II. THE ISSUE OF WATER

27. Other indicators of the present situation have to do with the depletion of natural resources. We all know that it is not possible to sustain the present level of consumption in developed countries and wealthier sectors of society, where the habit of wasting and discarding has reached unprecedented levels. The exploitation of the planet has already exceeded acceptable limits and we still have not solved the problem of poverty.

28. Fresh drinking water is an issue of primary importance, since it is indispensable for human life and for supporting terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems. Sources of fresh water are necessary for health care, agriculture and industry. Water supplies used to be relatively constant, but now in many places demand exceeds the sustainable supply, with dramatic consequences in the short and long term. Large cities dependent on significant supplies of water have experienced periods of shortage, and at critical moments these have not always been administered with sufficient oversight and impartiality. Water poverty especially affects Africa where large sectors of the population have no access to safe drinking water or experience droughts which impede agricultural production. Some countries have areas rich in water while others endure drastic scarcity.

29. One particularly serious problem is the quality of water available to the poor. Every day, unsafe water results in many deaths and the spread of water-related diseases, including those caused by microorganisms and chemical substances. Dysentery and cholera, linked to inadequate hygiene and water supplies, are a significant cause of suffering and of infant mortality. Underground water sources in many places are threatened by the pollution produced in certain mining, farming and industrial activities, especially in countries lacking adequate regulation or controls. It is not only a question of industrial waste. Detergents and chemical products, commonly used in many places of the world, continue to pour into our rivers, lakes and seas.

30. Even as the quality of available water is constantly diminishing, in some places there is a growing tendency, despite its scarcity, to privatize this resource, turning it into a commodity subject to the laws of the market. Yet *access to safe drinkable water is a basic and universal human right, since it is essential to human survival and, as such, is a condition for the exercise of other human rights.* Our world has a grave social debt towards the poor who lack access to drinking water, because *they are denied the right to a life consistent with their inalienable dignity.* This debt can be paid partly by an increase in funding to provide clean water and sanitary services among the poor. But water continues to be wasted, not only in the developed world but also in developing countries which possess it in abundance. This shows that the problem of water is partly an educational and cultural issue, since there is little awareness of the seriousness of such behavior within a context of great inequality.

31. Greater scarcity of water will lead to an increase in the cost of food and the various products which depend on its use. Some studies warn that an acute water shortage may occur within a few decades unless urgent action is taken. The environmental repercussions could affect billions of people; it is also conceivable that the control of water by large multinational businesses may become a major source of conflict in this century.

CO SIĘ DZIEJE PO ŚMIERCI?

Obecnie na tej planecie żyją miliardy ludzi. W ciągu stu lat prawie wszyscy z nich umrą. Ich ciała będą bez czucia, lecz co się stanie z ich duszami – zasadniczą i wieczną częścią życia? To wielka tajemnica. Co odchodzi, gdy człowiek umiera? Dokąd idzie ta brakująca część? „Tylko krok jeden jest między mną i między śmiercią” (1 Ks. Samuelowa 20, 3). Mówi się, że całe życie jest tylko przygotowaniem się do śmierci. Psalmista powiedział: „Czy jest ktoś, kto by żył, a śmierci nie zaznał?” (Psalm 89, 49).

Podobno żyjemy w wolnomyślicielskiej epoce radykalnych doświadczeń. Poprzez wiedzę, naukę, wynalazki, odkrycia, filozofię i materialistyczny światopogląd człowiek stara się zmienić świat i prawa, które nim rządzą. Wywyższamy fałszywych bogów: pieniądze, sławę i ludzką inteligencję; niezależnie jednak od naszych starań, koniec jest zawsze ten sam: „Postanowione ludziom raz umrzeć” (List do Hebrajczyków 9, 27).

Na każdym kroku widzimy śmierć. Syrena ambulansu, wywieszka przedsiębiorcy pogrzebowego, cmentarze, które tak często mijamy, widok konduktu pogrzebowego, sunącego przez ulice – wszystko to przypomina nam, że Posępny Żniwiarz może po nas przyjść w każdej chwili. Nikt z nas nie może być pewnym, kiedy dokładnie to nastąpi, wszyscy jednak mamy świadomość, że może się to stać w każdej chwili.

