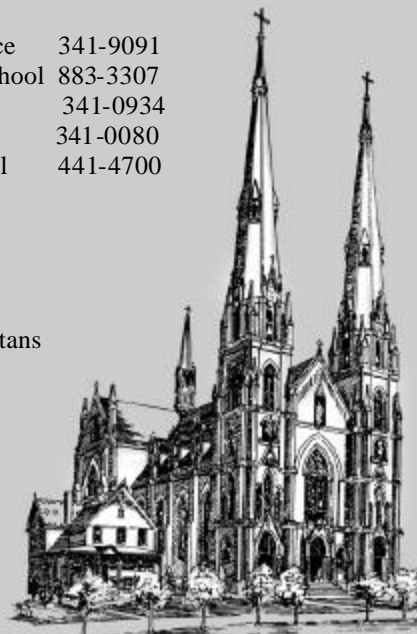

A WEEK OF PASSION, HOLINESS, AND POWER

This is it, the week of all weeks. Beginning today, Christians around the world embark upon an annual pilgrimage of faith that draws us deeply into the mysterious heart of God's saving design.

Traditionally called "Palm Sunday," this Sunday is actually called "Passion Sunday." The word "passion" has all kinds of connotations in our current usage, from something overtly sexual, to the name of a famous perfume! But if we explore the Latin root of the word, "*passio*," we'll encounter a deeper and more nuanced meaning. From that Latin root, we obviously get the word "passion, but we also get the word "to suffer," and also the verb "to allow or permit." Through all of Jesus' public ministry, he is on top of things, in control, setting his own course.

But starting with his entry into Jerusalem, Jesus is clearly at the mercy of forces beyond him. The crowd reacts in ways he had not expected, naming him king — and then calling for his death. The Romans act with cold efficiency, "taking care of" a problem and nuisance to public order. Religious authorities allow their own jealousies and fears to override the call to holiness and leadership they had inherited. Jesus' own friends betray him and deny him. He is no longer the active one, the initiator. Now he is the passive one, the one to whom things happen — passion.

We cannot appreciate what happens next week Sunday unless we somehow allow ourselves to be drawn into the mystery of what happens in between.

Yet in the midst of all of this, Jesus lets nothing get in the way of being faithful to the mission given him by his heavenly Father — the mission of proclaiming and bringing forth the reign of God. Even when he was nailed to the cross, in the midst of wondering if perhaps he was indeed all alone ("My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"), he still found space for forgiveness ("They know not what they do."), welcome ("Today you will be with me in paradise."), and compassion ("Behold your mother.").

When the Christian community encounters this week, the holiest of time, it is more than simply a memorial of what happened long ago. It is truly an entry into the very mystery of God himself, the mystery of suffering, death, and new life. God emptied himself into his creation so completely that the very humanity of Jesus was depleted, leaving the Incarnate Word truly lifeless and in the tomb. Yet God raised Jesus up, bringing forth into the world a new power, new life, new possibilities open to anyone who would respond to God's invitation to be part of the new creation.

Still, there is no Easter Sunday without Good Friday. There is no breaking of the bread without a commitment to service. We cannot appreciate what happens next week Sunday unless we somehow allow ourselves to be drawn into the mystery of what happens in between. This is meant to be a week like no other. Let it be so.



NIEDZIELA PALMOWA I WIELKI TYDZIEŃ

Wielkanoc czyli Zmartwychwstanie Chrystusa było obchodzone w chrześcijaństwie jako pierwsze i jedyne święto już w czasach apostołskich. W kilku następnych wiekach zaczęły nabierać swojej wagi dni wokół Wielkanocy. Dni przygotowania (obecny Wielki Tydzień) osiągnęły swój cykl już za czasów papieża Grzegorza I Wielkiego (+604).

Myślą przewodnią całego Wielkiego Postu jest nie tylko przypomnienie dokonanego Odkupienia rodzaju ludzkiego i złożenie podzięków Bogu i Jego Synowi za ten niezwykły akt miłosierdzia; pragnieniem i nadzieją Kościoła jest, by Jego dzieci czynnie włączyły się w swoje Odkupienie: przez wewnętrzne odrodzenie, przez wyzbycie się "starego człowieka" a przyobleczenie się w "nowego człowieka", którego wzorcem jest Jezus Chrystus.

Wielki Tydzień zaś skupia w sobie największe tajemnice związane z Odkupieniem rodzaju ludzkiego: Chrystus Pan poniósł śmierć na krzyżu i zmartwychwstał. Nad te wydarzenia historia zbawienia nie zna większych. Dlatego słusznie dni te nazwane zostały "Wielkim Tygodniem".

Cykl wydarzeń Wielkiego Tygodnia rozpoczyna triumfalny wjazd Jezusa do Jerozolimy w Niedzielę Palmową. Aby wypełnić proroctwo Zachariasza, Chrystus poleca uczniom przyprowadzić oślicę, na której urocząście wjeżdża do świętego miasta. Na Jego widok ogromna rzesza mieszkańców Jerozolimy wyszła Mu naprzeciw rzucając palmowe gałązki na drogę i rozkładając przed Nim swoje szaty z głośnymi okrzykami: "Hosanna Synowi Dawida!"

