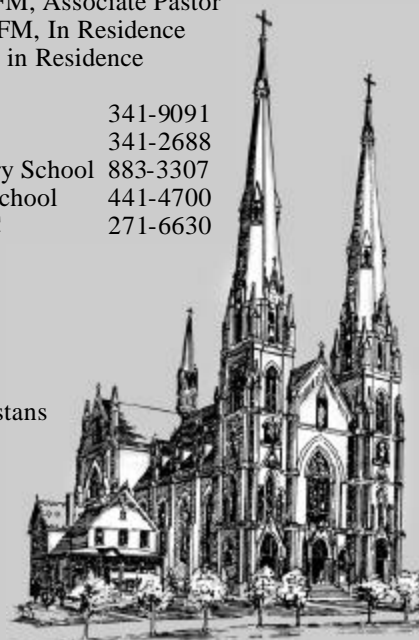

**“VERY EARLY IN THE MORNING...**

...while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb.”

Thus begins the resurrection account in the Gospel of John. As we read the above lines, we might wonder: Who in their right mind would get up so early in the morning and walk in the dark, especially when conditions were so dangerous? The disciples

were all still afraid, perhaps for their own skin, because of what had happened to Jesus. Would they be next? Who is waiting around the corner to nab them, and do them harm? Why would anyone take such a risk?

To be with Jesus.

Then we might ask, who in their right mind would do that today? Who would get up early in the morning, while it is still dark, just to spend time with Jesus?

Charlotte Kotek would. She does every day.

She lives only a couple blocks away, but no matter what the weather is doing outside, she walks to church each and every morning by 5:30 or so. She opens the doors, changes the burned-out candles, gets the sanctuary ready for Mass, and then says her private prayers in the quiet of our shrine, alone with Jesus. She is the regular server at the 7:00 AM Mass, paying very close attention to all the details as well as to the idiosyncrasies of each priest. Then she moves on to visit the homes of several home-bound people who depend on her to care for them in their daily personal and household needs. She would be embarrassed to see her age in print for all to see, but let's just say it's been a while since her teenage years...

After Jesus lay in the tomb for three days, it was the women who were the first ones to encounter the Risen Lord. The women were the ones who thought of bringing oils and spices to anoint Jesus' body. It was the women who saw the angel and heard his astonishing words. It was the women who were the first evangelizers, the first to carry the good news to others that Jesus is risen. In her prayerful witness and care-filled attentiveness to those in need, our own Charlotte Kotek continues to proclaim what was first announced two thousand years ago. “He is risen!”

Have you ever wondered how certain things get done around here, and who exactly does them? Our church community is blessed with many people who give such simple and consistent witness of prayer and service. They don't seek praise or recognition. They open and close the church, pick up the leftover bulletins, sweep and mop and dust, keep the sacristy in order, turn off the lights when we are done, dust the snow off the steps and ramp, sweep the leaves away in the fall, clear away the wilted flowers — on and on. So many humble and important things, all accompanied with the whisper of a prayer. They hold a special and honored place in our community, and we are grateful to them for their faithful witness.

**Jezu, ufam Tobie!**

W ostatnia niedziele, w czasie południowej modlitwy „Regina Coeli” przypomniał Ojciec święty Benedykt XVI zasługi swego poprzednika Jana Pawła II w szerzeniu kultu Bożego Miłosierdzia. To właśnie nasz Rodak ustanowił drugą niedzielę wielkanocną - Niedziela Bożego Miłosierdzia. Stało się to dokładnie przed szesnastu laty, 30 kwietnia 2000 roku. Było to z okazji kanonizacji błogosławionej siostry Faustyny. Słusznie została ona nazwana „apostolka Bożego Miłosierdzia”. Całe jej życie było poświęcone szerzeniu tego kultu. Pan Jezus sam ją pouczał w licznych objawieniach. Możemy o tym przeczytać w jej „Dzienniczku”, w którym opisuje swoje wewnętrzne przeżycia. Lektura tej książki jest czymś bardzo pozytywnym. Pewna siostra zakonna powiedziała mi, przez „Dzienniczek” Jezus stał się dla niej bliższy. Ta odnowiona relacja z Jezusem pomogła tej siostrze przejść przez ciężką chorobę. Bardzo cierpiała, otarła się o śmierć, ale jak opowiedziała mi później, pozostała wewnętrznie pełna pokoju. Myślę, że warto dodać, że ta siostra ma ponad 80 lat i całe jej życie było oddane Bogu. Pomimo to, „Dzienniczek” był dla niej cennym odkryciem i pomocą w pogłębieniu więzi z Jezusem. Chwała Panu!

Ale wróćmy do przemówienia Benedykta XVI z ostatniej niedzieli. Papież powiedział o Słudze Bożym, że „tajemnica miłosiernej miłości Bożej stanowiła centrum jego pontyfikatu”. Słusznie. Jan Paweł II głosił Miłosierdzie Boże w swoim życiu i nawet przez swoją śmierć (zmarł, jak wiemy, w noc poprzedzającą Niedzielę Miłosierdzia). Wymienimy najważniejsze rzeczy: Karol Wojtyła, jeszcze jako kardynał krakowski, zezwolił na szerzenie kultu Bożego Miłosierdzia, który przez pewien okres czasu był zabroniony. Jako papież głosił tajemnicę miłosiernej miłości Bożej, między innymi przez enyklikę na ten temat „*Dives in misericordia*” (*Bóg bogaty w miłosierdzie*), ogłosił siostrę Faustynę Kowalską błogosławioną, a później świętą. W roku 2000, jak już wspominałem, ustanowił II niedzielę wielkanocną Świętem Miłosierdzia, a poświęcając sanktuarium Bożego Miłosierdzia w Krakowie na Łagiewnikach dwa lata później, oddał świat właśnie Bożemu Miłosierdziu. Przy tej okazji powiedział, że czczenie Bożego Miłosierdzia nie jest jakąś pobożnością prywatną, lecz czymś, co należy do wiary i modlitwy każdego chrześcijanina. Było jego pragnieniem, wszystkim przybliżyć Boże Miłosierdzie, „którego tak bardzo potrzebuje człowiek i świat współczesny. Potrzebuje, choć często o tym nie wie” (*Dives in misericordia*).

W swoim „Dzienniczku” pisze siostra Faustyna: „Z Polski wyjdzie iskra, która przygotowuje świat na drugie przyjście Chrystusa”. Wcześniej myślałem, że w tym proroctwie jest mowa o jakiejś wybitnej osobowości i ktośby inny mógł tu lepiej pasować od Sługi Bożego Jana Pawła II? Dzisiaj sądzę jednak, że chodzi tu o nabożeństwo do Bożego Miłosierdzia, które przez świętą Faustynę i Jana Pawła II wyszło z Polski do całego świata. Bo: „nie zazna świat pokoju, dopóki nie zwróci się z zaufaniem do Bożego Miłosierdzia” (*Dzienniczek*). Trzeba więc nam wołać do Kościoła: „Przyjdź, Panie Jezu” polaczyć z aktem strzelistym: „Jezu, ufam Tobie”.

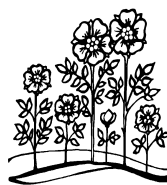
