III. LOSS OF BIODIVERSITY

36. Caring for ecosystems demands far-sightedness, since no one looking for quick and easy profit is truly interested in their preservation. But the cost of the damage caused by such selfish lack of concern is much greater than the economic benefits to be obtained. Where certain species are destroyed or seriously harmed, the values involved are incalculable. We can be silent witnesses to terrible injustices if we think that we can obtain significant benefits by making the rest of humanity, present and future, pay the extremely high costs of environmental deterioration.



37. Some countries have made significant progress in establishing sanctuaries on land and in the oceans where any human intervention is prohibited which might modify their features or alter their original structures. In the protection of biodiversity, specialists insist on the need for particular attention to be shown to areas richer both in the number of species and in endemic, rare or less protected species. Certain places need greater protection because of their immense importance for the global ecosystem, or because they represent important water reserves and thus safeguard other forms of life.

38. Let us mention, for example, those richly biodiverse lungs of our planet which are the Amazon and the Congo basins, or the great aquifers and glaciers. We know how important these are for the entire earth and for the future of humanity. The ecosystems of tropical forests possess an enormously complex biodiversity which is almost impossible to appreciate fully, yet when these forests are burned down or levelled for purposes of cultivation, within the space of a few years countless species are lost and the areas frequently become arid wastelands. A delicate balance has to be maintained when speaking about these places, for we cannot overlook the huge global economic interests which, under the guise of protecting them, can undermine the sovereignty of individual nations. In fact, there are "proposals to internationalize the Amazon, which only serve the economic interests of transnational corporations".^[24] We cannot fail to praise the commitment of international agencies and civil society organizations which draw public attention to these issues and offer critical cooperation, employing legitimate means of pressure, to ensure that each government carries out its proper and inalienable responsibility to preserve its country's environment and natural resources, without capitulating to spurious local or international interests.

39. The replacement of virgin forest with plantations of trees, usually monocultures, is rarely adequately analyzed. Yet this can seriously compromise a biodiversity which the new species being introduced does not accommodate. Similarly, wetlands converted into cultivated land lose the enormous biodiversity which they formerly hosted. In some coastal areas the disappearance of ecosystems sustained by mangrove

As we become mindful of God’s presence in us and in all things, our whole life becomes a prayer. Prayer opens us to our deepest level of being: our soul.

Continue your prayer as you work through your week. Morning and evening offer a prayer; recite the Our Father when you have a free minute; talk to God or a favorite saint anytime during your day. You certainly do not need a formal written prayer to pray to God. Speak from your heart; He’s available and listening 24/7 to help ease your soul. Bye for now, Batty.

SZKAPLERZ KARMELITAŃSKI

Szkaplerz jest "szatą Maryi", znakiem pokuty i nawrócenia. Kto przyjmuje Szkaplerz św., wyrzeka się złego ducha, odnawia przyrzeczenia chrztu św. i oddaje się Maryi jako Jej dziecko. Kto przyjmuje Szkaplerz, przyjmuje - jak św. Jan Apostoł pod krzyżem - Maryję do siebie, by żyć w zjednoczeniu z Nią i Jej służyć. Szkaplerz oznacza poświęcenie się Niepokalanemu Sercu Maryi i naśladowanie Jej cnót, szczególnie cnoty czystości i pokory. Szkaplerz oznacza przymierze przyjaźni z Maryją, w którym Ona zobowiązuje się do pomocy nam do zbawienia i uświęcenia, a my zobowiązujemy się do Jej naśladowania, służenia Jej i rozszerzania Jej czci. Szkaplerz oznacza habit Zakonu poświęconego służbie i czci Matki Bożej. Przyjmując Szkaplerz, pragniemy odtąd żyć tym samym duchem Karmelu, pełnić tę samą misję i żyć w zjednoczeniu z Maryją, dla Maryi, przez Maryję i w Maryi.

OBIETNICE SZKAPLERZNE:

"Kto w nim umrze, nie dozna ognia piekielnego" (słowa Matki Bożej wypowiedziane do św. Szymona). Maryja tym samym obiecuje wszystkim odzianym Szkaplerzem św. pomoc na drodze zbawienia.

