

An Invitation to Pilgrimage

Why am I receiving this passport?

Bishop Richard Lennon invites everyone in the Diocese to participate in the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy by joining together in Pilgrimage to the Diocese of Cleveland Holy Doors, and in engaging in the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy throughout the community.

How to use this passport

Use this Passport to track your Pilgrimage to the two Holy Doors in our diocese, at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist and at Our Lady of Lourdes National Shrine.




The faithful are also invited to participate in the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, and to reflect on their time doing so by journaling in their Passports. Those who wish may reflect on their time on Pilgrimage or as Workers of Mercy on social media, with the hashtag #YearofMercyCle.

Much like a travel passport gets stamped on your journey, this Pilgrimage passport can be stamped to mark your visit to a Holy Door in our diocese. For Holy Door passport stamps, please follow directions at each of the locations to receive your Holy Door stamp (pages 5 and 6.)

If you engage in Works of Mercy at Catholic Charities locations you may receive a "Worker of Mercy" sticker, which may also be placed in your Passports (pages 8 through 21.) For works performed at locations other than Catholic Charities sites, please visit your parish to request your Worker of Mercy sticker.

For those unable to travel, there are labels at the back of this passport you may cut out and adhere to the Works of Mercy pages.

Spiritual Works: Pray for the living and the dead



Reflections on prayer:

Begin the day with "Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy."

End the day with "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: grant us peace."

An indulgence can be gained once a day by crossing the threshold of the Holy Doors. An indulgence can also be gained by performing a Corporal or Spirtual Work of Mercy. See pages 3 and 4 for details on receiving the Jubilee indulgence.

To receive the Jubilee indulgence:

All Members of the Christian Faithful who are truly contrite and moved by the spirit of charity, who wish to seek the Jubilee Indulgence are to:

- Make a brief pilgrimage to either Holy Door, open at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, Cleveland, Ohio, or Our Lady of Lourdes National Shrine, Euclid, Ohio at any time during the Year of Mercy, and cross over the threshold of the Holy Door as a sign of their deep desire for true conversion;
- Sacramentally confess their sins;
- Participate in the celebration of, and receive, the Holy Eucharist with a reflection on mercy;
- Make a profession of faith;
- Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, Pope Francis;

While the first two conditions may be fulfilled several days before or after the performance of the indulgenced work, it is fitting that Communion be received, the prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father be made, and the profession of faith be said on the same day.

A single sacramental confession suffices for several plenary indulgences but receiving Communion and praying for the intentions of the Holy Father are required for each indulgence.

Those who perform the spiritual and corporal works of mercy may also, by their actions, obtain the Jubilee Indulgence. The Holy Father states, "Each time that one of the faithful personally performs one or more of the works of mercy, he or she shall surely obtain the Jubilee Indulgence."

Spiritual Works: Forgive all injuries

Reflections on foregiveness:		

Download a rosary app and pray the rosary for someone you dislike.

Spiritual Works: Bear wrongs patiently

Develop the habit of praying "Jesus, have mercy on me a sinner" when someone cuts you off in traffic by posting a note on your dashboard.

His Holiness, Pope Francis has further decreed the conditions for obtaining the Jubilee Indulgence for those of the Christian Faithful for whom it is impossible to physically cross the threshold of the Holy Door, namely:

- The sick, people who are elderly and alone, the homebound. Those who are chronically or terminally ill, elderly, or otherwise confined by physical condition, may obtain the Jubilee Indulgence by receiving Communion or attending the Holy Mass and community prayer, even through the various forms of media.
- The incarcerated. Those who are living in prisons may obtain the Jubilee Indulgence in the chapels of the prisons. Directing their thoughts and prayer to the Father each time they cross the threshold of their cell will, for them, signify passage through the Holy Door, because the mercy of God is able to transform hearts, and is also able to transform bars into an experience of freedom.
- The deceased. The Holy Father reminds us that we may gain the Jubilee Indulgence not only for ourselves, but for the deceased as well. He states: "... as we remember them in the Eucharistic celebration, thus we can, in the great mystery of the Communion of Saints, pray for them, that the merciful Face of the Father free them of every remnant of fault and strongly embrace them in the unending beatitude."

The Jubilee Indulgence may be obtained once per day, until the Closing of the Holy Doors.