Na pamiątkę tamtego wjazdu Chrystusa już od IV wieku powstał w Jerozolimie zwyczaj, że patriarcha w otoczeniu wiernych w ten dzień wjeżdża na osiołku z Góry Oliwnej do miasta; do dziś wszystko zachowane zostało w niezmienionej formie. Na stałe procesje z palmami weszły w zwyczaj całego Kościoła od wieku VI. Nieco później, bo w wieku XI wprowadzono poświęcenie palm, które szczególnie w Polsce bywają obecnie prawdziwymi dziełami sztuki.

Najwymowniej treść Niedzieli Palmowej oddaje modlitwa poświęcenia palm: ".../ Dzisiaj Chrystus wjechał do Jerozolimy, aby tam umrzeć i zmartwychwstać. Wspominając to zbawcze wydarzenie, z głęboką wiarą i pobożnością pójźmy za Panem, abyśmy uczestnicząc w tajemnicy Jego krzyża, dostąpili udziału w zmartwychwstaniu i życiu".

Dni pomiędzy Niedzielą Palmową a Wielkanocą są traktowane jako uprzywilejowane i nie dopuszcza się w tym czasie żadnych świąt. W szczytowe znacznie wchodzi jednak dni Triduum Paschalnego: Wielki Czwartek, Wielki Piątek i Sobota.

Wielki Czwartek to przede wszystkim Ostatnia Wieczerza z apostołami i ustanowienie sakramentów Eucharystii i Kapłaństwa oraz zdrada i pojmanie Jezusa na Górze Oliwnej.

Wielki Piątek to dzień największej żałoby: ukrzyżowanie i śmierć Zbawiciela, ale to przecież dla każdego z nas czas wielkiej amnestii i przebaczenia, to dzień dopełnienia naszego zbawienia.

Wielka Sobota to pokutne oczekiwanie na Zmartwychwstanie; w tradycji - czas poświęcenia pokarmów. Przede wszystkim to jednak wieczorna Liturgia Wigilii Paschalnej z poświęceniem świątła i wody jako symboli zwycięstwa i odrodzenia rodzaju ludzkiego. A później już tylko oczekiwanie na radosny poranek Zmartwychwstania.

WIELKI TYDZIEŃ I WIELKANOC

Ani obejrzelismy się, a dobiega końca okres Wielkiego Postu. Przed nami już tylko Wielki Tydzień i najradośniejsze Święta Wielkanocne. Przedtem jednak pozostajemy jeszcze w duchu pokutnym. Pozostało już tylko ostanie spotkanie modlitewne na Gorzkich Żalach (dziś ze względu na koncert nie będzie tej modlitwy). W Wielki Piątek zaś Droga Krzyżowa o godz. 8:30 wieczorem ze świecami na zewnątrz kościoła. Porządek nabożeństw Wielkiego Tygodnia mamy podany w innym miejscu biuletynu. Warto jednak przypomnieć i zaprosić na poświęcenie pokarmów w Wielką Sobotę - od godz. 10:00 do 2:00 po południu (co godzinę), a szczególnie na Rezurekcję w poranek wielkanocny o godz. 6:30 rano lub na Mszę św. o godz. 10:00 rano. Po tym już tylko radosne rodzinne świętowanie Zmartwychwstania Pańskiego przy uroczystym śniadaniu wielkanocnym.

“Requiem” and Easter

Requiem aeternam dona eis Domine et lux perpetua luceat eis.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them.

These, the opening words of what we refer to as a “Requiem” Mass, are the opening words of the Introit, now referred to as the “Entrance Antiphon” of a Mass for the deceased. Upon hearing them, one must make the obvious connection of the reality of death with the mystery of the Resurrection. It seems so appropriate that this Sunday afternoon at 3:00PM we are able to come to St. Stanislaus Church to permit our hearts and souls to be touched by some of the greatest music ever written, the “Requiem” by Gabriel Faure, performed by the Brecksville-Broadview Heights High Schools Choirs and Orchestra.

Those of you who were able to attend Fr. William's Memorial Concert last January 19th will have heard some selections from this musical masterpiece, especially the lullaby-like *Pie Jesu* which was sung by one of the soloists of the Ohio Boy Choir. One cannot help but feel the gentle rocking in the arms of a loving Jesus of His own son or daughter, deceased to the world, now resting with Him in eternity.

At this time of the year we don't celebrate death – we celebrate life! Those who have “died” remain with us still and their goodness may still work in the world through those of us who loved them while they lived, spreading that love along the remainder of our journey on earth. As St. Paul told the Corinthians, “love never ends.” May the love we see unfold before us in the Passion we hear today and on Good Friday work through our hearts to help create the kingdom of God, where God will reign and where we will together rest in His peace.
