**III. LOSS OF BIODIVERSITY**

40. Oceans not only contain the bulk of our planet's water supply, but also most of the immense variety of living creatures, many of them still unknown to us and threatened for various reasons. What is more, marine life in rivers, lakes, seas and oceans, which feeds a great part of the world's population, is affected by uncontrolled fishing, leading to a drastic depletion of certain species. Selective forms of fishing which discard much of what they collect continue unabated. Particularly threatened are marine organisms which we



tend to overlook, like some forms of plankton; they represent a significant element in the ocean food chain, and species used for our food ultimately depend on them.

41. In tropical and subtropical seas, we find coral reefs comparable to the great forests on dry land, for they shelter approximately a million species, including fish, crabs, molluscs, sponges and algae. Many of the world's coral reefs are already barren or in a state of constant decline. "Who turned the wonderworld of the seas into underwater cemeteries bereft of colour and life?"<sup>[25]</sup> This phenomenon is due largely to pollution which reaches the sea as the result of deforestation, agricultural monocultures, industrial waste and destructive fishing methods, especially those using cyanide and dynamite. It is aggravated by the rise in temperature of the oceans. All of this helps us to see that every intervention in nature can have consequences which are not immediately evident, and that certain ways of exploiting resources prove costly in terms of degradation which ultimately reaches the ocean bed itself.

42. Greater investment needs to be made in research aimed at understanding more fully the functioning of ecosystems and adequately analyzing the different variables associated with any significant modification of the environment. Because all creatures are connected, each must be cherished with love and respect, for all of us as living creatures are dependent on one another. Each area is responsible for the care of this family. This will require undertaking a careful inventory of the species which it hosts, with a view to developing programs and strategies of protection with particular care for safeguarding species heading towards extinction.

## 8 WRZESNIA NARODZENIE NAJŚWIĘTSZEJ MARYI PANNY

Pismo Święte nigdzie nie wspomina o narodzinach Maryi. Tradycja jednak przekazuje, że Jej rodzicami byli św. Anna i św. Joachim. Byli oni pobożnymi Żydami. Mimo sędziwego wieku nie mieli dziecka. W tamtych czasach uważane to było za karę za grzechy przodków. Dlatego Anna i Joachim gorliwie prosili Boga o dziecko. Bóg wysłuchał ich prośb i w nagrodę za pokładaną w Nim bezgraniczną ufność sprawił, że Anna urodziła córkę, Maryję. Nie znamy miejsca urodzenia Maryi ani też daty Jej przyjścia na ziemię. Według wszelkich dostępnych nam informacji, Maryja przyszła na świat pomiędzy 20. a 16. rokiem przed narodzeniem Pana Jezusa.

Z pism apokryficznych mówiących o Maryi należałoby wymienić przede wszystkim: *Protoewangelię Jakuba*, *Ewangelię Pseudo-Mateusza*, *Ewangelię Narodzenia Maryi*, *Ewangelię arabską o młodości Chrystusa*, *Historię Józefa Cieśli i Księżę o przejściu Maryi*. Największy wpływ wywarła na tradycję Kościoła *Protoewangelia Jakuba*. Pochodzi ona bowiem z roku ok. 150, jest więc bardzo bliska Ewangelii według św. Jana. Stamtąd właśnie dowiadujemy się, że rodzicami Maryi byli św. Joachim i św. Anna, i że Maryja jako kilkuletnie dziecko została przez rodziców ofiarowana w świątyni, gdzie też zamieszkała. Śladem tego opisu jest obchodzone w Kościele w dniu 21 listopada wspomnienie Ofiarowania Najświętszej Maryi Panny.

Pierwsze wzmianki o liturgicznym obchodzie narodzin Maryi pochodzą z VI w. Święto powstało prawdopodobnie w Syrii, gdy po Soborze Efeskim kult maryjny w Kościele przybrał zdecydowanie na sile. Wprowadzenie tego święta przypisuje się papieżowi św. Sergiuszowi I w 688 r. Na Wschodzie uroczystość ta musiała istnieć wcześniej, bo kazania-homilie wygłaszali o niej św. German (+ 732) i św. Jan Damasceński (+ 749). W Rzymie gromadzono się w dniu tego święta w kościele św. Adriana, który był przerobiony z dawnej sali senatu rzymskiego, po czym w uroczystej procesji udawali się wszyscy z zapalonymi świecami do bazyliki Matki Bożej Większej. Datę 8 września Kościół przyjął ze Wschodu - w tym dniu obchód ten znajdował się w sakramentarzach gelażańskim i gregoriańskim. Święto rozszerzało się w Kościele dość wolno - wynikało to m.in. z tego, że wszelkie informacje o okolicznościach narodzenia Bożej Rodzicielki pochodziły z apokryfów. W Polsce święto Narodzenia Najświętszej Maryi Panny ma także nazwę Matki Bożej Siewnej. Był bowiem dawny zwyczaj, że dopiero po tym święcie i uprzątnięciu pól zaczynało się orkować i siew. Lud chciał najpierw, aby rzucone w ziemię ziarno pobłogosławiła Boża Rodzicielka. Do ziarna siewnego mieszano ziarno wyłuskane z kłosów, które były wraz z kwiatami i ziołami poświęcane w uroczystość Wniebowzięcia Matki Bożej, by uprosić sobie dobry urodzaj.

Świętowane tego wydarzenia niesie głęboką treść teologiczną. Narodzenie Maryi było bezpośrednią zapowiedzią przyjścia Zbawiciela. Ojcowie Kościoła mówili, że Maryja poprzedza przyjście Mesjasza tak jak nastanie jutrzeńki zapowiada pełny blask dnia. W liturgii bizantyjskiej prawdę tę wyrażają słowa: „Narodzenie Twoje, Boża Rodzicielko, zwiastowało radość całemu światu: z Ciebie bowiem wzeszło Słońce Sprawiedliwości, Chrystus, nasz Bóg”, a w liturgii zachodniej prośba o wstawiennictwo tej, która „dla całego świata stała się nadzieją i jutrzeńką zbawienia”. Święto Narodzenia NMP przypomina nam, że Maryja była zwykłym człowiekiem. Choć zachowana od zepsucia grzechu, przez całe życie posiadała wolną wolę, nie była do niczego zdeterminowana. Tak jak każdy z nas miała swoich rodziców, rosła, bawiła się, pomagała w prowadzeniu domu, miała swoich znajomych i krewnych. Dopiero Jej zaufanie, posłuszeństwo i pełna zawierzenia odpowiedź na Boży głos sprawiły, że "będą Ją chwalić wszystkie pokolenia".
