## EASTER JOY



Without Easter, nothing makes any sense at all. With Easter, everything does. The Church throughout the world celebrates that moment when the mercy of God triumphs over judgment; when love conquers hate, life conquers death, light overcomes darkness, and hope prevails over despair. If Jesus were simply another heroic man who died a tragic death, he would simply be one of countless through all of human history. At best, he would be remembered by some in his culture. Or perhaps a legend or two would evolve about him.

But the resurrection of Christ from the dead is a moment that is both within history and transcendent of it. It is a specific event that took place in a particular time and place, yet it is also so much more. It is a timeless, perpetual, continuing action of

Every year for Lent, we gather some adult parishioners and friends who share their faith in a lively discussion group. This year we dedicated our time to reading and working through a wonderful book by one of my former seminary professors, Fr. Robert Schreiter, C.P.P.S., entitled, "The Ministry of Reconciliation." All of us have a long road to travel before coming to a point of reconciliation with those who have hurt us in the past. Those who are part of our parish community have an especially difficult path in our relationship with what happened to us over a year ago with the murder of Fr. William and the arson of our rectory.

Fr. Schreiter's wonderful little book helped many of us see the life-giving path before us. That path, of course, is the path of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Fr. Schreiter pointed out that in the resurrection appearances, the risen Jesus always reveals himself in exactly the way that a particular person most needs to experience him. To Mary in the garden, he reaffirms her love for him by calling her by name. To Thomas, he reaffirms his faith by inviting him to see for himself. To the disciples on the way to Emmaus, he returns to them a sense of hope by revealing his presence to them in the Eucharist. To the apostles on the seashore, he feeds them and sends them on mission.

How will the risen Jesus reveal himself to you? The first step is to ask yourself what you need from him. Lent has been about identifying what is lacking. Easter is about finding that Jesus had been there all along.

May God bless all of you this Easter season. If you are a regular parishioner, you know how good God has been to us, and how dedicated so many of you are to continuing his mission. And if you only come a couple times a year — welcome home. We miss you, and God needs you. Happy Easter!

## PAN ZMARTWYCHWSTAŁ!

*Wesoły nam dzień dziś nastał,  
Którego każdy z nas żądał, Tego dnia  
Chrystus zmartwychwstał - Alleluja, Alleluja!*

Tak śpiewają dziś wszyscy chrześcijanie. W wielu kościołach tę pieśń podchwytyją dzwony i brzmia radosnym echem. Śpiewają nasze usta, a serca biją w takt tych słów uczuciem szczęścia, nadziei, miłości i optymizmu. Dłonie same wyciągają się do uścisków, a usta wypowiadają słowa życzeń: **Wesołych Świąt!**

Radość i optymizm dominują w naszym przeżywaniu Wielkanocy. Bowiem ten czas to świętowanie największego zwycięstwa: nieba nad piekłem, Boga nad szatanem, miłości nad nienawiścią, życia nad śmiercią.

Wielki Piątek zdawał się być triumfem piekła i szatana. Jednak w niedzielę Zmartwychwstania odwróciła się karta. Cały wysiłek wrogów Chrystusa okazał się próżny. Z mozołem wybierali drzewo na krzyż, dźwigali olbrzymi kamień na grób, sprządzali szydereczy napis na krzyżu. Nie spodziewali się, że w ten sposób przygotowują Chrystusowi tylko większy triumf. Wszystko to, co miało być przyczyną hańby stało się dowodem Zmartwychwstania i proklamacją dla triumfującego Króla.

