



REMEMBERING THE OLD COUNTRY ... THE HOLY LAND

It seems so far away. It seems to be so full of conflict. Someone else should maintain it. What about all those Christians living in the Holy Land?

Is this a sentiment you often come across? Do you seriously think it is appropriate for anyone who calls themselves Christian to wash their hands of concern and responsibility to at least maintain the places sacred to our common faith? Do you realize that the persecution of Christians in the very land made sacred by Christ's blood is a constant event? Building walls, confiscating land, destroying buildings, harassment, denial of work....These are just a small sample of what our Christian brothers and sisters who live in the Holy Land must endure on a regular basis. For most people, out of sight, out of mind remains the norm.

There are a fewer and fewer people willing to remain in the land of Jesus to serve as custodians for the many sacred places which are so important to our faith. After all, Jesus did not land on the moon to be crucified and to rise from the dead. He did live on this planet, the same orb which sustains humanity. The custodians include the Latin Patriarch and his flock, the Franciscans who tend to the numerous shrines, Melkites, Maronites, Syrians, Armenians, Coptics and Chaldeans—all branches from the same tree which grew from that same Cross which bore Him who fought the ultimate battle against Satan. That living tree, brought to life by His blood, now needs to be fed by those who believe that the offering given to God was real and satisfying to Him. That living tree, which embraces us daily, needs us to work in the world.


How can we concretely express our solidarity with the Holy Land and those people who need our moral and economic support to continue its life? Two such opportunities will soon be at our doorsteps. The first is the annual collection for the Holy Land which takes place on Good Friday. The funds collected at churches throughout the world on that day are totally directed to the sacred sites and other churches throughout Jerusalem and the Christian territories in Israel and Palestine which hold those most sacred of sites. Your support is essential, not simply a luxury for the maintenance of our presence in those places. As Cardinal Sandri (Prefect for the Congregation of Eastern Churches) stated recently, **"Together with institutes of men and women religious, the funds collected provide immediate relief to the catastrophic consequences of war and other emergencies. Through a qualified network of pastoral, educational and health care specialists, these resources come to the aid of families, often saving lives that have been rejected: the old, the sick, and the disabled. In addition, aid is provided to those without work and to youth in search of a brighter future. In every case, the collection seeks to build up human rights, especially the right to religious liberty."**

A second opportunity will occur a couple weeks into the Easter season, the weekend of April 13 –14 when we will host a Christina family from Bethlehem selling hand made wooden religious objects in our church vestibule. These people desperately need our help. Please stop by and see what they have created. If you can afford to, please buy something from them. These are living martyrs who daily must endure the turmoils thrust upon them because of politics and ancient hatred and mistrust. The family will have items as small as rosaries and large as nativity scenes, all made of olive wood from trees that grew in the area of that world where Jesus would have played as a child ...the same trees which would have tried to protect Him in the darkness as He awaited the kiss of Judas on that night which began the final battle with Satan. When you hold the objects carved by the hands of those faithful you will connect with the events as no other medium might do... the roots of those olive trees fed off the land which Jesus walked, the land which felt His tears, the land which absorbed his sweat and blood as well as the tears of His mother as she watched Him endure the scourging and suffering and torture leading to His death. The olive wood is sacred if only for that... joining each of our own crosses together each day, giving us the assurance that Jesus is there to help us up just as Simon of Cyrene helped Him on His way to be crucified. Now He would be glad to see us help those in the Holy Land, Jesus' and our 'old country'. Please help, shop at their store, pray for them.

Finally, since so many people request Sunday Mass intentions, please try to limit your request for Sunday Masses to two, although weekday Masses are easier to schedule.

Biuro parafialne rozpoczęło przyjmowanie intencji mszalnych na rok 2013. Pracujący w biurze przyjmują intencje mszalne w kolejności ich zamawiania. Mszę św. można zamówić albo przychodząc osobiście do biura w godzinach od 8:00 rano do 2:00 popołudniu od poniedziałku do piątku, lub też wysyłając informację o intencji wraz z czekem na adres parafii. Jeśli data wskazana w liście jest już zajęta, będziemy starać się zapisać ją w najbliższym wolnym terminie. Jeśli Msza św. jest za zmarłych, proszę podać imiona (imię); jeśli za żywych, proszę to zaznaczyć również. Może być też „w intencji ofiarodawcy” lub „w Bogu wiadomej intencji”. Msze św. w ciągu tygodnia są tak samo ważne jak te w niedziele, dlatego zachęcamy do zamawiania Mszy św. w dni powszednie. Będzie na pewno łatwiej znaleźć wolną datę.

From the Stewardship Committee:

Next week is Holy Week – how have your spiritual practices of Stewardship been going during Lent? If you'd like to have a few ideas of things you can still do to show your appreciation of the gifts you've been given by giving back, here are a few: tell someone you're praying for them; better yet, don't tell them but pray for them anyway; reconcile with someone you've hurt or aren't speaking to; invite someone who's been away from the church to attend one of the Easter liturgies with you. And, finally, can you give your parish some time for the outdoor clean up for Easter, or for decorating or pitching in toward the Easter flowers. Or maybe simply sacrifice a few cups of coffee on the way to work or dinners out and add a little extra to the weekly collection for the next couple weeks. These are all Stewardship practices because they all help you recognize the gifts you've been given and be grateful enough to give back.

Następny tydzień jest Wielkim Tygodniem. Jak wyglądały w czasie Wielkiego Postu Twoje praktyki duchowe charakterystyczne dla Stewardship? Jeśli chcesz mieć parę pomysłów na rzeczy, które mógłbyś uczynić w celu pokazania Twojej wdzięczności za otrzymane dary, oto kilka z nich: powiedz komuś, że się modlisz za niego, za nią, za nich; jeszcze lepiej, nie mów, ale módl się za nich nie mówiąc im tego; pogódź się z kimś, kogo zraniłeś lub z kim nie rozmawiasz; zaproś kogoś, kto oddalił się od Kościoła, do udziału w liturgii Wielkanocy, aby razem z Tobą w niej uczestniczył. I w końcu, czy mógłbyś zaofiarować coś z Twojego czasu na przedświąteczne porządki wokół parafii? Lub dekorując kościół lub dając ofiarę na kwiaty do wystrojenia kościoła na Wielkanoc? Lub może rezygnując z kilku kubków kawy w drodze do pracy, lub z wyjścia do restauracji, i zaoszczędzone pieniądze złożyć na niedzielną tacę? Tą są praktyki Stewardship, ponieważ one pomagają rozpoznać dane Ci od Boga dary, za które jesteś wdzięczny na tyle, że dzielisz się nimi z innymi.
