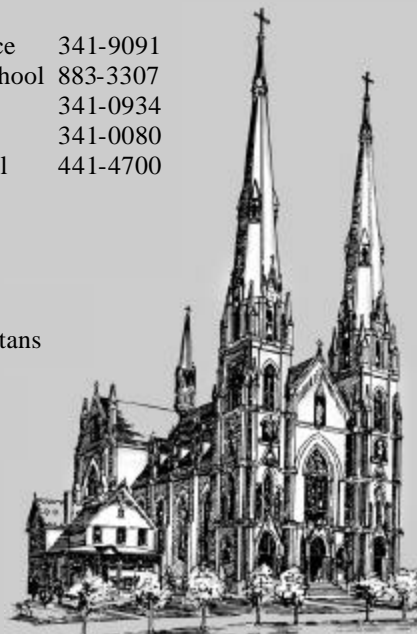

WHITE SMOKE

Where were you twenty four years ago when the eyes of those keeping vigil in St. Peter's Square finally saw the white smoke, the signal that a new pope had been chosen? The college of Cardinals had fulfilled their obligation to nominate and elect the successor of John Paul I, he who would become the number one *servus servorum Dei*. The Holy Spirit must have wanted to shake things just a bit when, responding to the prayers of the Cardinals, directed them to Karol Kardyna³ Wojty³a of Kraków, Poland, a philosopher, scholar, poet, actor, athlete, and, above all else, a true servant of God's people, a human being who accepted God's invitation to dedicate his life to Christ and His church.

Do you remember the first words he spoke in English at his installation as pontiff? **Be not afraid!!!!** Afraid of what? Afraid of giving yourself to Jesus, completely, without reservation. He will not harm you. He will not lead you astray. His love will liberate you. JohnPaul II had now assumed the position of Peter, the same Peter whom he described in a poem which he had penned in 1962 as he sat in St. Peter's basilica attending the Council:

Peter, you are the floor, that others may walk over you...not knowing where they go. You guide their steps... You want to serve their feet that pass as rock serves the hooves of sheep. The rock is a gigantic temple floor, the cross is a pasture.

As celebrations begin in Rome anticipating the silver jubilee of John Paul II (which, incidentally, will include a concert of Beethoven's Missa Solemnis by the Vienna Philharmonic under the direction of Cleveland's very own Franz Welser-Most) we, too, can join in that celebration by remembering our Holy Father in our prayers and by taking to heart his first message back in 1978: **Be not afraid!**

cious Polish food and pastries imaginable. The ever-increasing crowds each year gives testimony that my opinion is shared by many.

Everyone knows we do well in hospitality, fellowship and in the quality of our food — that is all taken for granted. But many remind us that the Polish Festival is meant primarily to be a fund raiser, and so they look for some of the financial statistics of how the Festival fared. 24 LATA PONTYFIKATU

Kardynał Karol Wojtyła, po wyborze na papieża - 16 października 1978 r., przybrał imię Jan Paweł II. Od samego początku swego pontyfikatu zyskał sobie ogromną sympatię nie tylko katolików. Poprzez swoją pielgrzymią aktywność zmienił wizerunek pa-



piestwa. Podczas swoich 97 pielgrzymek i podróży zagranicznych Jan Paweł II spotykał się nie tylko ze środowiskami Kościoła katolickiego, ale również z przedstawicielami innych religii, a także z politykami i mężami stanu; szczególnie zaś nacisk kładzie na stosunki ze "starszymi braćmi w wierze" czyli z Żydami. Jednak największą troską Ojciec Święty obdarza chorych i niepełnosprawnych oraz młodzież.

Niewiele brakowało, a wszystko to mogło zostać nagle przerwane. Oto bowiem 13 maja 1981 r. na Placu św. Piotra, ręka zamachowca targnęła się na Jana Pawła II. Walka o życie, długa rehabilitacja. Wszystko to było wielkim doświadczeniem dla całego Kościoła, ale równocześnie pokazało jak wielu ludzi miłuje papieża; tło zamachu pozostało do dziś niewyjaśnione.

Po powrocie do zdrowia nie zwolnił swojego biegu. Potwierdzeniem tego niech będzie kilka liczb. Podczas swej 24-letniej posługi papież ogłosił 13 encyklik (specjalne dzieła papieskie dotyczące najistotniejszych spraw Kościoła), 13 adhortacji (mniej obszerne niż encykliki), 11 konstytucji apostołskich, 43 listy apostołskie, zwołał 9 konsystorz, mianował 201 kardynałów, (w tym 6 Polaków), kanonizował 467 świętych (w tym 8 Polaków), beatyfikował 1291 błogosławionych (w tym 138 Polaków), przewodniczył 14 generalnym zgromadzeniom synodu biskupów, przyjął ponad 1350 osobistości politycznych oraz ponad 1018 razy udzielił audiencji generalnych wiernym.