Wyzwolenie z czyśćca w pierwszą sobotę po naszej śmierci. Jest to tak zwany przywilej sobotni. Matka Boża zapewniła rychłe wyzwolenie z czyśćca (bulla papieża Jana XXII, 1322r.) tym, którzy nosząc Szkaplerz, zachowując czystość według stanu i wierność modlitwie: "Ja, Matka, w pierwszą sobotę po ich śmierci miłostliwie przyjdę do nich i ilu ich zastanę w czyśćcu, uwolnię i zaprowadzę ich na świętą górę żywota wiecznego".

Pomoc i obrona w niebezpieczeństwach duszy i ciała. Maryja obiecuje wspierać nas na drodze naśladowania Chrystusa, a zwłaszcza w godzinę naszej śmierci, oraz pomóc nam w ostatecznej walce o wieczne zbawienie.

Uczestnictwo w dobrach duchowych całego zakonu karmelitańskiego za życia i po śmierci (w Mszach św., pokutach i modlitwie, odpustach i ofiarach)

ZOBOWIĄZANIA SZKAPLERZNE

Zobowiązujemy się do czynienia pokuty. Podstawowymi wymaganiami dla spełnienia się pierwszej obietnicy są: staranie o swoje zbawienie, zachowywanie przykazań Bożych i kościelnych, unikanie grzechu śmiertelnego i życie w łasce uświęcającej. Jest to także świadome i dobrowolne podejmowanie wyrzeczeń, umartwień i pokuty w celu przewyciężenia zła, wynagrodzenia Bogu i uświęcenia bliźnich.

Zobowiązujemy się do zachowania czystości według stanu, naśladowania cnót Matki Bożej i starania się o świętość życia, aby móc za Jej wstawiennictwem być wyzwolonym z czyśćca w pierwszą sobotę po naszej śmierci. Codziennie należy więc poświęcić jakiś czas na rozmyślanie nad życiem Maryi i nad Jej sposobem służby Bogu (np. w tajemnicach różańca św.).

Zobowiązujemy się do codziennej modlitwy, zwłaszcza maryjnej. Codziennie odnawiamy poświęcenie się Maryi przez modlitwę szkaplerzną wyznaczoną przez kapłana w dniu przyjęcia Szkaplerza (zazwyczaj jest to: Pod Twoją obronę, Witaj, Królowo lub trzy Zdrowaś Maryjo).

Zobowiązujemy się do życia duchem i misją zakonu karmelitańskiego, z uwzględnieniem charakteru naszego powołania, a w jedności z całym Zakonem; np. raz w roku odprawić w dniach od 7 do 15 lipca nowennę ku czci Matki Bożej Szkaplerznej (prywatnie lub wspólnotowo) i w dniu 16 lipca, w samą Uroczystość, przystąpić do sakramentów świętych, by otrzymać odpust zupełny i ofiarować go za siebie lub za zmarłych, zachować w sobotę wstrzemięźliwość od jedzenia mięsa.

Szkaplerz sukienki i medalik szkaplerzny mają taką samą wartość duchową. Zarówno tradycyjny szkaplerz jak i medalik szkaplerzny (na jego noszenie zezwolił Pius X w 1910 r.) powinny mieć z jednej strony wizerunek Najświętszego Serca Jezusa, a z drugiej strony wizerunek Matki Bożej ze szkaplerzem w dłoni.

MODLITWA DO MATKI BOŻEJ SZKAPLERZNEJ

(odmawiana przez św. Rafała Kalinowskiego)

O Błogosławiona Panno Niepokalana, ozdobo i światłości Góry Karmel, która okiem szczególnej dobroci patrzysz na każdego, który Twą świętą odziany jest szatą, spojrzij i na mnie łaskawie i okryj mnie płaszczem swej macierzyńskiej opieki. Wspomóż mą słabość swoją potęgą, oświeć swą mądrością ciemności mego serca, pomnażaj we mnie wiarę, nadzieję i miłość. Racz ozdobić moją duszę takimi łaskami i cnotami, aby zawsze była miłą Twemu Boskiemu Synowi i Tobie. Nie odstępuj mnie nigdy w życiu, pociesz mnie przy śmierci swoją najwdzięczniejszą obecnością i przedstaw mnie Najświętszej Trójcy jako dziecko swoje i sługę Tobie oddanego, abym Cię w niebie wiecznie chwalił i wielbił. Amen.
