World without mothers would be inhumane, lacking tenderness, pope says

VATICAN CITY (CNS) -- Mothers are indispensable to society and the church, showing the world what it means to generously give oneself for others, to respect life and to display tenderness and moral strength even in times of trouble, Pope Francis said.

Tying the theme of the family to the church's celebration of the feast of Mary, Mother of God, Jan. 1, and the Epiphany Jan. 6, the pope looked specifically at Mary's role in the Gospel accounts of Christmas.

"She gives us Jesus, she shows us Jesus, she lets us see Jesus," the pope said.

Even though mothers are often "exalted" with praise and poetry, he said, they often get very little concrete help and appreciation. In fact, he said, "the willingness of mothers to sacrifice themselves for their children is often taken advantage of in order to 'save' on social spending."

"One should better understand their daily struggle to be efficient at work and attentive and loving in their family; it is necessary to better understand what they are striving for in order to express the best and most authentic fruits of their liberation," he said.

Pope Francis recalled his own upbringing as one of five children, and spoke of how much work and how many problems, but also how much happiness, come with motherhood.

"Mothers are the strongest antidote to the spread of selfish individualism," he said.

A world without mothers would be "inhumane," he said, "because mothers always know how to give witness -- even in the worst of times -- to tenderness, dedication and moral strength."

"Being a mother does not mean just bringing a child into the world, but it is also a life choice. What does a mother choose?" he asked. "It is the choice to give life and this is great, this is beautiful."

If societies do not do justice to the contributions and sacrifices of mothers, the church is not always better, he said.

"Perhaps mothers, who are ready to make many sacrifices for their children and often also for others" should find greater reception and attention in the church, he said.

It is often the mother who passes on "the deepest sense of religious practice" as she plants and cultivates the seed of faith in a child by sharing prayers and devotional practices, he said. "Without mothers, not only would there be no new people of faith, but the faith would lose a good portion of its simple and profound warmth."

Mothers are the biggest enemies of war, "which kills their children," he said, admitting he has thought many times of those women who receive the dreaded letter notifying them of the loss of their children in their defense of the nation.

"Poor women. How much a mother suffers," he said solemnly.

Presiding over the funeral Mass of a priest who had been assassinated by the country's death squads, the late archbishop had said that giving one's life does not just mean being killed for the faith, it is also offering oneself "in that silence of daily life," bit by bit, "like a mother, who, without fear and with the simplicity of maternal martyrdom, conceives a child in her womb, brings it into the world, nurses it, raises it and lovingly cares" for the child.

But while people today are well-practiced in "the language of the mind, thinking" and "the language of the hands, doing," they need to remember to use "the language of the heart, loving," he said.

"These three languages come together to make up the harmony of the person; and there is the beauty," he said.

God is not only truth, goodness and the master of creation, he is also beauty and "so many times we forget about beauty," the pope said. "Humanity thinks, hears, does, but today it is in such need of beauty."

Likewise, the 'sign of peace' needn't involve more than a polite nod between parties. We want to keep our remaining flock healthy and happy during this cold Winter! Please be considerate of others and pray for those who are under the weather.

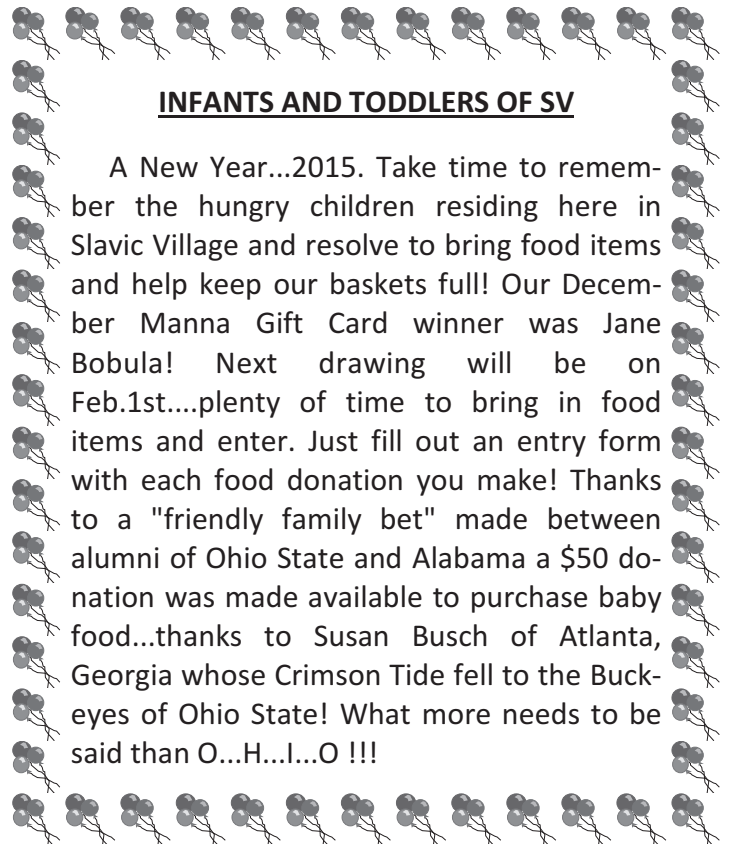

KOLEDY!!!!

