### WHAT ABOUT THE CONSTITUTION OF 1791?

In case you have not noticed, this weekend Poles around the world are celebrating what is referred to as Polish Constitution Day or the 3rd of May celebration. One could say it is synonymous with our July 4th holiday. In Poland this event commemorates the signing of the 3rd of May Constitution which had been the work of three years of labor of the Sejm (Polish Congress and Senate). Under the leadership of King Stanislaus August Poniatowski the parties created a document comparable to that of the US Constitution with, of course, some differences, but many similarities. The document was not an easy one for all to sign as it relinquished certain privileges of the nobility and shared responsibilities which had previously been the status quo in a country which had undergone some tough times, this the fault of not any one person or institution, but a situation which allowed for interferences (within the borders as well as just beyond) as well as personal greed to frequently create a certain instability for the orderly governance of the nation. Though not ideal, it still represented the opportunity for a definite improvement toward the functioning and security of the Polish nation over what had been in place prior to this time. Renowned historian Oskar Halecki provides us with the following description of the accomplishments of the document.

*"This constitution ratified the rights accorded to the burghers, giving them access to public offices and to Parliament, and thus breaking down the barrier which had hitherto separated them from the nobility. It placed the peasant population under the protection of the government, not going so far as to abolish serfdom, but encouraging and guaranteeing individual contracts between the gentry and the peasants, contracts which became more and more frequent and ameliorated the situation of the latter. Perfecting the central administration and the management of finances, the new constitution abolished the right of the liberum veto, as well as that of the 'free' election of a king, a right which had ended by imposing upon the Republic the candidates of foreign powers. It decreed that after Poniatowski's death the throne should be hereditary in the house of Saxony."*

Professor Halecki further makes the important point that this document provided for the creation of an army of 100,000 men, the cost of this to be shared by the nobility as well as the King. The document was the reflection of the enthusiastic reforms initiated by the King and many men of the Enlightenment since Poniatowski's election in 1764. The revamping of the educational system was among the most important accomplishments of the government. You may or may not know the rest of the story at this point. To those of you who do not, suffice it to say that the jubilation surrounding the signing of the constitution was short-lived, soon to lead to the second and third partitions of the nation by the anything but democratic rulers of Russia, Prussia and Austria. Poland was to be wiped off the map of Europe to a large degree for 123 years, only re-established after WWI at Versailles.

Although the country was no longer seen as an actual government during those years of dismemberment, the spirit of the nation never ceased to exist in large part to the people as well as the Church. After numerous unsuccessful revolutions and interventions, the Polish people were able to preserve their language and customs, their religion and heritage, their undying hope and belief that once again, the country would be the phoenix, rising from its ashes. All of this is what we celebrate this weekend — not just a piece of paper — but the triumph of good over evil, freedom over oppression, the triumph of the human spirit.

This week I noticed an appeal in the bulletin for parishioners to step forward to join the stewardship and evangelization committee. I wondered what St. John Paul II thought about this and that is what today's article is all about. You see, he felt that we should be witnesses. We have made a decisive choice in our life to be rooted to our faith. Some of us were baptized as babies and guided by our parents and families through our faith; others of us have accepted our faith as adults. Either way, we each should be bearing witness to our faith with our words, and even more with our lives.

Pope Paul VI once said: "Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he listens to teachers he does so because they are witnesses." If the nonbelievers of this world are to believe in Christ, they need your faithful testimony. The ideals, the values, the convictions that are the basis of your dedication to Christ must be translated into the language of daily life. Your public testimony is part of your contribution to the mission of the Church.

St. Pope John Paul summed this concept up with a lovely reminder from St. Paul: "You are a letter from Christ . . . written not with ink but with the Spirit of the Living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts."

