Catholic Schools Week is a unique celebration at Saint Stanislaus School. Some of my peers ask me, “How do you celebrate Catholic Schools Week when so many of your students are not Catholic?” My goodness, that question always catches me by surprise! Not without a little bit of pride, I run down the list of things we do with our students: weekly Masses, confessions, retreats, veneration of the cross, making sure each child has a rosary, stations of the cross. But beyond these traditional Catholic practices, we at Saint Stanislaus School live and work one of the largest ministries of our parish, that of Catholic education. Our staff seeks to model Gospel values, and in turn teach our students to do the same. We focus on service and community and Scripture as ways of living our faith, and ask our students to do the same.

We will spend Catholic Schools Week honoring the many pieces of our Catholic education. We will thank parents for sending their children to us; we show appreciation to the crossing guards and bus drivers who keep the children safe; we challenge our bodies in healthy competition; we test Scripture knowledge with trivia games; we spend time with our faith families, increasing the connection between older and younger students; we let our teachers know that we are grateful for their ministry.

During the morning prayer and announcements, the students recite our school pledge that begins with “I know Christ and do my personal best”. We ask them to have a personal relationship with Christ and use the gifts God gave them to reach their potential. If that’s not Catholic education, I don’t know what is.

Bishops' Conferences Say Hope is Essential for Peace in the Holy Land

WASHINGTON—Bishops from Europe, South Africa and North America, gathered in the Holy Land for an annual meeting, said that hope is needed to bring lasting peace to the Holy Land, January 15. Eleven countries made up the 2014 Co-Ordination of Bishops' Conference in support of the Church in the Holy Land, which issues an annual statement following their meeting.

"We urge public officials to become leaders of hope, not people of obstruction," the bishops wrote. They cited the words of Pope Francis encouraging peace talks between Israelis and Palestinians and expressed hope that Pope Francis' visit to the Holy Land in May will promote hope in the region.

Bishop Richard E. Pates of Des Moines, Iowa, chairman of the U.S. bishops' Committee on International Justice and Peace, represented the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops at the gathering.

The bishops wrote that they were encouraged by the hope of the people they encountered during the time in the Holy Land, including in Gaza, which they called "a man-made disaster."

The bishops wrote, "As we leave the Holy Land, the bishops and people of the local Church remain in our hearts. They are not alone."

Działanie świadka Ewangelii

By jednak prawda, dobro i piękno mogły zagościć między ludźmi, potrzebni są autentyczni świadkowie Ewangelii. Zostali oni wybrani spośród wielu innych przez samego Pana. Do nich to nad Jeziorem Galilejskim powiedział: „Pójdźcie za Mną, a uczynię was rybakami ludzi”. Na odpowiedź nie musiał długo czekać, ponieważ „natychmiast zostawili sieci i poszli za Nim”.

Zadanie świadczenia o miłości spoczywa również na barkach każdego chrześcijanina. Wezwanie Pana powołującego apostołów odnosi się do każdego z nas. Wszyscy bowiem jesteśmy zobowiązani do życia w prawdzie, nierozdzielnie związanej z miłością. Ta z kolei zawiera w sobie nie tylko słowa, ale przede wszystkim czyn. Święty Paweł postrzegając służbę miłości przez pryzmat krzyża, piętnuje podziały oraz akcentuje konieczność zgody.

Pewien młody mnich spytał kiedyś swojego zwierzchnika: Mistrzu, czy to prawda, że o wiele łatwiej jest udawać niż być szczerym? – Z pewnością. Ludzie wolą udawać, ponieważ bycie szczerym oznacza całkowite obnażenie się przed samym sobą i przed innymi. Ale czy znasz historię o człowieku tonącym w długach? – Nie znam jej. A czemu pytasz? – Jest to bowiem opowieść o tym, że o ile trudno jest być szczerym, to czasami wcale nie łatwiej jest coś udawać.

Tak więc był sobie człowiek tonący w długach do tego stopnia, że nawet królewski skarbiec by go nie uratował. Człowiek ów zatem zaczął udawać wariata. Oczywiście zdołał wyprowadzić w pole lekarzy, którym przecież i tak trudno jest odróżnić człowieka obłąkanego od zdrowego. Jego udawanie było jednak tak doskonałe, że przekonał o swoim szaleństwie nawet najbardziej podejrzliwych wierzących.

Pewnego dnia napotkał mędrca, który kiedy tylko go zobaczył, wziął go na stronę i powiedział: Co czynisz? Uważaj! Jeśli będziesz udawał obłąkanego, grozi ci to, że naprawdę się nim staniesz. Oko moje już dostrzega u ciebie oznaki prawdziwego szaleństwa. – Człowiek ten zaprzestał szybko komedii, zrozumiał bowiem, jak łatwo stać się tym, kogo się udaje (por. Pierre D’Aubrigy, O pułapce).

Z własnego doświadczenia wiemy, jak trudno jest żyć w ciemnościach. Wystarczy, że dotykają nas problemy związane z właściwym funkcjonowaniem elektryczności, a natychmiast szukamy innego źródła światła: zapalamy świecę lub używamy latarki. Chcemy w ten sposób zmniejszyć nieprzyjemne odczucie samotności oraz zlikwidować niebezpieczeństwa, wynikające z otaczającego mroku.

Chrystus przyszedł na świat, by zostawić nam miłość. W ten sposób wskazał na prawdę, która jest konieczna do nawiązania pozytywnych relacji międzyludzkich. Owo życie „w świetle” może przynieść tylko i wyłącznie dobre owoce. Dostrzegł to już starotestamentalny prorok Izajasz: „Pomnożyłeś radość, zwiększyłeś wesele. Rozradowali się przed Tobą, jak się radują we żniwa”.

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Człowiek tonący w długach do tego stopnia, że nawet królewski skarbiec by go nie uratował, wpadł na niegodny pomysł. Nie dość tego, że w dotychczasowym życiu postępował nagannie, pozwolił sobie na kłamstwo, mogące przynieść nieodwracalne skutki. Szczęściem dla niego okazało się spotkanie mędrca, dzięki któremu w porę dostrzegł niebezpieczeństwo.

I my spójrzmy na nasze postępowanie. Jeszcze jest czas, by rozpocząć wszystko od nowa. Odsuńmy od siebie złudne pokusy łatwego i lekkiego życia. Bierzmy przykład z Chrystusa. Opierajmy się na Nim. Wtedy nasze działanie będzie działaniem na miarę autentycznych świadków Ewangelii.