W swoich dokumentach papieskich nie obawia się podejmować istotnych tematów nie tylko dla Kościoła ale i dla świata. Odważnie i zdecydowanie wypowiada się na drażliwe tematy sprawiedliwości społecznej, obrony życia, poszanowania pracy i godnych warunków życia dla każdego człowieka.

Często Jan Paweł II podejmuje się mediacji i nieustannie wzywa do zaniechania przemocy w różnego rodzaju konfliktach ekonomiczno-społecznych. Jest przeciwko stosowaniu ekonomicznych środków nacisku, ponieważ uważa je za represje zawsze godzące w najbardziej i niewinną ludność.

Polski Papież jest wielkim i niekwestionowanym autorytetem moralnym w świecie, jako obrońca praw człowieka i inicjatyw podejmowanych na rzecz zachowania pokoju.

W 1994 r. został Człowiekiem Roku, wybranym przez tygodnik "Time" oraz ponownie w 1996 r., wybrany przez tygodnik "Newsweek".

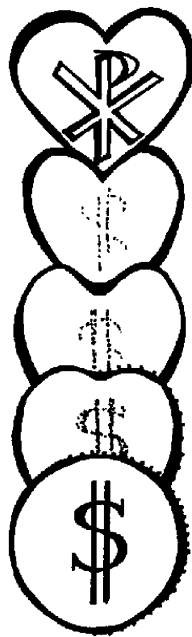
Jan Paweł II jest też wielkim patriotą, przy każdej bowiem okazji podkreśla swoją polskość i wielkie umiłowanie Ojczyzny, do której pielgrzymuje za każdym razem z większą radością.

Jest wielkim czcicielem Matki Bożej, której zawierzył swoje posługiwanie; w swoim herbie papieskim ma dużą literę **M** i łacińskie zawołanie Totus Tuus (Cały Twój). Najnowszym dokumentem papieskim jest ogłoszenie nowych tajemnic różańcowych (o tym na innej stronie builetynu).

NOWE TAJEMNICE RÓŻAŃCA

Papież Jan Paweł II, 16 października, podczas audiencji generalnej na Placu św. Piotra, w 24 rocznicę swojej elekcji, ogłosił okres do października 2003 r. Rokiem Różańca. Papież zawierzył Kościół i ludzkość Matce Bożej.

Jan Paweł II wyjaśnił, że ustanowienie Roku Różańca jest nawiązaniem do tradycji lat Jubileuszowych, według której, po Roku Jubileuszowym w Kościele ogłaszany był Rok Maryjny.

Podczas gdy Jan Paweł II uroczystie składał podpis pod swym Listem Apostolskim - "Rosarium Virginis Mariae" (O Różancu Marii Panny) ponad 20 tysięcy uczestników audiencji, zgromadzonych na placu przed bazyliką św. Piotra, mówiło "Pozdrowienie Anielskie" (Zdrowas Maryjo).

Nawiązując do 24. rocznicy pontyfikatu Jan Paweł II wyraził swoją wdzięczność "wszystkim, którzy w tym dniu w sposób szczególny jednoczą się ze mną we wspólnym dziekczynieniu za dwadzieścia cztery lata mojego posługiwania Kościołowi na Stolicy św. Piotra. Wdzięczny jestem za życzliwość, a zwłaszcza za modlitwne wsparcie. Proszę, abyscie nadal wspierali mnie przez modlitwę różańcową. Niech Rok Różańca świętego, który wspólnie bedziemy przeżywać, przynosi dobre owoce w sercach wszystkich. Niech wam Bóg błogosławi!".

Jan Paweł II ogłosił zmiany w modlitwie różańcowej, wprowadzone listem "Rosarium Virginis Mariae", polegające na dodaniu nowych pięciu tajemnic, odpowiadających wydarzeniom z życia Chrystusa, rozważanych podczas odmawiania różańca. Do dotychczasowych 15 tajemnic radosnych, bolesnych i chwalebnych Jan Paweł II dodał pięć "tajemnic światłości". Nowe tajemnice różańcowe to **chrzest w Jordanie, objawienie siebie na weselu w Kanie, głoszenie Królestwa Bozego i wzywanie do nawrócenia, przemienienie na górze Tabor i ustanowienie Eucharystii**.

Dniem refleksji nad nowymi tajemnicami różańca ma być czwartek, papież bowiem zmienił dotychczasową kolejność wydarzeń rozważanych w modlitwie różańcowej, ustalając, że w poniedziałki i soboty kontemplowane będą tajemnice radosne, we wtorki i piątki - bolesne, a w środy i niedziele - chwalebne.