As you consider these words, take time to reflect on your sense of being a witness. Are you acting as a witness in your daily actions and words at work? at home? in your community? in your parish community? At the end of the day, can you say your actions were a testimony to your faith? We all stumble; that's a given. What is most important is getting up, dusting ourselves off, and continuing on the journey. Be a witness to your faith; be an example to others of what is etched in your heart. Consider offering your testimony through the stewardship and evangelization committee; that is just one of many ways to do so. Bye for now, Batty.



## Maryjo, Królowo Polski... Jestem przy Tobie pamiętam....czuwam!

### NMP - Królowa Polski główna Patronka Polski 3 maja

Tytuł Matki Bożej jako Królowej narodu polskiego sięga drugiej połowy XIV wieku: Grzegorz z Sambora nazywa Maryję Królową Polski i Polaków. Teologiczne uzasadnienie tytułu "Królowej" pojawi się w XVII wieku **po zwycięstwie odniesionym nad Szwedami i cudownej obronie Jasnej Góry, które przypisywano wstawiennictwu Maryi.** Wyrazicielem tego przekonania Polaków stał się król Jan Kazimierz, który 1 kwietnia 1656 roku w katedrze lwowskiej przed cudownym obrazem Matki Bożej Łaskawej obrał Maryję za Królową swoich państw, a Królestwo Polskie polecił jej szczególnej obronie. W czasie podniesienia król zszedł z tronu, złożył berto i koronę, i padł na kolana przed wielkim ołtarzem. Zaczynając od słów: "Wielka Boga-Człowieka Matko, Najświętsza Dziewico" ogłosił Matkę Bożą szczególną Patronką Królestwa Polskiego. Przyrzekł szerzyć Jej cześć, ślubował wystarać się u Stolicy Apostolskiej o pozwolenie na obchodzenie Jej święta jako Królowej Korony Polskiej, zając się losem ciemionych pańszczyzną chłopów i zaprowadzić w kraju sprawiedliwość społeczną. Po Mszy świętej, w czasie której król przyjął również Komunię świętą z rąk nuncjusza papieskiego, przy wystawionym Najświętszym Sakramencie odśpiewano Litanię do Najświętszej Maryi Panny, a przedstawiciel papieża odśpiewał trzykroć, entuzjastycznie powtórzone przez wszystkich obecnych nowe wezwanie: "Królowo Korony Polskiej, módl się za nami". Choć ślubowanie Jana Kazimierza odbyło się przed obrazem Matki Bożej Łaskawej we Lwowie, to jednak szybko przyjęło się przekonanie, że najlepszym typem obrazu Królowej Polski jest obraz Pani Częstochowskiej. Koronacja obrazu papieskimi koronami 8 września 1717 roku ugruntowała przekonanie o królewskości Maryi. Warto dodać, że Jan Kazimierz nie był pierwszym, który oddał swoje państwo w szczególną opiekę Bożej Matki. W roku 1512 gubernator hiszpański ogłosił Matkę Bożą szczególną Patronką Florydy. W roku 1638 król francuski, Ludwik XIII, osobiście i uroczyście ogłosił Matkę Bożą Niepokalaną Poczetą Patronką Francji. Niestety śluby króla Jana Kazimierza nie zostały od razu spełnione. Dopiero po odzyskaniu przez Polskę niepodległości w 1918 r. Episkopat Polski zwrócił się do Stolicy Apostolskiej o wprowadzenie święta dla Polski pod wezwaniem "Królowej Polski". Papież Benedykt XV chętnie do tej prośby się przychylił (1920). Biskupi umyślnie zaproponowali Ojcu świętemu dzień 3 maja, aby podkreślić łączność nierozzerwalną tego święta z sejmem czteroletnim, a zwłaszcza z uchwaloną 3 maja 1791 roku pierwszą konstytucją polską. W 1962 r. Jan XXIII ogłosił Maryję Królowę Polski główną patronką kraju i niebieską Opiekunką naszego narodu.

Nasza parafia przeżywać będzie w tym roku radość z przyjęcia święceń kapłańskich i mszy prymicyjnej diakona Roba Ramser w niedzielę 17 maja o 2<sup>30</sup> p.m.