Kiedyś jeden z myślicieli powiedział: *Nie wiem co wydarzyło się w poranek Wielkanocny, ale wiem dobrze, że tego dnia narodziła się ludzkość, która nie umiera.*

W Zmartwychwstaniu Chrystusa przepowiednie proroków stały się rzeczywistością. Wszystkie figury Starego Testamentu, wszystkie wyzwolenia narodu wybranego z niewoli są zapowiedzią największego wyzwolenia dokonanego przez Chrystusa. Jego wyzwolenie jest triumfem nad największym złem, które ma swe źródło w grzechu. To wyzwolenie jest zwycięstwem wobec największej katastrofy i niewoli w jaką popadł rodzaj ludzki po grzechu pierworodnym. Sens tego zwycięstwa jest bardzo istotny dla całego rodzaju ludzkiego. Obejmuje każdego z nas, bez wyjątku. Dlatego Wielkanoc powinna być świętem radości i optymizmu. A ten optymizm nie jest naiwny, nie jest żadną iluzją; oparty jest na najsilniejszym fundamencie - na Zmartwychwstaniu Chrystusa. Bo: "Jeżeli Chrystus nie zmartwychwstał, daremna jest wasza wiara" (Kor 15,17). Słusznie! Jaki bowiem sens miałyby wówczas uczciwe życie, modlitwa, cierpienie? Wtedy - człowiek znajdowałby się w gorszym położeniu niż zwierzęta, które nie muszą się trudzić, przejmować kodeksem moralnym i zabiegać o swoje zbawienie.

Jako istoty rozumne jesteśmy przekonani, że ziemską egzystencją to nie wszystko, że za nią nie może być pustka. Potwierdza tę prawdę Zmartwychwstały. W Nim zakorzeniamy swoją nadzieję, swoją radość i optymizm. Jego zmartwychwstanie prowadzi do zmartwychwstania każdego z nas. To przekonanie wyrażajmy szczególnie dzisiaj. A jutro, w kolejne dni i lata umiejmy je wyrazić całym swoim życiem.

W ten najradośniejszy poranek radujmy się z całego serca i z całej duszy, bo oto wszystko staje się nowe, gdyż

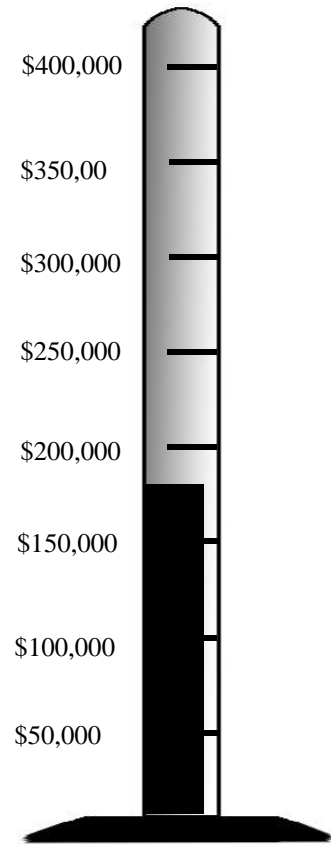
**ST. STANISLAUS CELEBRATIONS**

Uzupełniając kanony cytowane w ubiegłym tygodniu należy dodać istotne zalecenie z **paragrafu 1 kanonu 1234: W sanktuariach należy zapewnić wiernym obfitsze środki zbawienia przez gorliwe głoszenie słowa Bożego, przez odpowiednie ożywienie życia liturgicznego, zwłaszcza przez sprawowanie Eucharystii i pokuty oraz przez kultywowanie zatwierdzonych form pobożności ludowej.** Wynika więc z tego, że sanktuarium jest miejscem, gdzie wierni, często nazywani pielgrzymami, mają prawo spodziewać się obfitszych łask, szczególnie błogosławieństwa i pełniejszego kontaktu z Bogiem poprzez wyjątkowość miejsca lub szczególne wstawiennictwo patrona miejsca. Potwierdzeniem tego jest zapis w Katechizmie Kościoła Katolickiego, gdzie w rozdziale **Miejsca sprzyjające modlitwie** możemy przeczytać: *.../ - Pielgrzymki przypominają naszą wędrówkę na ziemi ku niebu. Tradycyjnie już są one czasem intensywnej odnowy modlitwy. Dla pielgrzymów poszukujących właściwych im żywych źródeł sanktuaria są wyjątkowymi miejscami przeżywania "jako Kościół" form modlitwy chrześcijańskiej.*
