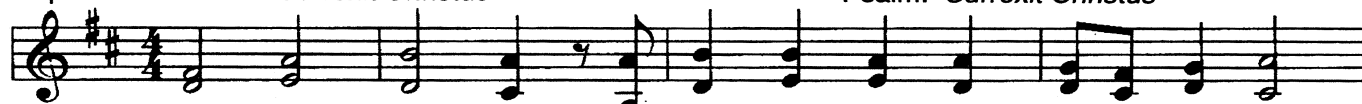

## Our Lady of Czêstochowa

By now you will have seen the latest addition to the shrine of Our Lady of Czêstochowa, that of the new/old shrine which houses the relic of our patron, St. Stanislaus. Our intent was never to diminish the importance of the Black Madonna, but rather augment her elevated role in the history of our ancestors. As Fr. Jerzy pointed out in last week's bulletin, Mary holds such an important position in the spiritual consciousness of the nation that she was actually crowned Queen of Poland in 1656, the historical period known as the Swedish invasion of Poland. Czêstochowa played a prominent role in this war with the Swedes attempting to capture the monastery. Officially, the reborn Polish State petitioned the Vatican to formally acknowledge Mary's title as her Queen, such official acknowledgement having been granted in 1923.

The icon referred to as the Black Madonna is often the object of numerous inaccurate conjectures regarding various aspects of that most holy representation of the Mother of God. Take, for example, the color. The reason the painting is so dark is primarily due to quite natural causes, having been painted on either teak or mahogany, both woods that carry a darker pigment in their makeup. In addition to this fact there is also the fact of years of incense and candle smoke which contributed to the discoloration. Likewise, the scars on her face were put there in 1430 by the invading Hussites, an actual historical fact. So much to learn, so little time!

## RESTORING OUR RECTORY, REBUILDING OUR FUTURE

December 7, 2002, is a date that, like the better-known "Day of Infamy," will remain in the consciousness of our parish community and the Franciscan Friars forever. We will never be the same. A powerful symbol of what happened to us is the rectory building, which for months now has been emptied of everything except its memories. Now is the time to get on with the physical healing of our broken building.

Although the insurance claim has been settled for several weeks now, and the contractor has been ready to start the restoration work, the parish membership and its leadership councils have agreed that now is an opportune time to make some necessary improvements in the building. That decision has delayed the start of the work, because the builders need to know exactly what we plan to do before they can start. This, in turn, has meant several walks through the building with the architect. The drawings are complete, and subcontractors will have sent their separate bids to us by this upcoming week Monday.

### The rectory has been emptied of everything except its memories.

Please set aside some time next Saturday evening at 6:30 PM for a parish meeting to discuss the rectory restoration and renovation. At that time, we will hear from members of the Rectory Task Force established by the parish leadership to coordinate this complicated work. They will describe for us the ten phases for work suggested by the architect. Each phase is listed in order of priority, from what is absolutely necessary to what is more of an enhancement for the sake of beauty and convenience. They also will share the expected costs involved, as well as the beginning of an appeal to meet these costs. There will be an opportunity for parishioners to ask questions and to express some preferences, which the Task Force and the leadership councils can take into account.

As people can see, the work on the exterior of the building is already well underway. Soon they will be ready to begin on the inside as well. The whole project is expected to take a full year from now, and to cost in excess of one million dollars. Although the insurance claim will pay to restore the building back to the way it had been, any changes will have to be paid for by the parish.

Please be assured that none of the changes are extravagant. For example, the second floor (where the priests live) has eight bedrooms — and one bathroom. The bathroom on the first floor was never intended for use by the general public, which it now clearly must be. The kitchen is also a public space in a way it had never been designed to handle. The living room is right on the main floor and affords no privacy for the priests or their guests. There is not enough office space to accommodate the growing demands of our vibrant parish community.

Through the whole process, please keep in your prayers all who are working hard on this difficult and necessary task.

