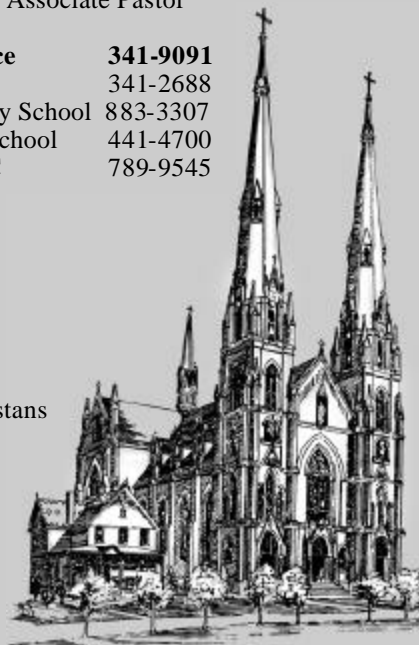

## Our Lady of the Rosary

It's October, and as many of us recall that means it is the month of the rosary! You can see one of our beautiful windows on the west side of the nave is dedicated to this topic specifically. The window shows Mary seated with Jesus handing the rosary to St. Dominic. The other person shown in the window is St. Pius V, the pope who asked all of Europe to pray for Mary's intercession for the Christian forces who were about to battle the Muslims forces at the battle of Lepanto in 1571. As the result of that victory the pope gave Mary the name "Queen of Victory." A few years later the title "Queen of the Holy Rosary" was to be bestowed on her by yet another pope. The three angels pictured each represent one of the three traditional sets of Mysteries, the Luminous Mysteries having only been added most recently by Servant of God John Paul II.



Isn't it interesting that here again we have mention of Christians and Muslims in a historical battle when we are all too aware of the current situation in our daily news. The weapon known as the 'rosary' (so dubbed by Padre Pio) may be our best recourse during these troubled times. There is so much common ground between the two religions and such utmost respect for Mary that it is sad if we are unable to stop this tide and work toward peace. In the Koran, for example, Mary is the only woman ever mentioned! Not even Mohammed's daughter 'Fatima' was given such an honor! Among men in the Koran only Moses, Abraham and Noah are mentioned more frequently than Mary!

The window which used to be between the Swell and Great organ chambers in the choir loft also alluded to the Christian/Muslim conflict. The original window which had been destroyed during the tornado in 1909 depicted Polish King John III Sobieski leading the campaign to force the Ottomans from Vienna on September 12<sup>th</sup>, 1683. Those of you who have had the opportunity to visit Wawel Castle would have seen some of the captured tents and other booty from that event.

But back to the main topic, the rosary. When we pray the rosary this month may we ask for Mary's intercession to help bring peace to the world, a wish she herself desired as she spoke to the children at Fatima! Imagine peace between the children of God! It should not be so far fetched an idea. We pray for Mary's help in the our current battles across the world, praying for our soldiers, our enemies and all people of good will. *Ave Maria!*

### Sw. Franciszek z Asyżu

Parafia pod wezwaniem sw. Stanisława jest parafia franciszkańska, ponieważ już od ponad 100 lat posługują w niej synowie sw. Franciszka. Jeśli używam nazwy „synowie sw. Franciszka”, to oczywiście należy to rozumieć w sensie przenośnym. Chodzi tu o franciszkanów, czyli członków Zakonu sw. Franciszka.



Na czym polega, że jest to parafia franciszkańska? - takie pytanie słyszałem kilka miesięcy temu. Dobre pytanie. Właściwie nie ma wielkich różnic pomiędzy parafią prowadzoną przez księży diecezjalnych, a parafią, gdzie pracują franciszkanie. Chociaż franciszkanie jako członkowie zakonu są wyjęci spod władzy biskupa, to o ile pracują w parafii, są od biskupa zależni. Franciszkanie różnią się od księży diecezjalnych strojem; zamiast sutanny noszą habit. Zwykle też mieszkają we wspólnocie, tak jak to ma miejsce przy parafii sw. Stanisława. Poza tym, o ile posiadają świecenia kapłanskie, franciszkanie wykonują te same posługi w parafii, jak czynią to kapłani diecezjalni. Tak więc na pewno jest więcej podobieństw niż różnic, a różnice nie mają istotnego znaczenia.

Jest jeszcze jeden, bardzo istotny związek pomiędzy Patronami tej parafii i zakonu franciszkanów. Jak pamiętamy, kanonizacja sw. Stanisława miała miejsce w Asyżu, w bazylice sw. Franciszka. W 2003 roku obchodziliśmy 750-lecie tego wydarzenia. Sw. Bonawentura wspomina taki wypadek z Mszy sw. kanonizacyjnej: *W czasie, gdy w kościele sw. Franciszka kazanie głosił biskup Ostii, oderwał się od pulpitu duży kamień i spadł na głowę pewnej kobiecie. Upadła na ziemię. Ponieważ nie dawała znaków życia, uznano ją za nieżywą, przykryto materiałem i tak pozostawiono, nie chcąc zakłócić kazania. Jednak owa kobieta na tyle przytomności miała, że w czas poleciała sw. Franciszkowi, u którego ołtarza leżała. Po zakończeniu kazania, gdy ją wynieść postanowiono, kobieta na oczach wszystkich o swoich siłach powstała i żadnych ran nie posiadała. Co więcej, do tej pory na częste bóle głowy narzekala, a od tej chwili wolna była od tej dolegliwości. Ów kamień został zachowany do czasów dzisiejszych. Obecnie znajduje się w tajnej zakrystii. Nie dla wszystkich jest on dostępny. Ale za to inny znak, który znajduje się na ścianie asyjskiej bazyliki górnej (bazylika ta, podobnie jak nasz kościół, ma dwa poziomy) jest ogólnie dostępny. Nieznana reka w nieznanym czasie wygrawerowała napis w jez. polskim: *Tutaj odbyła się kanonizacja sw. Stanisława*. Jeszcze innym świadkiem tamtego wydarzenia jest kaplica czy raczej wnęk sw. Stanisława, która została wykuta w ścianie nad amboną.*

W ubiegłym tygodniu, 4 października, obchodziliśmy uroczystość sw. Franciszka. W przeddzień, wieczorem 3 października, mieliśmy nabożeństwo zwane po łacinie „Transitus”. Jest to nabożeństwo upamiętniające śmierć naszego Zakonodawcy. W dzień następujący po uroczystości zaczął się parafialny Polski Festiwal. Jeszcze jeden dowód na to, jak bardzo postaci sw. Stanisława i sw. Franciszka są ze sobą związane.

### ST. STANS HISTORICAL FACT

*by Rob Jagelewski.*

Len Janiak was the Head Football Coach at St. Stanislaus High School from 1948–1968. He was hired on April 30, 1948 to coach football, basketball, track, and baseball. In 1934, Janiak participated in the high school Charity Football Game at Cleveland Municipal Stadium. Janiak led the South High Flyers to victory over the John Adams Rebels, 15-0, winning the Cleveland Senate Championship. In college at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio, Janiak became one of the top scorers in football in the nation. In 1938, Janiak scored 9 touchdowns, and kicked 17 extra points. He came in third place in scoring in Ohio and led the OU Bobcats to the Buckeye Conference championship. Janiak went on to play for the Cleveland Rams in the National Football League. In his twenty years of coaching football at St. Stans, his teams had a record of 103 wins, 64 losses, and 6 ties. In basketball his record was 146– 84 and in baseball, 52–30. Janiak was the first Athletic Director of Cleveland Central Catholic High School.
