinka stała w domu do Trzech Króli. Lampki choinkowe powinniśmy zapalić po raz pierwszy dopiero po pojawieniu się pierwszej gwiazdki.

**Kolędy** - Zaczynamy śpiewać przy wigilijnym stole. Ich nazwa pochodzi z łaciny – calendae, co oznaczało pierwszy dzień miesiąca. Pierwsze „kolędy” były śpiewane przez Rzymian w ramach uroczystego uczczenia pierwszego stycznia, potem zwyczaj śpiewania pieśni przejęli chrześcijanie, aby czcić narodziny Jezusa

**Prezenty** - Najprzyjemniejszy, dla wielu, zwyczaj bożonarodzeniowy. Pierwotnie ten zwyczaj był związany wyłącznie z osobą św. Mikołaja, dziś przyjmujemy, iż są to podarki od małego Jezusa.

**Szopka** - W niej narodził się Jezus. Jest także symbolem nas samych. Jesteśmy jak stajenka, w której nie zawsze jest czysto, w której dobro przeplata się ze złem. Jednak to właśnie do stajenki, a więc i do nas, ludzi, przychodzi Jezus, rozświetla nasze życia i daje nam nadzieję, miłość i wiarę. Bóg rodzi się w nas!

**Pasterka** - Tradycyjna msza odprawiana w nocy z 24 na 25 grudnia. Symbolizuje czuwanie pasterzy przy żłobie Jezusa. Uczestniczymy w niej razem z najbliższymi. Jest najważniejszym momentem w czasie Świąt Bożego Narodzenia. Pięknym staropolskim zwyczajem jest zapraszanie na Wigilię ludzi samotnych - tak aby w ten wieczór nikt nie był opuszczony, smutny i przyjmujemy kogoś kto zapuka do drzwi i dlatego kładziemy dodatkowe nakrycie na stół wigilijny.

*Z okazji nadchodzących Świąt Bożego Narodzenia pragniemy przekazać Wam – naszym Parafianom najserdeczniejsze życzenia. Niech te Święta będą dla całej Rodziny błogosławionym czasem, pełnym głębokich duchowych przeżyć przy spotkaniu z Bożym Dzieciątkiem, a także czasem spędzonym bez pośpiechu, trosk i zmartwień. Życzymy, aby odbyły się w spokoju, radości wśród Rodziny, Przyjaciół, oraz wszystkich Bliskich dla Was osób. Niech Narodzony Jezus- Bóg Dobroci i Miłości znajduje zawsze w Waszych kochających Go sercach godne mieszkanie dla Siebie i godne miejsce na złożenie wszelkich darów, jakich tak hojnie pragnie nam udzielić. Niech Wasza miłość wynagrodzi Mu oziębłość świata dotkniętego obojętnością i niewiarą. Wraz z nadchodzącym Nowym 2015 Rokiem życzymy dużo zdrowia, szczęścia. Niech nie opuszcza Was pomysłowość i spełnią się najskrytsze marzenia i plany a Boże Dziecię błogosławi na każdy dzień.*

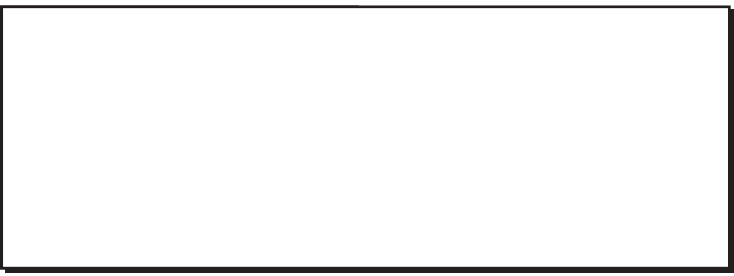

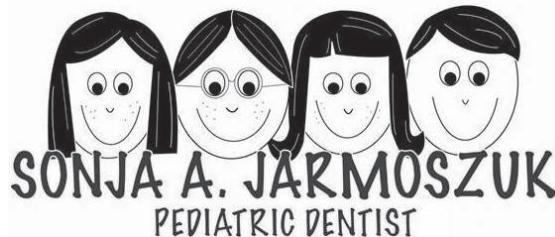