## BISKUP STANISŁAW

Chociaż dni majowe biegają bardzo szybko i niosą ze sobą coraz to nowe wydarzenia i okazje do świętowania, to jednak trudno nie wyróżnić szczególnym podkreśleniem podniosłych uroczystości ku czci patrona naszej parafii Św. Stanisława ze Szczepanowa - biskupa i męczennika. Tym bardziej, że jeszcze dzisiaj, w Dzień Matki, głośnym echem odbijają się czwartkowe uroczystości w naszej parafii. 750-lecie kanonizacji to dobra okazja by poświęcić swojemu patronowi trochę uwagi, tym bardziej, że wielu z nas szczerze musi przyznać, iż mimo że postać nie jest mu obca, to jednak zbyt wielu informacji o nim samym nie posiada.

Przed wszystkim ze względu na odległość czasową nie można ustalić zbyt wielu faktów z życia Św. Stanisława. Jego rodzina zawiadywała wioskami Raba i Szczepanów w ziemi krakowskiej. Stanisław przyszedł na świat około roku 1030. Początkowe nauki pobierał w rodzinnym domu, co było normalnym wówczas zwyczajem. Jednak dalsze kształcenie przebiegało już poza granicami Polski - w Belgii i Paryżu. W 1060 roku przyjął święcenia kapłańskie. Z nominacji ówczesnego biskupa Krakowa Lamberta Suły zostaje kanonikiem katedralnym, a po jego śmierci obejmuje biskupstwo krakowskie, za zgodą Bolesława Śmiałego. Konsekracja na urząd następuje w 1072 roku. Nie zachowało się zbyt wiele wiadomości o samej działalności biskupa Stanisława, ale z różnego rodzaju zapisków można wywnioskować, że był pasterzem zatroskanym o dobro Ojczyzny i ludu, a równocześnie dość ambitnym. Podobna ambicja cechowała ówczesnego króla, do której dołączał się jeszcze porywczy charakter monarchy. Wcześniej czy później, należało się spodziewać starcia dwu silnych osobowości. Kiedy król, angażujący się w liczne konflikty w państwach ościennych, coraz dłużej przebywał poza granicami kraju, poddani zaczęli narzekać na taki stan rzeczy. Władca, po powrocie, coraz ostrzejszymi metodami przywracał karność. W takiej sytuacji niestosowność zachowań króla wyraził publicznie biskup Stanisław. Prawdopodobnie to było bezpośrednią przyczyną targnięcia się władcy na sługę Bożego. Męczeński akt dokonał się 11 kwietnia 1079 roku, kiedy to król wtargnął do kaplicy św. Michała na Skałce w Krakowie i podczas sprawowania Mszy św. zabił biskupa, a ciało nakazał poćwiartować. Wśród ludu oburzenie na króla wzięło górę nad strachem i cały naród stanął przeciwko królowi. Ciało męczennika złożono uroczyście do grobu na Skałce, a król został zmuszony do banicji, na próżno szukając także wsparcia u władców zagranicznych. Istnieje podanie, że Bolesław Śmiały zmarł w 1081 roku, spędzając ostatnie dwa lata na ostrej pokucie w klasztorze w Osijeku na Bałkanach, gdzie został pochowany.

Od tamtego czasu biskup Stanisław pozostawał w opinii świętości. Akt kanonizacyjny dokonany został w Asyżu we wrześniu 1253 roku przez papieża Innocentego IV. Uroczyste ogłoszenie kanonizacji w Polsce nastąpiło 8 maja 1254 roku.

Jak niezbyt dużo potwierdzonych informacji o naszym patronie możemy znaleźć w oficjalnych zapiskach, tak wiele legend krąży w różnego rodzaju przekazach. Najbardziej znane to wskrzeszenie właściciela Potrawina oraz zrośnięcie się ciała Świętego, które nadzorowane było przez cztery orły.

W osobie Świętego możemy i powinniśmy szukać wzorców do godnego chrześcijańskiego życia.