Nawrócenie Świętego Pawła - 25 stycznia



Kościół katolicki w ogóle obchodzi zazwyczaj rocznicę śmierci swoich Świętych, uważając dzień ich śmierci jako dzień ich narodzin dla Kościoła. Obchodzi jednak Kościół dzień urodzin św. Jana Chrzciciela, gdyż ten narodził się już uświęcony.

Rzadko wszakże święci Kościół jakąś chwilę z żywota Świętego, bo rzadko zdarza się chwila tak ważna, by zasługiwała na doroczny i uroczysty obchód. Kościół święci Nawrócenie św. Pawła. Wydarzenie to posiada bowiem kilka cech wybitnych.

Nawrócenie św. Pawła jest nagłe, zupełne, stanowcze, wspaniałe. Zmieniony w jednej chwili i zmieniony na zawsze! Jest ono nagłe, jak uderzenie pioruna, a nieśmiertelne, jak radość wybranych. Posiada cechy nagłości, pełni i trwałości zarazem.

Szaweł urodził się w Tarsie w Cylicji (obecnie Turcja) około 5-10 roku po Chrystusie. Pochodził z żydowskiej rodziny silnie przywiązanej do tradycji. Byli niewolnikami, którzy zostali wyzwoleni. Szaweł odziedziczył po nich obywatelstwo rzymskie. Uczył się rzemiosła - tkania płótna namiotowego. Później przybył do Jerozolimy, aby studiować Torę. Był uczniem Gamaliela (Dz 22, 3). Gorliwość w strzeżeniu tradycji religijnej sprawiła, że mając około 25 lat stał się zdecydowanym przeciwnikiem i prześladowcą Kościoła. Uczestniczył jako świadek w kamienowaniu św. Szczepana. Około 35 roku z własnej woli udał się z listami polecającymi do Damaszku (Dz 9, 1n; Ga 1, 15-16), aby tam ścigać chrześcijan. Jak podają Dzieje Apostolskie, u bram miasta "oślniła go nagle światłość z nieba. A gdy upadł na ziemię, usłyszał głos: «Szawle, Szawle, dlaczego Mnie prześladujesz?» - «Kto jesteś, Panie?» - powiedział. A On: «Jestem Jezus, którego ty prześladujesz. Wstań i wejdź do miasta, tam ci powiedzą, co masz czynić» (Dz 9, 3-6). Po tym nagłym, niespodziewanym i cudownym nawróceniu przyjął chrzest i zmienił imię na Paweł.

Po trzech latach pobytu w Damaszku oraz krótkim pobycie w Jerozolimie odbył trzy misyjne podróże: pierwszą - w latach 44-49: Cypr-Galacja, razem z Barnabą i Markiem; drugą w latach 50-53: Filipi-Tesaloniki-Berea-Achaia-Korynt, razem z Tymoteuszem i Sylasem; trzecią w latach 53-58: Efez-Macedonia-Korynt-Jerozolima.

W Palestynie Paweł został aresztowany i był przesłuchiwany przez prokuratorów Feliksa i Festusa. Dwa lata przebywał w więzieniu w Cezarei. Gdy odwołał się do cesarza, został deportowany drogą morską do Rzymu. Dwa lata przebywał w więzieniu o dość łagodnym regulaminie. Uwolniony, udał się do Efezu, Hiszpanii (prawdopodobnie; jak podaje Klemens, "dotarł do kresu Zachodu", a tak określano tereny Półwyspu Iberyjskiego) i na Kretę. W Efezie albo w Troadzie aresztowano go po raz drugi (64 r.). W Rzymie oczekiwał na zakończenie procesu oraz wyrok.

Zginął śmiercią męczeńską przez ścięcie mieczem w tym samym roku co św. Piotr Apostoł (67 r.). W Rzymie w IV wieku szczątki Pawła Apostoła złożono w grobowcu, nad którym wybudowano bazylikę św. Pawła za Murami. Św. Paweł, nazywany Apostołem Narodów, jest autorem 13 listów do gmin chrześcijańskich, włączonych do ksiąg Nowego Testamentu.