Co roku około czterdziestu tysięcy Amerykanów wsiada do swych aut, nie uświadamiając sobie, że będzie to ich ostatnia podróż. Ponadto, pomimo wszystkich wzmożonych środków bezpieczeństwa trzydzieści tysięcy osób ginie w wypadkach w domach, gdy ich zmysłom daleka jest jakakolwiek myśl o śmierci. Śmierć bowiem ściga ludzkość bezlitośnie i choć wiedza medyczna i technika prowadzą z nią stałą walkę, ostatecznie to ona zawsze zwycięża.

Walka ze śmiercią, długo prowadzona przez naukę, zapewniła nam kilka dodatkowych lat życia, śmierć jednak wciąż stoi na końcu drogi i przeciętna długość życia niewiele przekracza biblijne siedemdziesiąt lat.

Walka ze śmiercią rozpoczyna się w chwili narodzin. Matka poświęca wiele lat opiece nad życiem swego dziecka. Czuwa nad wszystkim, co dotyczy jego odżywiania, ubrania, otoczenia, opieki lekarskiej, szczepień ochronnych. Jednak, mimo jej pełnej miłości troski, dziecko już zaczyna proces umierania. Nie minie wiele lat, a pojawią się namacalne oznaki tego. Dentysta stwierdzi, że nasze zęby się psują. Potrzebne będą okulary, by polepszyć nasz słabnący wzrok. Z czasem skóra pomarszczy się i zwiotczeje, ramiona przygarbią się, a nasz krok stanie się powolniejszy i mniej pewny. Będziemy mieli mniej sił, kości staną się kruche i niemal niepostrzeżenie zaczniemy przybliżać się ku śmierci. Gdy życie odchodzi i umiera człowiek, staramy się jak najszybciej o tym zapomnieć.

Gdy przybył Chrystus, przedstawił nowe spojrzenie na kwestię śmierci. Człowiek zawsze traktował śmierć jako wroga, lecz Jezus powiedział, że On zwyciężył śmierć i odebrał jej moc. Jezus Chrystus był niezwykłym realistą, gdy nawoływał ludzi, aby przygotowali się do śmierci, która na pewno ich spotka. „Nie martw się śmiercią ciała – nauczał Pan Jezus – obawiaj się raczej wiecznej śmierci duszy”. Biblia naucza, że istnieją dwa rodzaje śmierci: jedną jest śmierć fizyczna, drugą – śmierć wieczna. Jezus ostrzegł, że drugiej śmierci powinniśmy się obawiać znacznie bardziej niż pierwszej. Opisał drugą śmierć jako piekło, które polega na wiecznym oddzieleniu od Boga. Wskazał, że śmierć ciała jest niczym w porównaniu z tym wiecznym oddaleniem duszy od Stwórcy...

Biblia naucza, że jesteś duszą nieśmiertelną. Twoja dusza jest wieczna i będzie żyć zawsze. Innymi słowy, to, co w tobie prawdziwe – ta część, która myśli, czuje, marzy, ma plany, część będąca twoim ego, twoją osobowością – nie umrze nigdy. Biblia mówi, że twoja dusza na zawsze będzie żyć w jednym z dwóch miejsc: w niebie lub w piekle. Jeśli nie jesteś chrześcijaninem i nigdy nie narodziłeś się na nowo, twoja dusza – zgodnie z tym, czego naucza Biblia – pójdzie po śmierci do miejsca, które Jezus nazywa Hadesem i będzie tam oczekiwać sądu Boga...

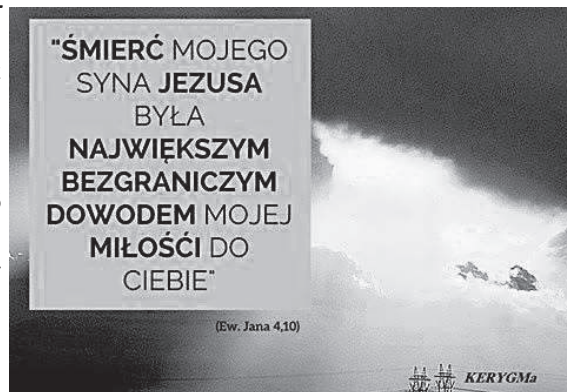
